Structured sober living - not just a bed or cheap rent without expectations.

A Good Fit	Probably Not a Good Fit
✓ I want sober, home-like living - not just a bed.	• I only need cheap rent or a place to crash.
✓ I am working to stay alcohol- and drug-free.	• I am not ready to stop using alcohol or drugs.
✓ I can live with roommates and follow written rules.	• I do not want shared housing, chores, rules, or recovery expectations.
✓ I want structure, accountability, meetings, work, service, or school.	• I do not want accountability or recovery participation.
✓ I can care for daily needs and contribute to others.	• I need 24-hour supervision, detox, treatment, or medical stabilization.
What SoberHomes Is • Structured sober living in Reno and Sparks. • Home-like, alcohol- and drug-free housing. • Peer-supported living with responsibility. • Routines, recovery habits, work/service habits, and independent-living skills. • Usually about \$21-\$30/day.	What SoberHomes Is Not Not: free housing, motel, detox, rehab, probation/parole supervision, ordinary room rental, 24-hour staff supervision, or cheap rent without expectations. Some people need a higher level of care. Some want less accountability. Residential treatment or emergency shelter may fit better.

Where Sober Living Can Fit After Release

Sober Living supports: MAT, IOP / Counseling, Recovery Participation, and Employment.

SoberHomes provides home structure. Outside professionals provide clinical, legal, and case-management support when needed.

Cost, Payment, and Funding

Cost context

- Shelter: \$0 when available
- SoberHomes: usually \$21-\$30/day
- Motel: often \$80+/night
- Residential treatment: roughly \$150+/day

Like most housing, SoberHomes usually requires **first month, last month, and a deposit.**

Ask early about monthly fees, timing, and paperwork.

Who will pay besides you: Possible sources of third-party support may include family support, county/court/reentry programs, treatment or case-management partners, churches, nonprofits, employers, recovery funds, or other community support. **Availability is not guaranteed.**
