Governor Extends Vaccinations To Teachers, Others

Beginning March 8, teachers, school staffs and additional vulnerable Georgians will be eligible for COVID-19 vaccinations, Gov. Brian Kemp said Thursday. "Thanks to increased supply and significant progress in vaccinating frontline workers and the most vulnerable, more Georgians will be eligible to receive the vaccine starting March 8," Kemp said. But in his press conference the governor added: "We will continue to see more demand than we have supply." Eligible Georgians for the vaccine will now include pre-K through 12th-grade teachers and staff, employees of preschools and day cares, adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their caregivers, and parents of children with "complex medical conditions." These groups will be added to the current criteria for the vaccine, which includes first responders, residents and staff of long-term care facilities and Georgians age 65 and older along with their caregivers. Eligible residents may pre-register for vaccinations at MyVaccineGeorgia.com. Georgia has administered more than 1.8 million doses of vaccine, according to the Ga. department of Public Health (DPH). Also, the DPH reported Thursday that Tift County has seen 24 cases during the past week and 37 cases in the past two weeks, or 91 cases per 100,000 population. Tift's testing positivity rate is 4.1 percent in the past two weeks. Tift has reported 3,351 total cases and 91 related deaths. Georgia saw 2,206 new cases on Thursday and 107 related deaths, the DPH said. Overall, the state has reported 812,612 cases and 14,989 related deaths.

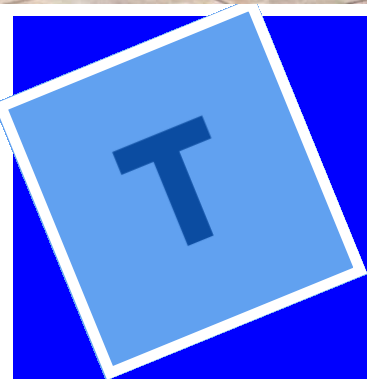

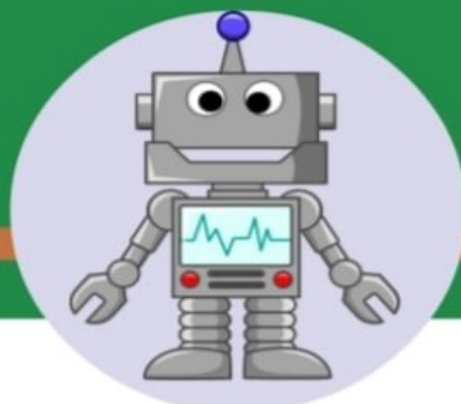
National Peanut Butter Lover's Day History

An un-named doctor was given credit for first providing peanut butter to his patients. In March of 1890, he began providing the spread to those patients who had difficulty chewing. 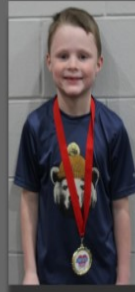

Kid's Heart Challenge/Jump Rope for Heart Was A Great Success At WCPS

The Worth County Primary School raised close to \$14,000 this year for Kid's Heart Challenge/Jump Rope for Heart. This year's total was four times greater than their previous top amount from last year. Despite the challenges that this year has presented, WCPS showed up and you showed out! WCPS is a perfect example and testament of what working together, we can accomplish. The PE department would like to thank you for making a difference in the lives of so many. They could not do what they do without the amazing administrators, teachers, students and families at your WCPS.

Raising these funds helps to educate against heart and stroke disease. Healthy hearts are very important. These are just some of the educational pieces that are shared for those with possible heart and stroke symptoms. Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain. Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach. Shortness of breath can occur with or without chest discomfort. Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness. If you are having any of these or are feeling bad in general and need immediate help, please call 911. Stroke symptoms are important to spot F.A.S.T. F is for Face Drooping. Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile. A is for Arm Weakness. Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward? S is for Speech Difficulty. Is speech slurred, are they unable to speak, or are they hard to understand? Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence, like "the sky is blue." Is the sentence repeated correctly? T is for Time to Call 911. If the person shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 9-1-1 and get them to the hospital immediately.



Blood donation is a community responsibility. While you're reading this, did you know a local patient needs blood? Blood is needed every two seconds. About one in seven people entering a hospital needs blood. Blood is always needed for treatment of accident victims, cancer patients, hemophiliacs, surgery patients and of the recent COVID-19 patients. Blood cannot be manufactured. Only 37 percent of our country's population is eligible to give blood, and less than 10 percent of those who can donate actually do donate annually. What if everyone eligible to donate became complacent and decided they didn't need to donate because someone else would? What if there wasn't enough donated blood available when you, a loved one - anyone - needed it? The blood supply comes from caring donors like you. It takes about one hour of your time. When you give blood, it gives someone another smile, another hug, another chance. It is the gift of life. In order to give, there are a couple of things you need to know. You must be in good health. You must weigh at least 110 pounds. (You may have to weigh more, depending on your height). You must meet screening criteria which is determined by your medical history, a drop of blood from your finger to estimate hematocrit level, pulse, blood pressure and temperature. You can safely give eight weeks (56 days) after your last whole blood donation. Be a Hero. Give Blood.



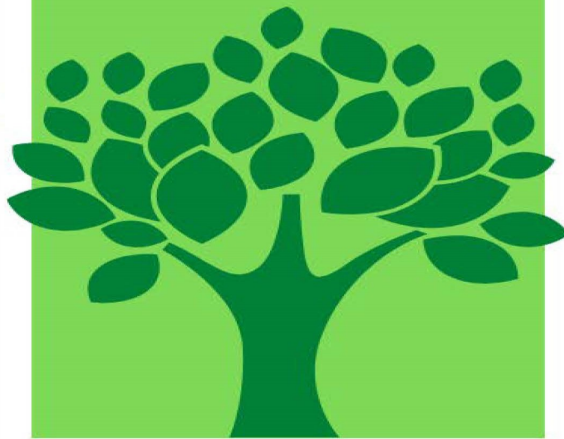

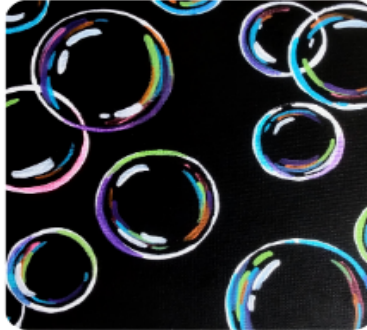

ABAC Student Newspaper Named Best In State



The student newspaper at Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College was recently recognized by the Georgia College Press Association (GCPA) Better Newspaper Contest as the best overall publication in its division in Georgia. Dr. Thomas Grant, advisor for The Stallion, said the newspaper has been the best in the state in its classification for decades, beginning when Helen Strickland took over as the advisor in 1968. "Then ABAC became a four-year college in 2008, and our students had to compete against schools like Georgia College and State University, Berry College, and Morehouse," Grant said. "That increased the level of competition. The fact that The Stallion continues to earn awards as the best small college newspaper in the state shows how talented ABAC students are. They can compete with anyone." Grant said The Stallion competes in GCPA Division B, representing colleges with less than 8,000 students. The Stallion placed first in General Photography Excellence, Best Campus Community Service in Features and News, and General Excellence. The General Excellence Award means The Stallion was the best overall compared to the other colleges in the division. The Stallion also received awards in General Advertising Excellence, Layout and Design Excellence, and Best Campus Community Service in Sports and Editorials. Grant said when writers for The Stallion graduate, they are getting jobs in media around the Southeast. He believes that's because ABAC is a hands-on college, and students develop practical skills in communication and student media.

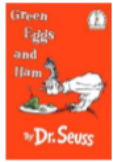

Kicking Off National Nutrition Month

March will be National Nutrition Month and part of leading a healthy life means eating a healthy diet and being physically active. A recent CDC study highlights when, where, and how U.S. adults and children are eating a healthy diet. Those who are not getting enough fruits and veggies can take small steps towards meeting recommended amounts, including adding more fruit to your usual breakfast routine or adding vegetables to your meals. Eating a diet rich in fruits and vegetables can help reduce the risk of many leading causes of illness and death, add important nutrients to your diet, and help with weight control. The recent study shows that adults get most of their fruit during breakfast and snacking whether they eat recommended amounts or not. 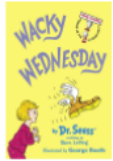

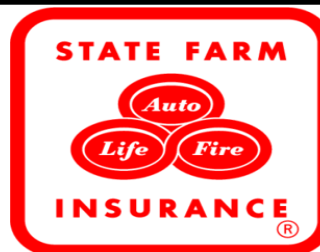

No Appointment Needed At New COVID Vaccination Site In Albany

The state is now providing four new mass vaccination sites for COVID-19 vaccinations, and no appointment is necessary for eligible Georgians at the new Albany site. The new Albany location, administered by the Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency (GEMA/HS), is at Albany's Georgia Forestry Site, 1150 West Oakridge Drive. Eligibility is still limited to state residents who are included in Phase 1A+. This encompasses healthcare workers, residents and staff of long-term care facilities, adults aged 65+ and their caregivers, and first responders (law enforcement, fire personnel including volunteer fire departments, dispatchers and 9-1-1 operators). "In order to increase the number of vaccines distributed, at the Albany site only, we are allowing eligible people to drive up with no appointment necessary," said GEMA Director Chris Stallings. "If you have an appointment you are guaranteed to receive a vaccine as scheduled, but if you don't, we will administer vaccines until we run out of each day's allotment." Other new mass vaccination sites have been opened at the Habersham County Fairgrounds in Clarkesville, at the Macon Farmers Market, and at the Delta Air Lines Museum in Hapeville. As of Tuesday, there have been a total of 1.8 million Georgians vaccinated, says the Ga. Department of Public Health (DPH). In Tift County, a total of 15,312 residents have been vaccinated – 9,345 receiving the first dose and 5,967 getting the second dose. Also, the Veterans Administration's Tifton Outpatient Clinic has begun administering vaccinations of veterans. "We started here in Tifton on Presidents Day and vaccinated 220 veterans, and we will do the second one on March 13 and will do 50 more veterans that day for 270," said Dr. Donna C. Ammons, the clinic manager. The Tifton VA Clinic is under the auspices of the Carl Vinson VA Medical Center in Dublin. Throughout the Vinson Center's regional VA clinics, 6,806 first doses of the vaccine has been given, and 2,385 second doses as of Tuesday, according to VA data.

Bruce Willis Filming New Movie In Tifton



Action film star Bruce Willis is shooting his latest action thriller in Tifton – the star's fourth movie made in South Georgia, says Alexander Kane, co-owner of Fitzgerald-based TMG Studios One. “Film crews are currently filming. One hundred people are in town with the production,” Kane told the Tifton Grapevine. It is being filmed in downtown Tifton and in Fitzgerald. “We will be spending hundreds of thousands of dollars in Tift and Ben Hill counties,” said Kane, a producer and actor. “I only shoot here and bring the films to Fitzgerald because I love my hometown.” In Tifton, the movie is reportedly

being filmed on Commerce Way in the area where food trucks were set up for a downtown event in December. The movie is also expected to use the former Hawk-Eye BBQ restaurant's downtown location. No details about the title or subject matter has been released about the current film. Earlier this month, Bruce Willis wrapped up filming "Reactor" in Fitzgerald and the Cordele area. Regarding Willis' other movies shot in South Georgia, Kane said, “'Breach' and 'American Siege' were filmed 100 percent in Fitzgerald. 'Reactor' was at Lake Blackshear.” Kane declined to say if Willis is in Tifton at the moment. “I can't legally confirm when he is here or where he is until after he leaves.” During his past visits to the area, Willis has been spotted dining at Fresco Italiano on Tift Avenue. “We've shot over \$13 million dollars' worth of films in the area since Nov. 1, 2020 – \$25 million since November 2018,” Kane said. He said that his team has at least six more productions on the books for this year. “I deeply care for Fitzgerald and South Georgia,” said Kane, a Fitzgerald native. “I want to create jobs and opportunities.” A different film crew was in Tifton during late 2019 shooting "The Tiger Rising" starring Queen Latifah and Dennis Quaid. That movie was filmed at Tifton's Town Terrace "Pink Motel" and in Thomasville. Its release date has not yet been set. 2021 COAG Scholarship Now Open

Three scholarships available, each for \$500 from the Constitutional Officers Association of Georgia. The COAG Scholarship is open to any Georgia high school senior (or a GED equivalency dated December 31, 2020 to May 31, 2021) who is a United States and Georgia citizen graduating by the spring of 2021. You must be seeking an undergraduate degree, not a diploma, certification, master's or doctoral degree. The criteria for the award include:

- presenting a letter of acceptance or letter of enrollment from a school of accredited higher education located within Georgia (four-year college, junior college or technical college);
- providing proof of residency in the State of Georgia (GA Driver's License or GA ID Card);
- submitting a 1,000-word essay; and presenting a COAG scholarship application (may be downloaded from 2021 www.coagonline.org).

The 1,000-word essay MUST be typed or computer generated, double-spaced, Times New Roman 12 point font, on 8 ½ x 11 unlined white paper and in the English language. Handwritten essays or those in any other format will be disqualified. The essay must have a title page. The essay cannot contain any reference to the city, town or county where the applicant resides or any reference to the high school attended by the applicant or the applicant's name. You may reference an office, but names of elected officials or county must not be used. Any such reference will disqualify the applicant. All essays must be original, factually accurate and must not infringe upon any material protected by copyright. Failure to meet all of the above-mentioned requirements will disqualify the applicant.

Essay Theme 2021: Every county in the State of Georgia has elected government officials known as "constitutional officers." County constitutional officers include the clerk of the superior court, judge of probate court, sheriff, and tax commissioner. County constitutional officers are elected for four-year terms and have such powers and duties as provided by general law. Interview and describe things that the county constitutional officers do on a daily basis, why they ran for office, and other questions you would like to find out information for your essay. Also do research and include who the last three people who held that office and how long they were in office prior to the current person. Interview your Clerk of Superior Court, Probate Judge, Sheriff, or Tax Commissioner. Call their office and schedule a phone interview or virtual appointment regarding the COAG Scholarship Essay. Due to COVID-19, we are asking that these interviews be done over the phone or virtually. All entries will be reviewed by the Constitutional Officers Association of Georgia, Inc. (COAG) Scholarship Committee. The committee members will select the scholarship recipients based on the content of the essay. All essays become the property of COAG. Winners names may be released to the public and news media for promotional purposes. The scholarship will be announced April 20, 2021 and will be payable to the individual winners in-person. Your completed application, residency documentation, acceptance letter, title page, and essay should be EMAILED to coagdirector@gmail.com no later than midnight on March 15, 2021 in ONE EMAIL, not several separate emails. Submissions must be sent directly to coagdirector@gmail.com not through a local constitutional officer. To be entered into the scholarship contest, the subject line of the email MUST say: "2021 COAG SCHOLARSHIP SUBMISSION". All applications must be received by email at coagdirector@gmail.com no later than midnight on March 15, 2021 or they will be deemed ineligible. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. The packet that you are to submit should include the following items:

1) Scholarship Application Form - 1 original

2) Title Page - 1 original

3) 1,000 Word Essay - 1 original

4) Proof of acceptance from a school of accredited higher education located within Georgia (four-year college, junior college or technical college) - 1 copy

5) Proof of Georgia residency (photocopy of GA Driver's License or state issued identification card) - 1 copy

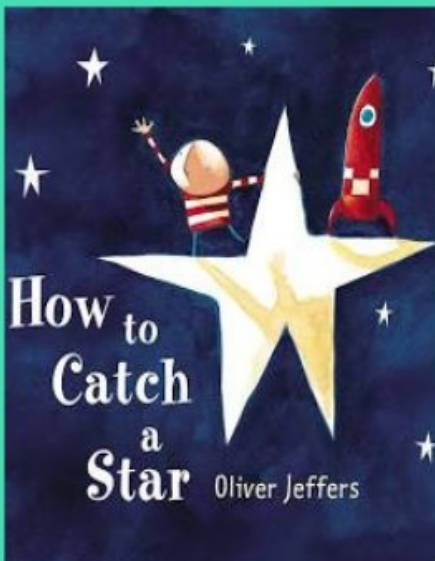
