### Reading To Your Children

Books and Bubbles is a fun day at The Margaret Jones Public Library every Tuesday at 10:30am. They enjoy time together reading and doing activities. The staff encourages you to keep books around and read whenever you can. You are providing the building blocks for language while developing a love of reading for your children. Reading is an important skill that needs to be developed in children. Not only is it necessary for survival in the world of schools and universities, but in adult life as well. The ability to learn about new subjects and find helpful information on anything from health problems and consumer protection to more academic research into science or the arts depends on the ability to read. Futurologists used to predict the death of the printed word but, ironically, Internet has made reading more and more a part of people's daily lives. The paperless society is a myth. The computer's ability to process and analyze data means that endless variations on reports and other types of documents can be and are generated. Internet, itself an enormous new source of information and recreation, is based on the humble written word. To effectively utilize the web and judge the authenticity and value of what is found there, both reading and critical thinking skills are of prime importance. The more children read, the better they become at reading. It's as simple as that. The more enjoyable the things they read are, the more they'll stick with them and develop the reading skills that they'll need for full access to information in their adult lives. Reading should be viewed as a pleasurable activity - as a source of entertaining tales and useful and interesting factual information. The more young children are read to, the greater their interest in mastering reading. Reading out loud exposes children to proper grammar and phrasing. It enhances the development of their spoken language skills, their ability to express themselves verbally. Reading, by way of books, magazines or websites, exposes kids to new vocabulary. Even when they don't understand every new word, they absorb something from the context that may deepen their understanding of it the next time the word is encountered. When parents read aloud to children, the children also hear correct pronunciation as they see the words on the page, even if they can't yet read the words on their own.



#### Sunbelt Ag Expo's Economic Impact Felt In Tifton; Three - Day Show Opens Tuesday Outside Moultrie

The 43rd Annual Sunbelt Agricultural Exposition, known as North America's Premier Farm Show and America's largest farm show with field demonstrations, returns to Southwest Georgia on Tuesday for its three-day run. Headquartered at Spence Field just outside Moultrie, the Sunbelt Ag Expo has an impact beyond its Colquitt County home. "The 2019 economic impact is estimated to be over \$16.72 million for the 50-mile radius of Spence Field -20 counties," Tyron Spearman, executive director of the Tifton-Tift County Tourism Association, tells the Tifton Grapevine. "Sunbelt generates \$1.1 million in state and local tax revenue. Tifton has long benefited from the Expo because of over 1,000 motel rooms and great restaurants. Lots of exhibitors stay in Tifton during set-up and takedown. Sunbelt's economic outreach has benefitted Tifton and Tift County year round," Spearman says. Last year the Expo, whose origins date to "Dealer Days" on Tifton's Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College campus in 1964, was canceled because of the pandemic. Organizers expect this year's show to be bigger and better than ever. "After missing out on the financial impact from the Sunbelt Ag Expo last year due to COVID, it is very exciting to have all our Expo guests back here in Tifton for this coming Expo week," says Tifton Tourism Board Chair Kathleen Moore, regional manager at Stafford Hospitality, whose holdings include Tifton's Hilton Garden Inn. "This event fills all of the local hotels for the week and also brings business to the local restaurants with everyone eating out in the evening when back from the Expo. The event this year filled up a bit later than is usual; however, this was understandable due to the pandemic," Moore says. More than 1,200 exhibitors will display and demonstrate products, and welcome thousands of visitors to the 100-acre show site. The Expo brings together all segments of agribusiness, such as farmers, educators, students, policy-makers, agriculture enthusiasts, and families. There will be more than 300 seminars and demonstrations covering such topics as beef cattle management; equine, goat, and sheep health; fish/pond management; dairy and poultry; electrical safety; backyard gardening; and sustainable living. Not only will the latest in agricultural equipment be displayed along with the industry's newest innovations and technology, but the Expo also includes the American Grand Finals Stock Dog Trials, test tracks for trucks and ATVS, a cow-milking contest, and a daily Antique Tractor Parade. One highlight is the naming of the Swisher Sunbelt Expo Southeastern Farmer of the Year chosen from among 10 states. Also, Virginia is this year's Spotlight State in agriculture. Also of interest is the Expo's 600-acre research farm's field demonstrations, which showcase harvesting and tillage equipment for cotton, peanuts, corn, soybeans, and hay. As in the past, cotton will be harvested during the show. "Georgia Grown" foods will be available along with cooking demonstrations and recipes. "The Sunbelt Expo is an unbelievable showcase of rural living blanketed with agriculture's newest ideas and technologies. It's three days of fun, education, and dreaming about agriculture's future as we team together to feed, clothe, and house a growing population around the world," says Chip Blalock, the show's director. The Sunbelt Ag Expo is open from 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday, and from 8:30 a.m.-4 p.m. Thursday. Gate admission is \$10 per person per day. The show site is four miles southeast of Moultrie off U.S. Highway 319 on Highway 133.

Tifton's Rhythm & Ribs BBQ Festival was a big success Saturday, October 9th as the event, delayed from March by the pandemic, brought folks back together to "party in the pines." There was plenty of music and food available, as well as vendors selling a variety of items. The Georgia Barbecue Association-sanctioned professional barbecue competition brought cooks from around the Southeast, with 319 Q winning the Grand Champion title and taking home \$3,000. In the Backyard Barbecue, or amateur, competition, Whitewater Smokers was the overall Grand Champion, winning a \$1,000 prize. Two Toes BBQ came in first in the pulled park category, Butcher & Banker was first in the loin category, and Deez Butts BBQ placed first in ribs. "Squealbur," the festival mascot, was featured on the trophies for the best barbecue in the various categories. Next year's festival is scheduled to return to its normal schedule during the first weekend in March.
