### Who is eligible to receive a vaccine at this time?

The following individuals are eligible for the vaccine at this time:

- Medical Personnel
- First Responders including Fire Fighters and Post Certified Law Officers
- Individuals who are 65 years of age or older
- Caregivers to those 65 years of age and older

**GDOL Continues Phased Implementation of Continued Assistance Act** 

January 14, 2021; Atlanta, GA – The Georgia Department of Labor (GDOL) issued over \$223 million last week to Georgians as the agency continues to implement the multiple phases of the Continued Assistance Act (CAA) included in the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 providing extended benefits for claimants on PEUC and PUA. The payments included benefits for regular Unemployment Insurance (UI), Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA), Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC), Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC), State Extended Benefits (SEB), and Lost Wages Assistance (LWA) payments. The GDOL is continuing to develop and implement the system changes needed to reprogram our UI system to issue payments to those eligible for the 11-week extensions provided by the CAA based on US Department of Labor requirements. The additional requirements must be integrated into the GDOL systems before eligible payments can be released. These requirements include additional proof of employment and self employment verification for PUA claimants, increased identification verification requirements, job refusal and failure to return to work reporting capabilities, additional fraud detection tools, and additional changes to the PEUC & PUA programs. The GDOL has already issued payments without interruption for those who had not exhausted PUA and PEUC benefits and continued to request weekly payments. The agency anticipates payments for claimants who exhausted benefits to begin within the next two weeks in a phased implementation as program changes are completed. "Our IT and UI teams are working around the clock to implement the new guidelines that include complex requirements and programming," said Commissioner of Labor Mark Butler. "The complexity of some of the additional specifications are challenging to program and will be an increased burden, not only on our UI staff, but to claimants, as well. They could've done this in a more simplified manner with more input from the states." The GDOL continues to update its website and social media platforms with up to date information on the implementation of the CAA and next steps for claimants. This week, the agency posted updates on the extension of benefits showing in a claimant's My UI portal and the conversion of some SEB claims back to PEUC claims. The GDOL encourages claimants to continue to request weekly payments for those who have exhausted benefits or are waiting on determinations on eligibility. Determinations are continuing to be issued for claimants awaiting eligibility decisions when a job separation is other than lack of work or includes other potential issues that can affect eligibility, such as receipt of severance or retirement pay, refusal to accept suitable job offers, or failure to return to work. All eligible payments will be issued when a decision on eligibility is released, including any additional weeks of benefits a claimant could potentially be eligible for with the implementation of the new program extensions. The GDOL continues to combat attempts of fraud and, this week, worked to have a fraudulent Facebook page removed that was targeting claimants asking for personal information. The agency immediately posted a warning on its social media platforms about the fraudulent page and reminded claimants to always protect personal information. The agency will never ask claimants for full social security numbers or copies of personal documents through any social platform. A claimant has the capability of uploading documentation directly into his/her My UI portal to avoid the risk of a personal information falling into the wrong hands. The GDOL has paid over \$17 billion in state and federal benefits since the beginning of the pandemic in March of last year. Since week ending March 21, 2020, 4,269,330 regular UI initial claims have been processed, more than the nine years prior to the pandemic combined (4.0 million). Last week, regular UI initial claims totaled 37,039, up 5,581 over the week. Since the beginning of the pandemic, 346,248 PUA claims have been processed. The sectors with the most weekly regular UI initial claims processed included Manufacturing, 8,582, Accommodation and Food Services, 6,682, Administrative and Support Services, 4,595, Health Care and Social Assistance, 3,011, and Retail Trade, 2,206. The number of initial unemployment claims filed throughout the United States for the week ending Jan. 9, was 965,000, an increase of 181,000 from the previous week's revised level of 784,000. Today, over 169,000 jobs are listed online at EmployGeorgia.com for Georgians to access. The GDOL offers online resources for finding a job, building a resume, and assisting with other reemployment needs. Resources for reemployment assistance along with information on filing an unemployment claim and details on how employers can file partial claims can be found on the agency's webpage at dol.georgia.gov. #### Southwell System, Health Dept. Begin Expanded COVID-19 Vaccinations



The Southwell health system on Wednesday will begin the distribution of drive-thru COVID-19 vaccinations to residents aged 65 and above and to other first responders and healthcare workers outside of Southwell. The Georgia Department of Public Health's (DPH) South Health District had started vaccinating the expanded population on Monday. Gov. Brian P. Kemp last week expanded the vaccine Tier 1A level to include vaccinating all first responders and individuals 65 and older. On Tuesday, the federal government recommended that states expand access to COVID-19 vaccines to everyone 65 and older, prompting faster distribution of the vaccines by making more people immediately eligible. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) said Tuesday that fewer than 9 million vaccinations have been administered from

the more than 25 million vaccine doses delivered nationwide. Both Southwell and the health department require advance registration for vaccination appointments, and they have already been inundated with thousands of requests. In Tift County alone, there are more than 6,500 residents older than 65. Those who meet the eligibility criteria for the vaccination can register for an appointment with either Southwell or the health department. To register at Southwell or call its drive-thru clinic's request line at 229-353-2200, Monday - Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. The vaccines will be given in two doses weeks apart. "We are excited about the opportunity to begin providing COVID-19 vaccinations to public safety workers and vulnerable members of our community," said Dr. Cameron Nixon, Southwell's chief transformation officer. "We know there is an interest in this in our community, and we are ready to meet this need." Nixon said the Southwell health system has had a "great experience" vaccinating its employees. "We know there is a lot of mistrust or skepticism out there about this, but this is completely safe." At the beginning of January, COVID-19 cases spiked dramatically in Tift County as a surge continues through Georgia. On Jan. 4, Tift experienced a record average daily case rate of 126.4 cases per 100,000 population, according to Emory University. As of Jan. 11, Tift County's average daily rate has dropped to 90.1 cases. During the past two weeks, Tift has recorded 218 new coronavirus cases, translating to 530 per 100,000 population, the DPH said. There have been a total of 3,078 cases in Tift County with 74 related deaths. On Tuesday, the state of Georgia reported a one-day increase of 6,006 cases with 145 additional deaths and 435 new hospitalizations. Overall, Georgia has seen 648,694 cases and 10,444 deaths from COVID-19, the state said.



#### Florida Gators Hire Tifton's Wesley McGriff As Defensive Coach



Tifton native Wesley McGriff has been hired as an assistant football coach at the University of Florida. McGriff, 52, played cornerback, running back and wide receiver for the Tift County High School state championship team in 1983. He was indicted into the Tift County Athletic Hall of Fame in 2014 as part of the championship team, and again individually in 2017. McGriff served as Auburn University's secondary coach the past two seasons and also in 2016, spilt by a two-year stint as defensive coordinator at Ole Miss. He is a 30-year coaching veteran who has NFL and considerable Southeastern Conference experience. McGriff has also coached at Kentucky and Vanderbilt. He spent four seasons each at Miami (2007-10) and at Baylor (2003-06), where he also served as recruiting coordinator. From 2013-15, McGriff was on staff with the NFL's New Orleans

Saints, where he worked with the team's defensive backs. "Coach McGriff brings a high level of familiarity in the National Football League and Southeastern Conference, being a coordinator and position coach," said Florida Head Coach Dan Mullen. "His track record of preparing players for the NFL and his success coaching at every level speaks for itself. His energy and tireless effort in recruiting will be an asset to our defensive staff." McGriff played at South Carolina State for one year before transferring to Savannah State, where he started at outside linebacker for three seasons and was named the conference's 1989 Male Academic Athlete of the Year. He received his bachelor's degree in criminal justice, graduating cum laude, from Savannah State in 1990 and earned a master's in public administration from Georgia Southern in 1993. McGriff was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Army in 1990 and was a member of the Army Reserves until 2001.
