INTERVENE EARLY TO PREVENT RELAPSE



- ✓ If a member is missing required house meetings or their five weekly 12-step meetings, check in with them immediately.
- ✓ If someone is late for curfew, remind them that curfew violations and missed meetings are strong predictors of relapse.
- ✓ Explain that participation and structure are conditions of housing and essential supports for early sobriety.
- ✓ Encourage them to reconnect immediately with meetings, peers, mentors, and routine.

IF SOMEONE APPEARS INTOXICATED



- ✓ Stay calm and respectful.
- ✓ Say clearly: "You cannot be in the house while under the influence."
- ✓ Ask them to leave immediately to detox or stabilization.
- ✓ Notify the House Manager once they have left.

REQUIRED STEPS FOR A MEMBER WHO HAS RELAPSED



- ✓ A member who has relapsed must not enter the premises while intoxicated or detoxing.
- ✓ They should notify the House Manager or group that they have relapsed, left for detox, and when they expect to test negative.
- ✓ They are encouraged to seek support immediately through 12-step meetings, a sponsor, peers, or detox services.
- ✓ Re-entry may occur once they are stable, test negative, and can safely return.

IF THEY LEAVE PEACEFULLY



- ✓ Inform management so the community can support them upon return.
- ✓ Relapse alone does not end housing, but entering intoxicated is unsafe and not permitted.

IF THEY REFUSE TO LEAVE OR BECOME AGGRESSIVE



- ✓ Call 911 immediately.
- ✓ Their housing license will be terminated for safety reasons.

ILLEGAL ACTIVITY



- ✓ Report any suspected illegal activity—such as drugs, threats, or violence—to police first, then management.

YOUR RESPONSIBILITY



- ✓ Every resident is empowered to help maintain a safe and sober home.
- ✓ Remind others that crossing the line in sobriety means not crossing the doorway.
- ✓ Support one another with dignity, boundaries, and compassion.
