Ashburn Family Seeks Owner Of Guitar Found Off I-75 In Tifton



Jake Perry, 18, of Ashburn was driving onto a north-bound ramp of Interstate 75 in Tifton on Dec. 19 when, out of the corner of his eye, he saw some kind of bag on the side of the road. "My boys are always finding stuff on the side of the road. Always. Sometimes it's a lottery ticket that's been scratched that actually has money on it waiting to be cashed in; sometimes it's huge semi straps or car jacks," said his mother Amanda Cook Perry of Ashburn. She said that this time Jake "almost passed by without a second thought, but something told him to turn around." The "bag" was a guitar case with a beautiful guitar inside – along with personal items. "There are some priceless things inside to whoever lost it. Losing this for whom ever it belongs to would be the same as me losing my books of handwritten recipes," Amanda Perry wrote on social media, sharing photos of the guitar. Many of

the items have ties to the St. Augustine, Fla., area, so Amanda reached out to The St. Augustine Record newspaper, which published a story about it Monday. The Perrys are hoping the publicity will help return the guitar, case and items to their owner. As of Thursday, the owner has not been located, she told the Tifton Grapevine. Among the items in the guitar case are old newspaper clippings by Lindsay Terry, who wrote a column called "Story Behind The Song" for the St. Augustine newspaper. Terry died in 2018 at age 85. Amanda asks that the owner or owners contact her at 229-206-2225 if they can give her details about the guitar and the case's contents. "It means nothing to me and may mean probably everything to them," she told The Record. 

Tift County Receiving \$500,000 For Lamp Loop Road Improvements



The Tift County Development Authority and the Wayne County Industrial Development Authority will each receive \$500,000 for infrastructure enhancements that will benefit the local economy, the Ga. Department of Community Affairs (DCA) announced recently.

The OneGeorgia Equity funding from the DCA provides financial assistance to rural communities to help build necessary infrastructure for economic development.

The Tift County Development Authority will use the investment to strengthen road infrastructure on Lamp Loop Road, an area that supports several Tift County businesses and soon up to more than 300 jobs, the DCA said in its announcement.

The OneGeorgia program is designed to serve as a flexible community and economic development tool, providing grants and loans for eligible projects in rural Georgia. Wayne County will use the funds to extend water and sewer service to a newly acquired Wayne Commerce Center to prepare the site for industrial development. “DCA is committed to bolstering local economies through partnerships and resources, and the utilization of OneGeorgia for these projects illustrates the initiative of the leaders in these communities,” said DCA Commissioner Christopher Nunn.


Baby its Cold Outside
