



Tift County, State Hit All-Time High Grad Rates



The Tift County School System has reached an all-time high graduation rate of 93.5%, exceeding its goal, the school system says. The graduation rate is a 2.13 percentage point increase over last year's 91.37%. "The credit for this success goes not only to the staff at Tift County High School but to all

employees of Tift County Schools. This combined effort is a testament to our 'Relentless Pursuit of a Culture of Excel-

lence." said Dana Spurlin, chief information officer for the school system. In announcing graduation rates, the Georgia Department of Education (GDOE) said the state's 2022 four-year cohort graduation rate is also at an all-time high of 84.1%, up from the 2021 rate of 83.7%. From the beginning of ninth grade, students who are entering that grade for the first time form a "cohort" that gets adjusted by adding any students who transfer into the cohort during the next three years and subtracting any students who transfer out. "Graduation rate measures whether students are graduating from high school with a regular diploma in four or five years. This component includes both the four- and five-year adjusted cohort graduation rates and is only applicable to high schools," the GDOE said. State School Superintendent Richard Woods said that "teachers and students who persevered through the challenges of the last several years deserve credit for Georgia's graduation rate increasing and other recent positive indicators, like Georgia students beating the SAT national average once again." A decade ago, Georgia's 2012 graduation rate was 69.7%.

"The Syd" Arts Center Focuses On Community Outreach



The new mission of the Tifton Council for the Arts is to make arts available, affordable, and accessible to all, Executive Director Joy Yost told the Tifton Rotary Club on Wednesday. Described by former arts board member Marion Curry as "our big, hairy audacious goal," the arts council's vision is "to be a catalyst transforming Tifton into a city renowned for its diverse, vibrant, and thriving artistic community," Yost said. The former Tifton Museum of Arts and Heritage was rededicated to this mission and renamed the Syd Blackmarr Arts Center on April 27, exactly 25 years since its first exhibit opened there April 27, 1997. Yost said with the help of the Tifton Rotary Club and other organizations in the 1990s, the former Methodist Church on Love Avenue was transformed into a showplace for the arts. Art classes are now held at various locations around Tifton. For instance, a Bookbinding Basics class will be held Monday, Oct. 17, in a classroom at the Tift County Recreation Department for a class fee of \$35. A four-week watercolor class will be held at the same location, 202 Baldwin Drive, beginning Oct.

20. A Kids at Art class for children aged 5-11 is held at the Rec Department classroom one Tuesday per month, with a Halloween-themed class Oct. 25. A cookie-decorating class for adults and teens accompanied by an adult will be held Oct. 27. An adult pottery workshop will be held Nov. 1 and 3, making a Christmas plate and cup, at the First United Methodist Church Activity Center. Advance registration is required for all classes. Yost said a creative movement dance class is being held at "The Syd" on Tuesday evenings through October until Nov. 8. At 7-8:30 p.m. next Thursday, Oct. 20, the Syd Arts Center will kick off a new tradition, "Third Thursdays at the Syd," beginning with local authors reading from their books, free of charge for attendees. Rotary Club members Warren Robinson and Rick Register will be featured next week, along with other local authors. In November's event, Bruce Green will give a lecture on one of Tifton's earliest artists. On Nov. 5, the Celebrate Creativity arts festival will be held free of charge inside and around the Syd Blackmarr Arts Center. The festival will feature an art exhibit/ competition inside The Syd, Artist Market outside, Authors Row, a children's Arts Circus with activities from 10 a.m.-4 p.m., Sweet Taste of Tifton, and Food Trucks. The UGA football game will be streaming on a big screen TV for football fans, and there will be Gaelic music and dance, Yost said. 



Reading To Your Children

Books and Bubbles is a fun day at The Margaret Jones Public Library every Tuesday at 10:30am. They enjoy time together reading and doing activities. The staff encourages you to keep books around and read whenever you can. You are providing the building blocks for language while developing a love of reading for your children. Reading is an important skill that needs to be developed in children. Not only is it necessary for survival in the world of schools and universities. but in adult life as well. The ability to learn about new subjects and find helpful information on anything from health problems and consumer protection to more academic research into science or the arts depends on the ability to read. Futurologists used to predict the death of the printed word but, ironically, Internet has made reading more and more a part of people's daily lives. The paperless society is a myth. The computer's ability to process and analyze data means that endless variations on reports and other types of documents can be and are generated. Internet, itself an enormous new source of information and recreation, is based on the humble written word. To effectively utilize the web and judge the authenticity and value of what is found there, both reading and critical thinking skills are of prime importance. The more children read, the better they become at reading. It's as simple as that. The more enjoyable the things they read are, the more they'll stick with them and develop the reading skills that they'll need for full access to information in their adult lives. Reading should be viewed as a pleasurable activity - as a source of entertaining tales and useful and interesting information. The younger children are read to, the greater their interest in mastering reading. Reading out loud exposes' children to proper grammar and phrasing. It enhances the development of their spoken language skills, their ability to express themselves verbally. Reading, by way of books, magazines, or websites, exposes kids to new vocabulary. Even when they don't understand every new word, they absorb something from the context that may deepen their understanding of it the next time the word is encountered. When parents read aloud to children, the children also hear correct pronunciation as they see the words on the page, even if they can't yet read the words on their own.
