

Lights Of Love Tree Now Turned On At Phoebe Worth



Tuesday night, November 30th, was a very chilly night under the beautiful clear skies at Phoebe Worth in Sylvester. As I sat there, a sense of calmness and peace surrounded us all. The Phoebe Foundation honors local cancer patients and their families with its annual Lights of Love tree lighting ceremony annually during the holiday season. Each year, Phoebe selects an honorary tree lighter and this year's tree lighter for Phoebe Worth was Mrs. Carole Marchant. When Mrs. Carole flipped the switch to illuminate the thousands of lights on the Lights of Love tree at Phoebe Worth, she was right at home. She has been a member of the Phoebe Family for 47 years and currently serves as Supply Chain/EVS Manager and Biomed/IT Coordinator. "I'm fully dedicated to this hospital," said Mrs. Carole. "I love the people here. I love the patients. They're the reason we're here. And I love the whole health system as well." The ceremony started at 7pm with a welcome from Ms. Sharon Lyles from the Sylvester/Worth Cancer Coalition. Ms. Sharon works endless hours to provide education and support to the Cancer Coalition for Sylvester and Worth County having experienced cancer through her mother and grandmother both being diagnosed at the age of 59. Pastor Walt Thompkins from Pine Hill Baptist Church

presented the invocation followed by remarks from Mr. Scott Steiner, CEO for Phoebe Putney Health System and Dr. Troy Kimsey, Medical Director of Oncology Services at Phoebe Cancer Center. Mr. Tanner Gleaton performed "Whatever May Come" and did an amazing job. Ms. Mandy Gordon with Phoebe Worth Medical Center introduced Ms. Carole. Mandy did a wonderful job introducing such an amazing lady. The words Mandy spoke were simply beautiful. Mrs. Carole then spoke before the lighting of the tree and candles. While the crowd held their candles and the tree was being lite, Mr. Tanner Gleaton sang "O Holy Night" which was breathtaking. Such a beautiful ceremony! Started in 1983 by the Junior Woman's Club of Albany, Lights of Love has since raised more than \$1 million for cancer services and patients at Phoebe Cancer Center. This year's donations will benefit the Light House, a place of respite and comfort for cancer patients throughout southwest Georgia as they prepare for and undergo treatment. The Lights of Love trees are special for their symbolic white lights in memory and honor of individuals. For each light purchased for a suggested \$25 donation, a card is sent to those honored or to family members. 

GA Sees 97% Increase In New Business Applications, Says Study

Georgia has had a 97% increase in new business applications compared to 2019 (pre-COVID vs. now), placing the Peach State second nationwide, according to newly published research. Business applications made in 2019 were compared to those made in the past year up until this past August, according to CardConnect, a company that aids businesses in payment processing. Across the U.S., the average increase in business applications when comparing figures prepandemic to now is 44%, the company reported. In Georgia, approximately one in 30 people made a new business application during the past year; nationwide, the average was one in 63 people during the time period. Georgians also ranked eighth in the nation in those seeking to start an online business, determined by analyzing Google Trends data.





Jessa May's Mom started a new holiday tradition last year. She wrapped 25 books to countdown to Christmas. Each day she will unwrap and read a book to Jessa May. This is a great way to help your children read a thousand books before kindergarten. At The Margaret Jones Public Library, they are there to help you reach this goal with your little ones. The Library recognizes the connection between reading to young children early, library use and educational success. The National Commission on Reading concluded that, "The single most important activity for building the knowledge required for eventual success in reading is reading aloud to children." We are committed to instilling a love for reading in the very young child. We provide a variety of children's books in several different age appropriate formats. For babies and toddlers we have durable little board books. For preschoolers through third grade we have picture books. Easy readers allow beginning readers to begin the formal process of reading and word recognition. We have Juvenile nonfiction and chapter books for grades 2 through 8. Kids have their very own card catalog at http://gapines.org/kpac . Only those 350,000-plus books, DVDs, CDs and other items that have been cataloged in PINES as children's materials will show up in search results. Books & Bubbles is our story time for children ages zero to three and it is presented on Tuesday mornings at 10:30 am. We sing songs, use flannel stories and rhymes, and read books of course in this 20 minute story time. Then we have a time of play. Pre-School Story time is for children ages three to five and it is presented on Thursday mornings at 10 am. In this 60 minute story time we read books, sing songs, and create crafts all related to a theme. Third Thursday Lego Club is for kids of all ages. We provide the Legos. All you have to bring is your imagination. All creations will be on display for everyone to see. This club meets on the third Thursday of each month from 5:30 to 6:30 pm. During the summer months when school is out, the library offers the Summer Reading Program. Research has shown that reading over the summer break helps prevent students from losing ground and helps prepare them for the next school year. Participating in the library's Summer Reading Program is a great way to stop the "summer slide". Each year there is a new theme. Check the library's event calendar for more details. Whether you need help locating a good book to read or information to complete a school project, we're here to help. Come by the Library to pick out some holiday books to share with your little ones.

Georgia Unemployment Rate Hits All-Time Low Amid Strong Job Growth

Atlanta, GA - Georgia Labor Commissioner Mark Butler announced today that Georgia's unemployment rate dropped to 3.1 percent in October, the lowest rate in Georgia's recorded history. The rate was down two-tenths from a revised 3.3 percent in September. The national October 2021 unemployment rate was down two-tenths to 4.6 percent. Jobs in Georgia were up 21,000 over the month and are up 4.5 percent over the year to 4,605,600. "We have seen continuous job growth this year as we have gained back 90 percent of the jobs lost during the pandemic," said Commissioner Butler. "The continual increase in employment opportunity, particularly in those areas hardest hit by the pandemic, reinforces the critical need for encouraging available Georgians back into the workforce." Since May 2021, job growth has increased by 117,400 and October's growth marks only the fifth time since 1990 that over the month job growth for October was over 20,000 (2020, 2017, 2004, 1993). The sectors of Administrative and Support Services, Transportation and Warehousing, and Retail Trade have all recouped the jobs lost during the pandemic and have added to their respective totals. At the same time, Accommodation and Food Services, Local Government, and Religious, Grants, Civic, and Professional Services, among others, continue to struggle to fill jobs. In October, the labor force dropped 1,889 to 5,174,052, while the number of employed rose 11,008 to 5,015,945. The number of unemployed was down 12,897 to 158,107. In comparing October 2021 figures to pre-pandemic March 2020 figures, the labor force remains down 32,000, the number of employed remains down 3,000, and the number of unemployed is now down 29,000. Today, over 208,000 job postings, resulting in a minimum of over 319,000 unfilled positions, are listed online at Employ Georgia for Georgians to access. Market salaries range from \$23,000 to \$103,000 with a median salary of \$42,000. "The GDOL is working to ensure that every Georgian who wants a job can find a job," said Commissioner Butler. "Our Business Services Unit is helping the state's employers find employees that meet their business needs, and we are scheduling in-person appointments across the state in our career centers to make sure jobseekers have the support they need to successfully find employment." For personalized assistance, employers can reach Georgia Department of Labor (GDOL) staff at https://dol.georgia.gov/employer-email-usform. Additionally, by visiting Employ Georgia, employers can manage job openings and access the state's talent pool. GDOL's Career Centers are providing in-person employment services by appointment. Job seekers can reach out to their local career centers at https://dol.georgia.gov/ locations/career-center for assistance. Employers with over 1,000 job postings in October included Amazon 3,500, Wellstar Health System, 2,000, Home Depot, 1,800, Beech Valley Solutions, 1,600, Piedmont Health Care, 1,300, Walmart, 1,200, Anthem Blue Cross, 1,200, Deloitte, 1,100, and Southeastern Freight Lines, 1,000. Industries with over 10,000 job postings included Health Care, 26,000, Retail Trade, 21,000, Accommodation and Food Services, 13,000. Finance and Insurance, 12,000, Manufacturing, 12,000, Professional, Scientific & Technical Services, 11,000, and Transportation and Warehousing, 10,000. The sectors with the most over the month job gains in October included Transportation and Warehousing, 3,600, Retail Trade, 3,000, Health Care and Social Assistance, 2,500, Administrative and Support Services, 2,300, and Non-Durable Goods Manufacturing, 2,000. Job numbers in October were at an all-time high in Trade and Transportation, 977,400, in the Retail Trade sector, 502,600, in the Transportation and Warehousing sector, 259,800, Professional and Business Services, 755,000, and in the Administrative and Support Services sector, 370,900. Initial claims were down 1,525 (-5%) from September to 27,310 in October. Initial claims were down 169,356 (-86%) over the year.
