### Fox Theatre Institute Awards \$70,000 Grant For Lights, Marquee At Tift Theatre



The Fox Theatre Institute has awarded the Tift Theatre for the Performing Arts a \$70,000 matching grant to replace its marquee and upgrade the outside neon lights. On Monday, Tifton City Council accepted the grant, which will be matched with city funds. Acting City Manager Emily Beeman told council that replacing the marquee is a safety issue. "The theater marquee is literally falling apart," Beeman said. "Letters are falling off the sign." Not only are there safety concerns but "it's also a bad look for the theater," she said. Some letters currently must be "zip-tied" to the marquee to keep them in place.

will look the same way as it does now, but will look better," she said. The grant will also "take most of the neon down and replace it with LED lights," Beeman told council. The Tifton grant is one of 11 historic grant projects, totaling \$500,120 that the Fox Theatre Institute has just awarded. The grants "allow historic theaters to receive much-needed financial assistance, restoration support, and operations mentoring from the engagement department of the Fox Theatre in Atlanta," according to a Fox Theatre press release. Since 2008, the Fox has awarded more than \$2.7 million to more than 75 projects, primarily in Georgia, with a limited number in Alabama, South Carolina, and North Carolina. In December 2017, the Fox Theatre Institute awarded a \$77,027 matching grant to the Tift Theatre to repair and restore interior seating. "The Fox Theatre has been a great partner for us," Mayor Julie B. Smith said at Monday's council meeting. The Tift Theatre opened in 1937 as a movie house and was revamped as a performing arts venue in the 1990s.

### ABAC Concert Band, Jazz Ensemble Plan Joint Concert



The ABAC Concert Band and the ABAC Jazz Ensemble will present a joint concert at 7 p.m. Nov. 15 in Howard Auditorium at Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College. The 40-member Concert Band, which includes several community residents, will be directed by Deborah Bradley. Dr. Andrew Peal, assistant professor of jazz and music theory, directs the jazz band. The concert is open to the public at no charge. Bradley said the Concert Band will open with Sousa-style selections dedicated to veterans. "The program will open just the way John Philip Sousa would have done so in the 1920s when he became America's 'march king," Bradley said. "After a classical piece, the band will welcome guest conductor Don Coates, founder of the ABAC band program. He will conduct a Sousa march, 'The Belle of Chicago,' written in 1892 for a World's Fair performance in Chicago." Donald

Davis, executive director of the Lowndes County Historic Society and Museum, will bring to the stage an authentic Sousa band uniform worn by Sousa's first trombonist Lester Grey. The uniform was used on the Sousa Band tour from 1919-25. Grey lived for a short time in Lowndes County. When Peal and the jazz band hit the stage, their music will spotlight songs written or frequently performed by Charlie Parker, one of the world's most influential alto saxophonists. Peal said the jazz numbers will include Parker's "Billie's Bounce" and "Little Suede Shoes," as well as "All the Things You Are" by Jerome Kern, and George Gershwin's "Summertime."



### **Around the Gardens: Falling Leaves**



With the shorter days, cooler nights, and bright, sunny days of autumn we put on an extra jacket – especially in the mornings. Deciduous trees and shrubs do the opposite. In preparation for winter, chlorophyll production slows down and leaves eventually drop off. The colorful pigments we're beginning to see may have been in the leaves all along but were masked by the green from chlorophyll. Technically the yellows, golds and oranges are due to carotenoid which is in the leaves fairly constantly. Red colors are a different story. Sunny days allow the leaves to produce sugar, but the cool night temperatures prevent the sugar sap from flowing into the branches and trunk. To help the plant re-

cover nutrients in the leaves before they fall off some trees produce anthocyanins. It is these anthocyanins that produce the brilliant shades of red and maroon. Lots of cloudy days can mean fewer red leaves. Lack of rain also affects leaf coloration and many leaves may simply turn brown and fall off rather than show brilliant fall color. As the larger trees turn color and drop their leaves, the smaller trees and shrubs will show their fall colors. In the Gardens at Callaway, the vistas around the lakes are always good places to see leaf color. Later in the fall foliage season, be sure to drive through Overlook and Meadowlark to see the Japanese maple colors.
