

What A Super Day Superman Day Is



Superman Day - July 3, 1940. In April of 1939 the New York World's Fair, "Building The World of Tomorrow," opened on what was once a marshy wasteland in Flushing Meadows, just east of the great metropolis. From its inception to its closing ceremonies, the Fair promoted one of the last great metanarratives of the Machine Age: the unqualified belief in science and technology as a means to economic prosperity and personal freedom. Wedged between the greatest economic disaster in America and the growing international tension that would result in World War II, The World of Tomorrow was a much-needed antidote to the depression and confusion of the times. It provided the one saving grace which all of America needed - it provided hope. To go along with the theme of "The World of Tomorrow", DC Comics hosted Superman Day at the fair, featuring the first public appearance of "The Man of Tomorrow", Superman (Ray Middleton) in full costume and a live Superman radio broadcast from the fairgrounds. In this very first Superman costume, the name "SUPERMAN" is inscribed in the top part

of Superman's chest emblem and Superman's boots are the original lace style. Superman Day was the brainchild of publicist Allen 'Duke' Ducovny, held in part to promote the sales of DC's New York World's Fair Comics, a 100-page special edition sold exclusively at the World's Fair.



Leave Fireworks to the Experts



Summer is synonymous with barbecues, parades and fireworks. The National Safety Council advises everyone to enjoy fireworks at public displays conducted by professionals, and not to use any fireworks at home. They may be legal but they are not safe. In 2017, eight people died and over 12,000 were injured badly enough to require medical treatment after fireworks-related incidents. Of these, 50% of the injuries were to children and young adults under age 20. Over two-thirds (67%) of inju-

ries took place from June 16 to July 16. And while the majority of these incidents were due to amateurs attempting to use professional-grade, homemade or other illegal fireworks or explosives, an estimated 1,200 injuries were from less powerful devices like small firecrackers and sparklers. Additionally, fireworks start an average of 18,500 fires each year, including 1,300 structure fires, 300 vehicle fires and nearly 17,000 other fires.

If consumer fireworks are legal to buy where you live and you choose to use them, be sure to follow the following safety tips:

- Never allow young children to handle fireworks
- Older children should use them only under close adult supervision
 - Never use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol
- Anyone using fireworks or standing nearby should wear protective eyewear
 - Never hold lighted fireworks in your hands
 - Never light them indoors
 - Only use them away from people, houses and flammable material
 - Never point or throw fireworks at another person
- Only light one device at a time and maintain a safe distance after lighting
 - Never ignite devices in a container
 - Do not try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks
- Soak both spent and unused fireworks in water for a few hours before discarding
- Keep a bucket of water nearby to fully extinguish fireworks that don't go off or in case of fire
 - Never use illegal fireworks

Better yet, grab a blanket and a patch of lawn, kick back and let the experts handle the fireworks show.

Every year, young children can be found along parade routes and at festivals with sparklers in hand, but sparklers are a lot more dangerous than most people think. Sparklers burn at about 2,000 degrees – hot enough to melt some metals. Sparklers can quickly ignite clothing, and children have received severe burns from dropping sparklers on their feet. According to the National Fire Protection Association, sparklers alone account for more than 25% of emergency room visits for fireworks injuries. For children under 5 years of age, sparklers accounted for nearly half of the total estimated injuries. Consider using safer alternatives, such as glow sticks, confetti poppers or colored streamers.

Southwell Reinstates Masks As Covid Cases Rise



As the COVID-19 testing positivity rate triples in Tift County during the past month, and cases rise across Georgia, Southwell healthcare system is reinstating a mask requirement after loosening those requirements one month ago. In a statement effective last Friday, Southwell said: "Due to rising COVID-19 transmission rates within the community, all employees, patients, and visitors will be required to wear a mask while in a Southwell facility as of 6/17/22. Thank you for your understanding and support." The facilities

include Tift Regional Medical Center. Effective May 16, Southwell had removed the mask requirement for patients and visitors, with the exception of the Dialysis Center, Hospice of Tift Area, the Anita Stewart Oncology Center, and Southwell Health and Rehabilitation. Masks were optional in public areas, such as hallways and nursing stations. At that time, Southwell Chief Operating Officer Alex Le had warned that "we will continue to monitor CDC guidelines and case rates, and may reinstate additional safety measures should we experience another significant surge." A month ago, Tift County's COVID-19 testing positivity rate was 4%. It now is more than three times higher at 12.3%, according to the Ga. Department of Public Health (DPH). Statewide, cases have increased by about 20% within the past week, and hospitalizations are also up about 17%. Still, the rates are far below previous pandemic levels. Health officials point to vaccinations and booster shots for the relatively low levels. But as COVID-19 cases rise in Georgia, officials say the numbers are likely much higher because at-home testing results are not usually reported to the health department. County health departments across the state now have free athome testing kits available, and the federal government has announced a third round of free COVID-19 test kits, providing another eight tests per household. Those tests may be ordered at covid.gov/tests.

Former Tiftonite John Berry To Bring Annual Christmas Tour To Tift Theatre



Country music Grammy Awardwinner John Berry, a former Tifton resident, has announced dates for his 26th Annual Nationwide Christmas Tour, which will end in Tifton on Dec. 20. "Twentysix years – I could not have imagined that I would be so blessed to have this opportunity to share my music, celebrating the birth of Christ all these years," Berry said. "It has meant so much to me to have many of you come time and again with your families and friends to share in the music of the season. I look

forward to singing for all of you that have been with me before, as well as those that will be joining us for the first time." Berry is well known for his seasonal, fan-favorite holiday performances, which are filled with traditional Christmas songs, many of his most requested hit songs, and a few of his childhood stories. The Christmas tour begins Nov. 25 in Sugar Hill, Ga., then moves to North Carolina, West Virginia, Indiana, Ohio, South Carolina, and Alabama, returning to Georgia with performances in Cedartown, Athens, Macon, Augusta, and Tifton. A decade ago, Berry lived for a time in Tifton before moving to Tennessee. In 2019, he was diagnosed with throat cancer, requiring a combined 35 treatments of radiation and chemotherapy. Berry has had 20 singles on the country hit parade charts, six of which went Top 5 as well as a No. 1 on the Billboard and Radio & Records country charts. He has earned numerous Gold and Platinum records. Berry's co-written "A Mind Of Her Own" and "Kiss Me In The Car" introduced him to radio audiences in 1993. "Your Love Amazes Me," "What's In It For Me," and "You And Only You" thrust him to stardom in 1994. "Standing On The Edge Of Goodbye," "I Think About It All The Time," and "If I Had Any Pride Left At All" were all major hits the following year. "Your Love Amazes Me" earned Berry a 1995 Grammy nomination. In 1996, he scored a Grammy win for his participation in "Amazing Grace: A Country Salute to Gospel." Berry took "Change My Mind" into the country music Top 5 in 1996, and "She's Taken A Shine" became an even bigger hit in 1997. He was nominated for CMA Vocal Event of the Year for "Long Haired Country Boy" with Charlie Daniels and Hal Ketchum.




