Phoebe Worth Medical Center Holds Their Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony



Phoebe Worth Medical Center kicked off the holiday season with their Lights of Love tree lighting ceremony on Tuesday night, November 29th. Sylvester native, Lindsay Culpepper was our honorary tree lighter. Lindsay was diagnosed with cervical cancer, and while that was the most difficult time in her life it helped her discover a love for baking.

Lindsay makes delicious and elaborate cakes for folks in and around her hometown of Sylvester, but she hasn't always been so comfortable around a mixing bowl. "I'd always wanted to be that mom who baked their kids' birthday cakes and homemade treats for school events, but really, I was the one who showed up with a box of twinkies," Lindsay said. She only discovered her talent and love for baking during the most difficult time of her life. "I had never baked anything until two years ago, and I was able to use that to get back on my feet," she said. What knocked Lindsay off her feet was a terrifying diagnosis of cervical cancer that led her to seek the care of a gynecological oncologist in Tallahassee. "Even now, every time I go to the doctor, I expect some terrible news because every time I would go there, they would tell me it was over, but it wasn't," she said. That cancer specialist initially thought Lindsay may only need surgery to remove the cancerous part of her cervix, but then she required a radical trachelectomy to remove her entire cervix and surrounding tissue. After that, cancer was found in her lymph nodes, so she needed chemotherapy and radiation. That's when she came to the Phoebe Cancer Center. "When I met Dr. (Adam) Jones and Dr. (Chirag) Jani, things started going a good bit smoother," she said. Lindsay needed 25 radiation treatments, weekly chemotherapy for five weeks and three rounds of brachytherapy — an advanced, internal radiation therapy designed to target a very specific area. The treatments took a physical toll. "There were days when I would have to pull over on the side of the road on the way home and throw up," she said. Coming at a time when Lindsay's older daughter, Ansley, was settling into college at Georgia Southern University, it was also a difficult time emotionally. "I had to try to stay really strong, so she

college at Georgia Southern University, it was also a difficult time emotionally. "I had to try to stay really strong, so she wouldn't think she would have to come home. I did a really good job of acting like everything was fine." She also had to lean on her younger daughter, Alayna, more than she would have liked. "My 13-year-old had to flush my PICC line every day. She would saran-wrap me so I could take a shower. We can laugh about it now, but it was awful at the time," Lindsay said. Sometimes she simply couldn't hold her emotions in. "With Dr. Jones, I don't know how many times I went in there crying, and he would always be so calm and patient and sit and talk with me for as long as I needed. He's very caring and compassionate," Lindsay said. She has the same appreciation for the rest of the Phoebe Cancer Center team who cared for her. "I had the best nurses and radiation therapists. Their team is the best. I got really, really lucky with the doctors and nurses who took care of me." During her treatments, Lindsay was unable to work full-time, and she lost her job, only adding to the stress and hardship. Her care team at Phoebe stepped in to help then, too. "My radiation therapists made casseroles for us for Thanksgiving and even sponsored my kids for Christmas, and my chemo nurses got together and gave me big gift card." Her family also received financial support from Cancer Ties, an Albany-based charity that helps local cancer patients with medical costs and household expenses. "There were just blessings everywhere," Lindsay said. Lindsay is doing great today. She's cancer-free. She's proud of her daughters. She's grateful for the team at Phoebe wood cared for her, the friends and family who supported her and the faith that sustained her. "I don't know how anybody could get through this without a faith in God," she said. And she's happy that, in the midst of so many challenges, she found her new passion. "My Aunt Connie taught me to make a 12-layer chocolate cake for my brother's birthday, and it was so ea



Former Tiftonite John Berry To Bring Annual Christmas Tour To Tift Theatre



Country music Grammy Award-winner John Berry, a former Tifton resident, will end his 26th Annual Nationwide Christmas Tour in Tifton on Dec. 20. "Twenty-six years – I could not have imagined that I would be so blessed to have this opportunity to share my music, celebrating the birth of Christ all these years," Berry said. "It has meant so much to me to have many of you come time and again with your families and friends to share in the music of the season. I look for-

ward to singing for all of you that have been with me before, as well as those that will be joining us for the first time." Berry is well known for his seasonal, fan-favorite holiday performances, which are filled with traditional Christmas songs, many of his most requested hit songs, and a few of his childhood stories. The Christmas tour began Nov. 25 in Sugar Hill, Ga., then moves to North Carolina, West Virginia, Indiana, Ohio, South Carolina, and Alabama, returning to Georgia with performances in Cedartown, Athens, Macon, Augusta, and Tifton. A decade ago, Berry lived for a time in Tifton before moving to Tennessee. In 2019, he was diagnosed with throat cancer, requiring a combined 35 treatments of radiation and chemotherapy. Berry has had 20 singles on the country hit parade charts, six of which went Top 5 as well as a No. 1 on the Billboard and Radio & Records country charts. He has earned numerous Gold and Platinum records. Berry's cowritten "A Mind Of Her Own" and "Kiss Me In The Car" introduced him to radio audiences in 1993. "Your Love Amazes Me," "What's In It For Me," and "You And Only You" thrust him to stardom in 1994. "Standing On The Edge Of Goodbye," "I Think About It All The Time," and "If I Had Any Pride Left At All" were all major hits the following year. "Your Love Amazes Me" earned Berry a 1995 Grammy nomination. In 1996, he scored a Grammy win for his participation in "Amazing Grace: A Country Salute to Gospel." Berry took "Change My Mind" into the country music Top 5 in 1996, and "She's Taken A Shine" became an even bigger hit in 1997. He was nominated for CMA Vocal Event of the Year for "Long Haired Country Boy" with Charlie Daniels and Hal Ketchum.

Molly was recognized as the Third High Individual Overall Senior, and Bethany received the Third High Cotton Boll Commercial award. The top four individuals on the senior team, Pranay, Molly, Bethany, and Coleman, have qualified to compete at the state level contest at Rock Eagle 4 -H Center on Dec. 10. Among the Tift County Cloverleaf team members, Camden Williamson was the Third High Individual Overall Cloverleaf and received the Second High Cotton Boll Commercial award. Kamsi Nnaeto received third in Cloverleaf Judging and Reasons. The Tift County 4-H Cotton Boll and Consumer Judging teams were coached by Ashley Carroll, Tift County 4-H agent; with assistance from Lauren Dubberly, Tift 4 -H educator; and Annabelle Putman, Tift 4-H AmeriCorps service member. More than 80 youths from eight counties participated in the district competition. The competitive judging contest teaches 4-H'ers about cotton as an agriculture commodity in Georgia as well as cotton promotion through commercials and advertisements. The competition offers youth the chance to build skills in critical thinking, public speaking, and consumer economics. 


Christmas Book Countdown

Jessa May's Mom started a new holiday tradition last year. She wrapped 25 books to countdown to Christmas. Each day she will unwrap and read a book to Jessa May. This is a great way to help your children read a thousand books before kindergarten. At The Margaret Jones Public Library, they are there to help you reach this goal with your little ones. The library recognizes the connection between reading to young children early, library use and educational success. The National Commission on Reading concluded that, "The single most important activity for building the knowledge required for eventual success in reading is reading aloud to children." The Margaret Jones Public Library is committed to instilling a love for reading in the very young child. They provide a variety of children's books in several different ageappropriate formats. For babies and toddlers, they have durable little board books. For preschoolers through third grade, they have picture books. Easy readers allow beginning readers to begin the formal process of reading and word recognition. The Margaret Jones Public Library also has Juvenile nonfiction and chapter books for grades 2nd through 8th. Kids have their very own card catalog at http://gapines.org/kpac . Only those 350,000-plus books, DVDs, CDs and other items that have been cataloged in PINES as children's materials will show up in search results. Books & Bubbles is their story time for children ages zero to three and it is presented on Tuesday mornings at 10:30 am at the Margaret Jones Public Library. The group sing songs, use flannel stories and rhymes, and read books of course in this 20 minute story time. Then they have a time of play. Pre-School Story time is for children ages three to five and it is presented on Thursday mornings at 10 am. In this 60 minute story time they read books, sing songs, and create crafts all related to a theme. During the summer months when school is out, the library offers the Summer Reading Program. Research has shown that reading over the summer break helps prevent students from losing ground and helps prepare them for the next school year. Participating in the library's Summer Reading Program is a great way to stop the "summer slide". Each year there is a new theme. Check the library's event calendar for more details. Whether you need help locating a good book to read or information to complete a school project, we're here to help. Come by the Library to pick out some holiday books to share with your little ones.


