Prevent Illegal School Bus Passing October 17-21, 2022 is National School Bus Safety Week

Statistically, school buses are the safest way to transport school children. Yet more injuries and fatalities occur outside of or near a school bus because a motorist has failed to obey the stop-arm warning or to follow local traffic laws. From 2011 and 2020, there were 1.6 times more fatalities among pedestrians (183) than occupants of school buses (113) in school-busrelated crashes. A total of 218 school-age children (18 and younger) died in school-bus-related crashes during that period, either as occupants of school buses or other vehicles, or on foot or bike.

Of the 218 deaths, 85 were children who were walking. Respect the "Danger Zone"! The school bus loading and unloading area is called the "Danger Zone." Specifically, this is any side of the bus where a child may not be seen by the bus driver and, therefore, is in the most danger. Let's work together to keep our children safe as they wait to ride the bus to and from school. SGSR Traffic Control Division wanted to share the information for National School Bus Safety Week in order to keep everyone safe on the roads especially our children. Please be sure to like and follow SGSR Traffic Control on Facebook as they will have different posts each day on School Bus Safety. 


Domestic Violence Awareness Month Begins With Vigil



Ruth's Cottage and The Patticake
House began National Domestic Violence
Awareness Month with a Candlelight Vigil and
a keynote speaker Tuesday night. The candlelight vigil, honoring the 216 victims killed
in domestic violence incidents during the previous year, including three Tift countians, was
held at Southern Regional Technical College campus in Tifton. The names of victims
were read aloud as the audience "lit" candles
in their memory,. Featured speaker
was Tomieka Daniel, a deputy director with
the Georgia Legal Services program. "We al-

ways like to start off the month of October with this incredibly meaningful event," said Nancy Bryan, the agency's executive director. "The Candlelight Vigil evening really allows us to show the community how dangerous domestic violence can be, while honoring the memory of those victims who have died and celebrating survivors." On Oct. 20, Ruth's Cottage and The Patticake House will also participate in the national "Wear Purple Day" to raise awareness for domestic violence. Residents are encouraged to participate that day and send photos of themselves in their purple to 229-402-2146. "This is a very simple event for community-member participation," said Bryan. "We are just asking everyone to wear purple to raise awareness, much the same way that people do pink-outs for breast cancer awareness every October to show their support." After Wear Purple Day, Ruth's Cottage and The Patticake House will host "Walk a Mile in Her Shoes" on Oct. 27 on the front lawn of the ABAC campus. Registration for those walking will open at 5:30 p.m., with the actual walk starting at 6:30. Anyone interested in walking may sign up at www.stopthehurtga.org/events/walk-a-mile-in-her-shoes/ "This event is a little more fun and lighthearted," said Bryan. "Men from throughout the community will don high heels and walk an actual mile to show their support for domestic violence victims and their commitment to 'stopping the hurt.'" In addition to these events, Ruth's Cottage and The Patticake House, is also working to raise awareness about domestic violence through social media, a victim display, purple stickers, and their "Save a Seat" project. Throughout October, videos on domestic violence and statements from Domestic Violence Program Committee members, board members, and staff will be posted on social media.

"We know that many of you already have youth groups that afford the opportunity for youth

to have positive and caring influences on a regular basis. Our hope is that many locations in Tift County will come together to show that our community cares about and supports the well-being of our youth." Go Light Up Your World is an annual event that needs communitywide participation to show the full impact of the support that youth have in Tift County, McEntyre said. "We envision an evening where there will be luminaries lit all over the county at the same time, 7-8:30 p.m., with the same mission of working together for the best interest of our children." 

October is SIDS Awareness Month

SIDS is the sudden, unexpected death of an apparently healthy baby under one year of age that remains unexplained after the performance of a complete postmortem investigation, including an autopsy, examination of the scene of death and review of the medical history. SIDS is the leading cause of death for babies one month to one year of age. It occurs in all socio-economic, racial and ethnic groups, but African American and Native American babies are 2-3 times more likely to die of SIDS than Caucasian babies. Most SIDS deaths occur when a baby is between two and four month with 90 percent of all SIDS deaths occurring before a baby is 6 months old. Despite awareness campaigns promoting the back sleep position and other safe sleep practices, deaths continue to occur as a result of unsafe sleep practices such as bed sharing, use of soft bedding and stomach sleep position. At this time there is no known way to prevent all sudden infant deaths, but there are lifesaving steps parents and caregivers can take to help protect their baby.

- · Babies should always be placed to sleep on their backs. Side and tummy sleep positions are not safe.
- · Do not fall asleep with a baby in an adult bed or on a sofa.
- · Do not smoke while you are pregnant and do not expose babies to second-hand smoke after they are born.
- · For sleep, use a safety-approved crib, portable crib, play yard or bassinet with a firm mattress that fits snuggly and is covered with only a tight-fitting crib sheet.
- · Do not place babies to sleep on soft surfaces such as adult beds, waterbeds, and sofas.
- · Do not use loose blankets in a baby's crib. Layer clothing or use a wearable blanket or other sleeper clothing to keep baby warm.
- · Remove all soft bedding and other soft items from the sleep area, including pillows, blankets, quilts, bumper pads and stuffed animals or toys, before placing the baby to sleep.
- · Take care not to overheat babies with too much clothing or too warm of room. Keep temperature at what would be comfortable for a lightly clothed adult.
- · Use a pacifier at naptime and nighttime for the first year.
- · Educate all of your baby's caregivers regarding these life saving tips.

First-year Worth County coach Jeff Hamond inherited a program that hadn't had a winning season since 2016, but he also found a rising senior quarterback who had rushed for 1,002 yards and passed for 1,921 in just 10 games the prior season. Cooper, GHSF Daily's state Player of the Week, passed for 408 yards and six touchdowns and rushed for 96 yards in a 47-38 victory over Dodge County last week. "Chip is a true dual-threat quarterback," Hammond said. "He is a strong runner and can sit back and go through his reads and deliver an accurate ball. The one bonus Chip brings is the ability to extend plays when protection breaks down." Worth County is 6-0 for the first time since 1989. The award is sponsored by Sports Turf.
