As this year is the seventy-fifth anniversary of the founding of the Association, it was felt that all three volumes should be brought up-to-date.

One advantage of the digital format is that we are now able to reproduce the Catalogue in full colour instead of monochrome.

We hope that readers will find this catalogue of interest and useful. New items continue to be found from past events, although few new issues have taken place in recent years. If you have any suggestions as to how it can be further improved, we would be pleased to hear from you.

#### **CHANGES IN THIS EDITION**

The catalogue has been updated with new entries, including 3.8b, 7.5a, 8.14a, 15.5b, 17.6a 17.18aa, 18.3a, 19.8b, 22.35a, 24.14a, 24.32a, 26.4a, 29.31, 31.7a, 56.2a. Ipswich society issues have been renumbered as a large number of previously-unrecorded issues have now been listed. This year has seen further new discoveries among the early issues. This suggests that there is still a lot of material out there waiting to be recorded. A few guide prices have been amended to reflect recent prices realised.

### **AEPS CATALOGUE OF ESSEX PHILATELIC COLLECTIBLES**

Throughout the history of the AEPS, a major function has been the holding of stamp days. At most Essex Stamp Days and Autumn Rallies, it has been the normal practice to publish a philatelic souvenir of the event, although a prohibitive rise in the cost of special postmarks, coupled with a reduction in collecting interest has led to a decline in the number of such issues. Over the years, a wide variety of souvenirs have been used, varying from a simple postcard to covers carried by mail coach, brought by ship from abroad or flown in specially for the occasion. Some non-philatelic ephemera has also been issued on occasion This catalogue lists covers, cards, postmarks, etc., issued by the AEPS or member societies to mark philatelic events in which they were involved. It has been developed from both documentary sources and members' collections. Many early items (and some later items) are known to have existed according to documentary sources but no surviving copies have been found. These "lost" items are shown in **bold** text in section 3, the check list. If you have any of the items thus listed, please contact the Editor so that their status can be updated. Advice of new or missing entries is also welcome.

#### 1. AEPS EVENT ISSUES


#### 3 June 1944.

#### Inaugural Meeting.

For the inaugural meeting, held at Leytonstone Library under the auspices of the Leytonstone & District P.S., there is no known philatelic souvenir.

#### 30 June 1945.

#### 1<sup>st</sup> Congress.





Southend-on-Sea P.S. hosted this event at the Victoria Hotel. A souvenir card was designed by George Pearson showing Southend-on-Sea pier in 1845 on front and 1822 Rochford Penny Post marking with a descriptive text on rear. This sold out on the day.

1.1 Mint card.

- 1.2 Unused card signed by G. Pearson.
- 1.3 Unused card signed by all participants at the Congress Luncheon.

A maximum of 18 are said to have passed through the post, receiving a "SOUTHEND-ON-SEA / 5.30PM / 30 JNE / 1945 / ESSEX" Unified machine cancellation with wavy lines.

2<sup>nd</sup> Convention.

1.4 Used with 2d. orange KGVI stamp.

#### 15 June 1946.

Leytonstone P.S. hosted this event at Leytonstone Library. A cover was produced by hand-stamping in green (two shades exist) a plain envelope with a cachet, designed by R.D. Lee, showing Essex with the locations of member societies marked.

When the block was received from the block maker, three proofs were produced in black, numbered 01-03. 01, at least, had the cachet at the right-hand side, instead of the left.

Seven specimens were subsequently struck in red (numbered 01-07) and sent to member society Secretaries.

462 covers were produced, in green numbered from 000001, and sold at  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d each.

Covers posted at the exhibition received a Unified machine postmark "LEYTONSTONE / 5.30PM / 15 JUN / 1946 / E.11" with slogan "DON'T / WASTE BREAD / OTHERS NEED IT".

- 2.2 Proof cover in black.
- 2.3 Specimen cover in red.
- 2.4 Mint cover in green.

Covers posted at the exhibition: 2.5 With 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d Victory stamp.

A cover exists bearing the Victory set of stamps "cancelled" by the cover cachet in green. 2.6 Cover 000562.

Remaindered cover used for correspondence.

2.7 Cover 000537 11 September 1946 with Victory set.

#### 21 June 1947.

3<sup>rd</sup> Convention.



Chelmsford & District P.S. hosted this event at Shire Hall, Chelmsford. Covers and postcards were produced showing the Chelmsford oval "PAID / 1d / CHELMSFORD / MAY 1847" mark in red with black rays pointing to member societies, designed by a Chelmsford member. Both were numbered on the reverse. Covers have been seen numbered between 002043 and 002045, but unnumbered covers have also been seen. Postcards have been seen numbered 002152.

- 3.1 Mint cover. Sold at 3d.
- 3.2 Mint postcard. Sold at 3d.
- 3.3 Postcard used as place card at Luncheon with typed name.

Various covers and cards were handstamped at the Post Office stand with "CHELMSFORD / 7.15PM / 21 JU / 47 / ESSEX" double-ring circular date stamp. The correct rates were 1d (printed paper) for the postcards and  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d for the covers. One envelope has been seen used unsealed at the 1d rate and another at  $1\frac{1}{2}$ d.

3.4 Proof strike of the cds on plain paper.

- 3.12 Remainder cover used with E&P "lover's knot" Royal Wedding slogan postmark with cds "CHELMSFORD / 9.20AM / 20NOV / 1947 / ESSEX".

#### 22 May 1948.

#### 4<sup>th</sup> Convention.



Forest P.S. hosted this event at Loughton County High School for Girls. A cover was printed in red or blue and a postcard was printed in blue, each showing the "ESSEX POST GOES AND COMS EVERY DAY" mark.

- 4.1 Mint cover (red).
- 4.2 Mint cover (blue).
- 4.3 Postcard (blue).

Covers received the "LOUGHTON.ESSEX / 6.-PM" (or "6.30.PM") "/ 22 MY / 48 / -1-" double-ring cds on various stamps:

- 4.4 1d red +  $\frac{1}{2}$ d green definitives.
- 4.5 1d Channel Is. +  $\frac{1}{2}$ d definitive.
- 4.6 1d Channel Is.
- 4.6a 1d + 21/2d Channel Is.

#### 14 May 1949.

#### 5<sup>th</sup> Convention.

Colchester society's first AEPS event was held at the Moot Hall. An advance publicity cachet was handstamped in green on mail with a map showing eight societies, reading "VISIT THE CONVENTION OF THE ASSOCIATION OF ESSEX PHILATELIC SOCIETIES / COLCHESTER / 14<sup>TH</sup> MAY 1949". A

similar cachet, but revised to show 12 societies, was used on mail on the day of the event.


Plain covers with advance publicity cachet (eight societies) stamped in green.

- 5.1 Posted at Southend-on-Sea with 026 in triangle plus wavy lines machine cancellation on 1d red KGVI definitive stamp.
- 5.2 Used at Colchester with 210 in triangle.
- 5.3 Cover with cachet on 21/2d stamp with "COLCHESTER / 7.30PM / 30 JAN / 1949 / ESSEX" machine mark and slogan "JOIN THE / VOLUNTEER / FORCES".
- 5.4 Original artwork for cachet.



Plain covers with cachet (twelve societies) stamped in green.

- 5.5 Cachet used with 1d red stamp with "ROMFORD / 10.30AM / 17 JAN / 1949 / ESSEX" machine mark and slogan "JOIN THE / VOLUNTEER / FORCES".
- 5.5a Cachet used with 2½d blue stamp with "LEYTONSTONE / 3 PM / 20 APR / 1949 / E 11" machine mark and slogan "MIND / HOW YOU GO / ON THE ROAD".
- 5.6 Used at Convention with 1d red stamp.



A cover was printed in red and black showing the same postmark as on the 1948 cover, plus a mail coach. One essay cover has been seen with the mail coach printed in black on a pre-folded envelope. The red is a different shade. It was used for correspondence at Colchester on 1 July 1949 with a 2½d Olympic Games stamp and wavy lines postmark:

5.7 Essay (used).

The normal cover shows the mail coach in red. Covers posted at the event received a "COLCHESTER, ESSEX / 7 30PM / 14 MY / 49 / -4-"



16 September 1950.

6<sup>th</sup> Convention.



Southend-on-Sea P.S. hosted the 1950 event at Southend-on-Sea School of Arts and Crafts. No official souvenir was prepared due to the combination of the death of Mr. J. B. Seymour and the co-incidence of the London international exhibition.


A contemporary unofficial souvenir, which may be an essay for the intended souvenir, exists comprising card 1 altered in manuscript. 6.1 Unofficial souvenir.

#### 19 May 1951.

#### 7<sup>th</sup> Convention.

Dovercourt P.S. hosted this at the Hotel Alexander, Dovercourt Bay, Harwich. A cover, printed either in blue and red or in black, was designed by Mr. I.F. Trinder showing the packet boat "Eagle", as used between Harwich and Hellevoetshuis (Netherlands) in 1703. The Eagle was built in Arundel, Sussex in 1703. It was a round-sterned sloop of 77 tons, 53 feet long by 18ft 6in beam. 2000 were printed (assumed to include both colours). They were sold at 3d each mint. Covers posted at the Convention received a "HARWICH / ESSEX cds dated 4 30PM / 19 MY / 51". Unusually, export versions of the covers were offered for foreign destinations with a 4d stamp.



- 7.1 Mint cover A (blue and red).
- 7.2 Mint cover B (black).

Handstamped covers with various stamps:

- 7.3 A: 1d red KGVI definitive (Sold at 4d).
- 7.4 A: 1d Channel Islands.

- 7.5a B: 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d KGVI definitive, cylinder 190., serviced with "CIS" printed paper triangular handstamp.

821 covers were posted on SS Arnhem inbound. They received a "HARWICH / 9 30AM / 19 MY / 51 / - ESSEX —" double-ring cds plus the boxed "HARWICH / SHIP LETTER" mark (Hosking Type 39) and the unboxed cachet of S.S. "Arnhem". They were sold at 9d to UK addresses or 1/- to foreign addresses.

- 7.6 A: 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d Festival of Britain stamp.
- 7.7 A: 4d Festival of Britain.
- 7.8 B: 21/2d Festival of Britain.
- 7.8a B: 4d Festival of Britain.

50 covers were posted on the outward voyage with 2½d GB stamp, receiving the Hoek Van Holland boxed Paquebot mark (Hosking Type 376). 7.9. Serviced cover.

Cover A was also serviced with the 4d Festival of Britain stamp with machine cancel "HARWICH / 11.30AM / 12 MAY / 1951 / ESSEX" and wavy lines, plus cds receiving mark "HELLEVOETSLUIS / 15.V.15 / 1 / 1951". These are the termini of the original packet boat service. 7.10 Cover.


#### 7 June 1952.

#### 8<sup>th</sup> Convention.

This was hosted by Leytonstone, Wanstead & District P.S. at Wanstead House. This Convention is notable for the variety of souvenirs offered and for the fact that the first AEPS emblem was designed for use at this event. As well as pre-cancelled covers, orders were taken for covers to be posted directly to visitors via the East Anglian TPO or from the Convention.


Not all cover combinations advertised are known to exist, and some may have been cancelled if there

was no demand. Reports of any surviving items marked "\*" in the following list would be welcome.



Gummed advance publicity labels were designed by Mr. Edgar Lewy and issued bearing the AEPS emblem in sheets of 6 (2 columns of 3, *tête-bêche*) in various colours, including:

- 8.1 Black
- 8.2 Brown.
- 8.3 Orange.
- 8.4 Green.
- (Note: Various printing errors/flaws exist)
- 8.5 Brown on plain cover with cds "ILFORD AND BARKING / 9-PM / 13 MR / 52 / -ESSEX-".
- 8.6 Green on piece with "LEYTONSTONE / 1245PM / 19JAN / 1952 / E.11" and "ARE YOU ON THE / NEW VOTERS LISTS? / -CHECK NOW" slogan.



Covers and a postcard with the new AEPS "Stamp" emblem were also designed by Mr. Lewy. The covers were printed in three colour combinations. The postcard was printed in green only and stamped-to-order with the 11/2d King George VI stamp printed in green. Mint covers were sold at 3d each, cards at 4d:

Covers and postcards posted at the Convention received the "LEYTONSTONE E.11 / 7.15PM / 7 JU / 52 / -1-" cds on various stamps:

8.11 Cover A with 21/2d red stamp.

- 8.13 Cover B used.
- 8.14 Cover C with 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d red stamp.
- 8.14a Cover C with 1d inverted watermark booklet stamp with label, block of six 11/2d, 21/2d.
- 8.15 Postcard used.

Covers posted on the East Anglian TPO Down with "EAST ANGLIAN T.P.O. DOWN / 1 JU / 52 / -" double-ring cds (Sold at 8d each (cover) or 6d (card)). Most of the covers received poor quality postmarks:

- 8.16 Cover A with ½d orange and 2½d red.
- 8.17 Cover B.\*
- 8.18 Cover C with <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d orange and 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d red.
- 8.19 Card D with additional <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d orange stamp.
- (8.19a is reserved for the postcard, if found)

At least one cover and one card were subsequently carried on "EAST ANGLIAN T.P.O. DOWN / 3 JU / 52 / -". The postmarks were legible, but sometimes incomplete.

8.19b Cover A with 1/2d orange and 21/2d red.

8.19f Postcard with <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d orange.

(8.19c-e are reserved for the covers B-D, if found)

Based, presumably, on this trial, to remedy the situation for customers, a further (successful) attempt was made to obtain decent postmarks. Covers and postcards were posted on "EAST ANGLIAN T.P.O. DOWN / 6 JU / 52 / -" double-ring cds (Sold at 8d each (cover) or 6d (card)):

8.20 Cover A.\*

- 8.21 Cover B.\*
- 8.22 Cover C with 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d red stamp.

8.23 Postcard.\*

Covers and postcard posted on South Western TPO Night Up. Poor quality marks were received on the first attempt on 20 May, so a second attempt was made on 23 May. It is not known whether all covers exist with both marks or if different covers were used on the two occasions. Sold at 8d each (covers) or 6d (card):

Covers and postcard posted on ferry S.S. "Dewsbury" with Antwerp boxed "PAKETBOOT / PAQUEBOT, ANTWERPEN / -2-5-52.15 / BC / 1" cds and oval cachet "PURSERS OFFICE / -1MAY1952 / \* S.S. DEWSBURY \*". Sold at 1/- each: 8.31 Cover A.

- 8.32 Cover B.\*
- 8.33 Cover C.\*
- 8.34 Postcard.\*

According to contemporary advertising, covers were posted outward bound on both S.S. "Duke of York" and R.M.S. "Amsterdam", but only event covers from the latter have been seen. <sup>2</sup> Covers and postcard posted on ferry R.M.S. "Amsterdam" with 2-ring cds "HOEK VAN HOLLAND / 21.V.9V / 4 / 1952", boxed Paquebot and oval cachet "PURSER'S OFFICE / 19MAY1952 / \* R.M.S. "AMSTERDAM" \* and Dutch stamps. Sold at 1/- each:

- 8.35 Cover A.\*
- 8.36 Cover B.\*
- 8.37 Cover C.\*
- 8.38 Postcard.

Covers only posted at Chelsea Flower Show. The only known surviving example was a Cover C sent by Registered mail (LONDON SW126 No. 0088) with "CHELSEA FLOWER SHOW / \* / 20MY52 / SW3" cds on 6d and  $2\frac{1}{2}$ d red KGVI definitive stamps <sup>3</sup>. Sold at 1/4:

- 8.39 Cover A. \*
- 8.40 Cover B. \*
- 8.41 Cover C.

Covers and postcards were posted on HMS Victory. Sold at 8d (cover), 6d (card):

- 8.42 Cover A.\*
- 8.43 Cover B.\*

Postcards were also posted at a postal history exhibition in Bath and received the handstamp "BATH ASSEMBLY / 24MAY / 1952 / -POSTAL HISTORY EXHIBITION-". They were sold at 9d. 8.46 Postcard

Remaindered covers used for correspondence:

- 8.48 Cover B used 3 August 1952 to USA with 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d Olympic stamp.:

#### 6 June 1953.

#### 9<sup>th</sup> Convention.



The 1953 Convention was hosted by Clacton Philatelic Society and held at the Westcliff Hotel. A cover was produced showing the lifeboat "Sir Godfrey Baring" and sold at 3d each. The production cover had a triangular flap. A prototype cover has been found in a darker blue with a multi-curved flap.

- 9.1 Prototype cover.
- 9.2 Mint cover.

Before the event, covers were used as a first day covers for the Coronation stamps on 3 June with an extra boxed cachet "CORONATION / FIRST DAY / COVER 3<sup>rd</sup> JUNE 1953" and cds "CLACTON-ON-SEA ESSEX / 2.30PM / 3 JU / 53 / 2". An unspecified quantity was serviced in this form.

- 9.3 Cover with set of Coronation stamps
- 9.4 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d stamp only.

Items posted at the exhibition received a "CLACTON-ON-SEA ESSEX / 2" double-ring cds dated 6.45PM / 6 JU / 53.


9.5 Cover posted at the exhibition with 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d Coronation stamp.

Remaindered covers are known used for correspondence at various dates.

- 9.6. Cover with 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>d Wilding stamp with 7 June Clacton "LONG LIVE THE QUEEN" slogan.
- 9.7. Cover with two ½d and one 1½d KG6 definitives with 17 June same slogan.

#### 8 May 1954.

10<sup>th</sup> Convention.



The 1954 Convention was hosted by Chelmsford and District P.S. at King Edward VI Grammar School. Postal stationery cards were produced with the AEPS "Stamp" emblem in green and stampedto-order with the 1½ d King George VI imprinted stamp. They were sold at 4d each. Cards posted at the event received the "CHELMSFORD.ESSEX / 7.30.PM / 8 MY / 54 / -1-" cds. Serviced cards were sold at 5d.



#### 4 June 1955.

#### 11<sup>th</sup> Convention.

Goodmayes P.S. hosted the 1955 event at St Paul's Church Hall. A postal stationery cover was produced

with the 2½d Queen Elizabeth II embossed rose imprinted stamp and the Goodmayes Society Magpie emblem in black.



11.1 Mint cover.

Covers posted at the Convention received the "ILFORD & BARKING / 7.15PM / 4 JNE / 1955 / ESSEX" Unified machine cancellation with "BLOOD DONORS ARE STILL URGENTLY NEEDED" slogan.

- 11.2 Cover posted at the Convention.
- 11.3 Cover, as above, with additional black AEPS "Penny Black" type emblem label (AEPS No.8.1) tied by postmark.

Remaindered covers used for correspondence:

- 11.4 5 June 1955 from Clacton to Austria with additional 4d Festival of Britain stamp.
- 11.5 1 January 1956 from Chelmsford.



Southend-on-Sea P.S. hosted the 1956 event at Queen's Hotel, Westcliff-on-Sea. Plain covers were sold at 1d each printed with the cachet "1956 CONVENTION UNDER THE / AUSPICES OF THE / SOUTHEND-ON-SEA / PHILATELIC SOCIETY" in blue.

Covers posted at Convention received meter mark UA649 printed by a Multi-Value Postal Franking Machine loaned by Universal Postal Frankers Ltd. To mark the Silver Jubilee of the Association, a major event, branded "PhilEssex69", was held at the Shire Hall, Chelmsford. It was organised by a special sub-committee of the AEPS Executive Committee.

On display was Pearson Hill's hand operated Parallel Duplex Obliterating Machine of c.1865, with the Manchester 498 Duplex postmark (undated), on a strict understanding that it was not to be used.

A National Cover Competition was organised by the AEPS to design an event cover. This was won by Mrs. Gill Verity of Camberley, Surrey. The cover sold at the event, based on her design, was printed in black and silver and featured the front of the Shire Hall. Covers posted at the event received a 57mm x 33mm rectangular handstamp featuring the Shire Hall with "PhilEsseX'69 / 7 JUNE 1969 / SHIRE HALL / CHELMSFORD-ESSEX". Pre-serviced covers received a 4d red Machin booklet stamp.

The pilot, Mr. D.M. Hartas, Senior First Officer, British European Airways, signed three covers.

It has been stated that the air covers were also carried on the stagecoach (see below) and posted at the exhibition, but none received additional stagecoach cachets.



The "Mercury" mail coach was used to re-enact the Brentwood – Ingatestone – Chelmsford mail run, in two stages. 8700 folded letter sheets were printed in black, showing the Essex section of the Norwich Road, and closed with a red wafer seal.

For each stage, a different 33mm diameter handstamp was used based on known early postmarks. A cachet was also applied showing a mail coach and stating the stage on which it was carried. They were sold with a 4d red Machin stamp at 2/6 each or 4/6 the pair.



This event was hosted jointly by Benfleet & District Philatelic Society and Rayleigh & District Philatelic Society at the former society's venue at Runnymede Hall, Benfleet, but the souvenirs were provided by the latter.

In co-operation with the Eastern National Omnibus Company, a one-day parcels service was organised between Southend-on-Sea and Thundersley for the carriage of covers bearing a special se-tenant vertical strip of three Eastern National "bus parcel stamps" showing buses of c.1911 (2p, National OC double decker), 1931 (3p, Dennis Ace) and 1971 (5p, Bristol RELL6G with Eastern Coach Works body). Parcel stamps on covers carried on the bus were tied with a **"SOUTHEND-ON-SEA** THUNDERSLEY 10JUL1971" cds.

The stamps were also sold in a stamp booklet together containing the strip of parcel stamps plus six halfpenny Machin definitive stamps. The booklet covers were printed in black on red or blue-green covers.




This event was also marked by the appearance of a letter sheet, designed for the AEPS by Mr. M.J. Southall, showing inside important buildings throughout Essex and early postmarks. 



The 30<sup>th</sup> Stamp Day was hosted by Leytonstone, Wanstead & District P.S. at Wanstead House.

The key element of this year's souvenir was a postcard, designed by Mr. D.A. Pashby, featuring a statue of Sir Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill (1874-1965) in bronze with lettering in magenta and blue to mark his birth centenary. 1000 were produced, of which 500 were among the last items stamped to private order. This service was withdrawn in 1974, after abuse by stamp dealers, but the postcards were stamped in advance with an ochre 4d Machin octagonal stamp and held in store for the event. The stamped version sold out on the day and most of the unstamped cards were also sold, orders coming as far afield as the USA.

Items serviced at the event received a 34mm diameter handstamp "-ESSEX STAMP DAY- / CHURCHILL CENTENARY YEAR / 8 JUNE 1974 / WANSTEAD HOUSE LONDON E11" with a V and a cigar also designed by Mr. D.A. Pashby with artwork by Mr. M.J. Southall. The original design featured a profile of Sir Winston, but this was vetoed by the Post Office on the grounds that no person, alive or dead, could appear on a special postmark.

The "PhilEssex" brand, last used in 1969, was revived for "PhilEssex'94", hosted at the Colchester Institute over two days by a sub-committee of the AEPS Executive Committee. Despite extensive publicity, attendance over the two days was disappointingly small due to good weather and conflicting events.

The cover was designed by Mr. C.W. Mead and Mr. L.C. Stanway and shows a Supermarine Spitfire aircraft with D-Day markings flying over Colchester Castle. Mint covers were sold at 35p.

Covers were pre-serviced with a single or setenant strip of five D-Day commemorative stamps and a special postmark "11 JUNE 1994 / (AEPS shield) / GOLDEN JUBILEE / PHILESSEX'94 COLCHESTER", designed by Mr. Mead.

A variety of cachets were applied to pre-serviced covers as shown below. Numbers in parentheses are total numbers produced as recorded at the event.

Mail posted at the Exhibition received a cachet "POSTED AT / PHILESSEX'94" which was applied at the end of each day before handing the mail to the Post Office for cancelling with the event handstamp at Windsor. 

A different sub-committee of the AEPS Executive Committee hosted the PCGB at Writtle Agricultural College. This was held in the interregnum between the collapse of the British Philatelic Federation and the creation of the Association of British Philatelic Societies.

The Post Office provided a special cover using one Summertime stamp and its related first day cover, cancelled with a special handstamp "76<sup>th</sup> Philatelic Congress of Great Britain / (AEPS shield) / Chelmsford 9<sup>th</sup> September 1994".

As part of promotion of their newly-introduced dotmatrix postmark printers, the Post Office also produced National Postal Museum Addressing Postcodes covers with dot matrix mark "SOUVENIR FOR CONGRESS / 9 SEPTEMBER 1994".



Examples exist of this cover reposted in the College's private posting box receiving machine mark "CHELMSFORD ESSEX / 715PM / 12SEP / 1994 / A.2" and slogan "Royal Mail / FAMOUS TRAINS / ON CHINA PLATES / by Wedgwood / Tel:031-550-8989" on various stamps.

240 prize draw envelopes were produced by auctioneer Phillips, featuring a Penny Black stamp

design and lettered AA to TL. Each contained a card, carrying mint 1d lilac Q.V. and 25p Machin stamps. Some of the cards had a code entitling the buyer to a special prize, such as a Victorian embossed stamp on cover!

Two colour picture postcards were produced and put on advance sale at 50p each on 17 November 2001. Printed by the London Postcard Company, the designs are taken from paintings by Mr. Timothy O'Brien, who signed 85 copies of each design.



Card A shows Rayleigh Station, London & North Eastern Railway, with a steam locomotive in the background and, in the foreground, Westcliff-on-Sea & District Omnibus Co. open-top double-deck bus HJ2712 departing for Rayleigh town centre on Route 1 (commenced 1923).

Card B shows the prototype British United Air Ferries ATL98 Carvair (incorrectly spelt Carviar) aircraft G-ANYB "Golden Gate Bridge" (converted 1961 from a Douglas C-54B Skymaster) at Southend-on-Sea Airport during a properties move to Geneva for the James Bond film "Goldfinger" which was partly shot at the airport in 1964. It is shown loading a 1937 Rolls Royce Phantom III Sedance De Ville (star of the films "The Yellow Rolls Royce" and "Goldfinger"), built originally for Rt. Hon. Lord Fairhaven of Anglesey Abbey, Cambridgeshire. In the foreground, waiting to load, is Aston Martin DB5 BMT216A (star of "Goldfinger" and "Thunderball").



Cards were serviced with a 1<sup>ST</sup> Machin stamp and postmarked "RAYLEIGH ESSEX / \* / 23 MR / 7" without a year slug. These were carried to the event in a preserved bus and carry an unboxed green cachet "CARRIED ON / JERSEY MOTOR TRANSPORT / 1954 ALBION VICTOR OMNIBUS / J15213 / DRIVER: Mr. Richard PAYNE". This bus then provided free tours of Rayleigh and the surrounding countryside for invited passengers throughout the day.

10 cards of each type serviced with Kenya 5/- and 30/- definitives were posted by Mr. J. Rawlins on 23 March on board M.S. "Saga Rose". They received two purple ship's cachets and double-ring cds "MOMBASA 54 / 05.APR02-10 / KENYA".

The 5<sup>th</sup> National Philatelic Exhibition under the auspices of the Association of British Philatelic Societies was hosted by an Organising Committee mainly consisting of AEPS officers, an ABPS-appointed Treasurer, plus other volunteers. It was held at the Towngate Theatre in Basildon and the adjacent Basildon Centre.

It was an early decision of the Organising Committee that there would be no philatelic souvenir. However....

Advance publicity labels were designed by Mr. D.A. Armitage and produced by Able-Label in sheets of five with transparent self-adhesive background. The original printing was without website address.



The second printing incorporated this important feature.

The covers were produced by Mr. Mead by overprinting on airmail envelopes with a feint picture of an aircraft. They were pre-serviced with different postmarks designed by the same person and donated by the Royal Mail. Serviced covers were sold at £2 each.

Basildon P.S. produced 75 of its own covers for this event, for Saturday only and sold at £1.50. It was designed by Mr. Mead and showed the bell-tower of St. Martin's Parish Church, the world's first steel and glass bell tower. The covers were numbered on the back from 001.

The Society of Olympic Collectors also joined in with two "Smart Stamp" covers with commemorative computer-printed postage paid impressions. The two days differ in detail and by date. 20 were produced for each day and sold for £2.50.






StampEssex 2008 marked the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Basildon P.S., which hosted the event at the James Hornsby School in Laindon.

А "Celebration" self-adhesive Smilers sheet marking the Society anniversary was designed by Mr. C.W. Mead and printed by Royal Mail in six printings. Sold at £20, it contains two panes of 10 stamps. The majority of Printings 1 (15 sheets) and 2 (10 sheets) were used to produce covers and presentation packs. At least 8 sheets from Printing 1 and 2 from Printing 2 remained intact. Printing 3 (20 sheets) was damaged in the post and returned to Edinburgh for replacement - None were retained. Printings 4 (21 sheets), 5 (14 sheets) and 6 (10 sheets) were used to fulfil customer orders. On all printings, stamp R2/1 in the right-hand pane has a constant variety - part of a blue bubble from the background design intrudes into the top left of the label.

A cover was designed and printed by C.W. Mead showing St Nicholas Church Laindon and numbered from 001. Covers 001-050 were serviced with a Smilers stamp and received entwined ring counter handstamp "BASILDON ESSEX / B / 26. AP 08 / Post / Office". They were sold at £2. Only cover 050 contained the constant variety. Covers 051-060 were printed but not used. A cover exists with a facsimile stamp and a "SPECIMEN" backstamp. At

least one dummy cover was produced for postmark testing with a printed facsimile stamp and "DUMMY" on the front (Type 1). It was realised that this was contrary to regulations, so it was replaced with a "TEST" box in placed of the 1st Class part of the stamp (Type 2). At least two were produced and handstamped as above.






