Atlanta Braves World Series Trophy Making Stop In Tifton



The Atlanta Braves World Champions Trophy Tour is making a stop in Tifton on Thursday, July 21. At 4 p.m. that day, the 2021 World Series Trophy will be on display at the Tift County Recreation Department on Victory Drive and available for fans to take photos with it. Tifton is one of 151 stops for the World Series Major League Baseball Trophy that the Braves won last fall, defeating the Houston Astros. The trophy tour, sponsored by Truist Bank, includes stops in "Braves Country" – locations in Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee, Mississippi, South Carolina, and North Carolina. The number of stops commemorates 151 years of Braves baseball; the franchise was founded in Boston, Mass., in 1871, as the Boston Red Stockings (not to be confused with the current Boston Red Sox). The baseball franchise underwent several names in its history, including the Boston Beaneaters, Boston Doves, Boston Rustlers, Boston Bees, Boston Braves, Milwaukee Braves, and then moving to Atlanta in 1966 as the Atlanta Braves. It is the longest, continuously operating franchise in Major League Baseball. The trophy tour began


in Atlanta on Feb. 15. It will include stops at St. Simons Island on July 13, Valdosta on July 16, and Thomasville on July 23. "We felt the tremendous support of 'Braves Country' throughout the season and particularly in the postseason, and we are taking this championship on the road to fans across the Southeast so that they can share in the joy and celebration of this historic victory," said Derek Schiller, Atlanta Braves president & CEO.





This is the slogan the American Cancer Society uses as part of its campaign for skin cancer prevention. This slogan highlights the top four ways to prevent skin damage from the sun. Slip on a shirt, slop on sunscreen, slap on a hat, and wrap on sunglasses to protect your eyes and sensitive skin around them. The society uses this simple message to promote prevention through media and educational activities. Slip on a shirt! Tightly woven long sleeves and long pants are really the best type of protective clothing to wear when you are going to be in the sun for long hours. However, most of us either choose not to wear or would be uncomfortable in such garb on the beach, by the lake, or anywhere outside on a mid summer's day. The CDC says a t-shirt or beach cover up will suffice, but just know that your run of the mill tee has an SPF rating lower than 15 so be sure to combine this preventative with others as well. Slop on sunscreen! Don't be shy, slather and slop on a highquality sunscreen with at least SPF 15 before you go out into the sun. Sunscreen should even be used on cloudy or overcast days. Be sure to cover your entire body, not just your face, and even parts covered with clothing or bathing suits. While this seems like an obvious tip, the CDC reports that fewer than 15% of men and fewer than 30% of women report regularly using sunscreen when outside for more than an hour. If you're worried about the nasty chemicals and additives some sunscreen brands contain, check out the EWG's 2016 Guide to Sunscreens (@ewg) list for the best and safest sunscreens on the market. Slap on a hat! The best advice here is to choose a tightly woven fabric, such as canvas, for your hat, with a brim that goes all the way around to protect not only your face, but your ears and back of your neck as well. Once again not the most practical, or for that matter stylish, tip when gallivanting on the beach. If you choose fashion over prevention with a cute straw number or a hip ball cap, be sure to make up for your poor decision by either covering the exposed areas with more clothing and/or sunscreen or by relaxing under a nice tree or fancy umbrella in the shade. Wrap on sunglasses to protect your eyes and sensitive skin around them! Finally, a tip that most of us don't have to worry about because we do it regardless of safety. Wear shades! While this may seem completely straightforward, there are some requirements from the CDC on the type of glasses you wear but fortunately they are easy to meet and don't get in the way of vanity. The CDC suggests sunglasses that block both UVA and UVB rays for the best protection and once again, jackpot, most sunglasses sold in the United States meet this requirement! Even better, for your sporty types, wraparound sunglasses provide the best protection because the harmful rays can't sneak in the sides. So, whether you're the Jackie O. type or Bono, rock those shades and protect yourself! In addition to the prevention tips above, the ACS also recommends limiting the amount of time you spend in direct sun, especially between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. when the sun's rays are the strongest. And finally, most skin cancers can be found early on with regular skin exams. It is important to check your skin once a month and you can find out the best way to do this by following the ACS's step-by-step instructions. It is also important for your doctor to check your skin for irregularities. Regular skin exams are especially important for people who are at higher risk of skin cancer, such as people with reduced immunity, people who have had skin cancer before, and people with a strong family history of skin cancer.

Always Have Your Sunglasses

Most people know the sun's rays are bad for our skin. But did you know they're just as bad for our eyes? Sunglasses are a great fashion accessory, but their most important job is to protect your eyes from the sun's ultraviolet (UV) rays. Some of the sun's effects on the eyes include: Cataracts, a clouding of the eye's lens that can blur vision. An estimated 20% of cases are caused by extended UV exposure. Macular degeneration, resulting from damage to the retina that destroys central vision. Macular degeneration is the leading cause of blindness in the United States. Pterygium, a tissue growth over the white part of the surface of the eye that can alter the curve of the eyeball, causing astigmatism. When purchasing sunglasses, look for ones that block out 99 to 100% of both UVA and UVB radiation, so you can keep your vision sharp and eyes healthy. A wide-brimmed hat offers great protection, too!



Called To Care Helping Recruit Local Foster Families



Sara Ramsey, co-chapter director of Called to Care, told the Tifton Rotary Club on Wednesday that the organization has six areas of focus, one of which is helping to recruit foster families. An informational event will be held at 7 p.m. June 22, at the Red Door building on Central Avenue, behind First Baptist Church. Anyone interested in learning more about foster care may attend. "We will share information about all the types of foster care, including respite care, which is babysitting for children in foster care," according to a flyer Ramsey shared. "No pressure, no paperwork, just local agencies and local foster families sharing and answering questions." Representatives from Camp Rock of Georgia, Called to Care Inc., and Coastal Plain CASA will be present. Called to Care was founded in 2013 by Laura Maxwell and serves 22 counties in South Georgia. Ramsey represents Tift and Turner counties, which currently have 85 to 95 children in foster care. She said the mission is to support children, families, and workers by ministering through adoption, foster care, and missions. "Our vision is for every child to be in a Christcentered, loving home," she said, based on the scripture

of James 1:27, "...to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world." The six areas of Called to Care's focus are: foster care support, adoption support, mission support, youth support, trauma-informed education, and case manager support. Ramsey said the organization provides journey bags for children in the foster care system to carry with them to their foster homes. The bags contain seven outfits plus pajamas and ageappropriate toiletries. Anyone with clothing, beds, or bedding to donate may call or email 229-392-5293 or director@iamcalledtocare.com.
