

### Tech Things To Think About When Preparing For Hurricane Season

It's great to be prepared at any time but Josh Beckstrom, The Sylvester Computer Guy wants you to be prepared for Hurricane Season. Below is a helpful list on how to get prepared. I share this every year around this time because this is great information to keep us all on the right track.

1) Now is the time to charge up all your electronic devices! Charging can take a long time if your device is low battery already. So grab your smartphones, smartwatches, laptops, tablet, and other rechargeable device you have that can provide light, communication, or entertainment during an extended power outage and get them charged to 100%. Don't forget to check the charge status of your Uninterruptable Power Supplies (aka UPS or Battery Backups) as they can store a lot of power.

2) Keep charging your devices until the power goes out. You never know when an extra 1% could have made the difference, so keep those devices tethered to the wall unless absolutely necessary.

3) Turn your brightness to minimum to get much more use out of your batteries. On a laptop this can mean an extra hour or more before the battery runs out versus using the standard or maximum brightness levels we typically use.

4) Turn your smartphones to 'Low power' mode if it has it (iPhones definitely do), it will keep things like GPS and data operating only when in active use which will make the battery work even longer.

5) Use one device to charge another when needed. If you start running out of power on your smartphone or other important device, charge it from another device. This goes without saying with the UPS or battery backups, but don't forget that you can charge from your laptop as well as any other device where you have a cable to connect it to your primary device.

6) You car is a generator! This won't work for large appliances due to the current load, but you can totally use your car as a way to charge your tech devices once all other backup power sources have exhausted. Just remember that gas becomes a commodity too, so use sparingly (and probably just to keep the phones charged)

7) If you have satellite internet like Exede, remember that as long as you get power to your modem and router you'll be able to use the internet! This is because unlike land-based internet services, the service is not dependent on the local electrical grid like your house is, so all you need is the modem and router to power up and you'll re-establish your service connection to the satellite provider.

8) If it's not important, unplug it now. You don't want things that can't help you sapping up your power. Even when off, most device still use a little bit of power to keep lights blinking or things running in the background for when you turn them back on, so unplug them so you don't forget when the time comes. And although it is possible to run a satellite television service and power your tv through a battery backup, we don't recommend it because of how much power a television will use. Stick to internet sources for information and keep the tvs off (unless you are using a generator of course).

We hope these tips won't be needed, but if they are we hope it will give you a little extra peace of mind to know you've crossed these items off your preparedness list. After the storm is over, if any of your items are having any trouble, please visit The Sylvester Computer Guy and he will see what he can do to help.

### Tift Ranks 2nd In GA's Most Equitable School Districts Lowndes County Ranks No. 1, According To Report



Tift County ranks 82nd out of 179 Georgia school districts in distributing school funding fairly, according to a national report released Tuesday. The report "Most and Least Equitable School Districts in Georgia" by WalletHub, a financial services website, used data from the U.S. Census Bureau and the National Center for Education Statistics. "Georgia has the 19th most equitable school districts in the U.S. overall, but some districts within the state are fairer than others," WalletHub said. To find out where school funding is distributed most equitably, WalletHub scored 179 districts in Georgia based on two metrics: Average household income and expenditures for public elementary and secondary schools per pupil. According to its data, the Tift County School District spends \$11,075 per pupil and the school district's average household income is \$44,827. In Georgia, the Lowndes County School District ranked No. 1 in equitable funding, according to the report, with an expenditure of \$9,931 per student in a dis-

trict with average household income of \$58,623. Ranking last in Georgia are Decatur City Schools, spending \$13,744 per pupil in a school district whose average household income is \$114,615, the report said. "While the U.S. is one of the most educated countries in the world, it doesn't provide the same quality elementary school or secondary school education to all students. In many states, more affluent school districts receive a greater amount of funding per student than poorer districts, with one estimate claiming that low-income districts are underfunded by around \$6,700 per pupil," WalletHub said in a release. "Discrepancies between the rich and poor have been exacerbated even more due to the lasting impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Low-income students have suffered the greatest 'learning loss' due to partial or total remote learning. One contributing factor is that people in low-income districts are less likely to have the technological resources they need," WalletHub said. In other Tiftarea counties, the rankings are: Worth, 63rd in the state; Irwin, 67th; Turner, 84th; Cook, 133rd; Berrien, 137th; and Ben Hill, 149th.



### Georgia's Job Numbers Reach an All-Time High in July

August 18, 2022 Atlanta, GA - Job numbers increased more than 12,000 from June to July to an alltime high and were up almost five percent over the year. Job gains included opportunities in Accommodation and Food Services, 4,100, Health Care and Social Assistance, 2,400, Retail Trade, 2,000, Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services, 1,500, Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation, 1,400, Wholesale Trade, 1,100, and Finance and Insurance, 1,000. "Georgia's jobs numbers continue to climb reinforcing the state's position as one of the nation's best places to find employment," said Georgia Labor Commissioner Mark Butler. "These all-time highs in multiple sectors demonstrate the employment opportunities the state is experiencing across the board." Job numbers were at an all-time high in Trade and Transportation, 1,019,500, including the Retail Trade sector, 520,600, Transportation and Warehousing sector, 271,400, and Wholesale Trade sector, 227,500, in Financial Activities, 271,000, in the Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services sector, 321,700, and in Education and Health Services, 631,100, including the Health Care and Social Assistance sector, 531,700. The sectors with the most over-the-year job gains included Accommodation and Food Services, 32,400, Administrative and Support Services, 22,000, Retail Trade, 21,300, Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services, 20,800, Health Care and Social Assistance, 20,400, Transportation and Warehousing, 18,800, and Wholesale Trade, 14,900. Commissioner Butler announced today that Georgia's July unemployment rate hit an all-time low of 2.8 percent while Georgia's number of jobs continued to climb to 4,812,100. Jobs were up 12,500 over the month and up 214,300 from this time last year. Georgia's unemployment rate was seven-tenths of a percent lower than the national July 2022 unemployment rate of 3.5 percent. The state saw a new all-time high number of employed Georgians of 5,135,374, up 823 in July. The labor force was down 3,891 to 5,285,565, the first drop this year. The number of unemployed was down 4,714 to 150,191, the lowest figure since February 2001's number of 150,107. There are over 217,000 jobs listed online at EmployGeorgia.com, resulting in a minimum of over 285,000 unfilled positions. Market salaries for the jobs listed on Employ Georgia range from \$23,000 to \$104,000, showing a median salary of \$45,000. Employers with over 1,000 job postings included Deloitte, 1,500, Wellstar Health System, 1,300, Walmart, 1,300, Amazon, 1,300, and Home Depot, 1,200. Industries with over 10,000 job postings included Health Care, 33,000, Retail Trade, 19,000, Accommodation and Food Services, 18,000, Manufacturing, 17,000, Professional, Scientific & Technical Services, 16,000, Finance and Insurance, 14,000, and Transportation and Warehousing, 10,000. Initial claims were up 2,885 (11%) from June to 28,545 in July. Over the year initial claims were down 30,266 (52%). Additionally, by visiting Employ Georgia, employers can manage job openings and access the state's talent pool. GDOL's Career Centers are providing in-person employment services by appointment. ### Grandparents Day is Approaching

For many years we have celebrated Grandparents Day but did you know the history behind the celebration. In 1969, nine-year-old Russell Capper sent President Nixon a letter suggesting that a day should be set aside in order to celebrate grandparents. On June 12, 1969, he received a letter back from Rose Mary Woods — Personal Secretary to the President — reading, "Dear Russell, Thank you for your letter to President Nixon. Your suggestion regarding a Grandparent's Day is appreciated, but the President ordinarily issues proclamations designating periods for special observance only when a Congressional resolution authorizes him to do so. With best wishes, Sincerely, Rose Mary Woods Personal Secretary to the President." Following this letter, Marian McQuade was recognized nationally by the U.S. Senate and by President Jimmy Carter as the founder of National Grandparents Day. McQuade wanted to educate the youth about the importance of seniors and the contributions they have made throughout history. She urged the youth to "adopt" a grandparent and learn more about their lives, challenges, and desires for the future. In 1977, Senator Randolph, with the help of other senators, introduced a joint resolution to the senate requesting the president to "issue annually a proclamation designating the first Sunday of September after Labor Day of each year as 'National Grandparents' Day'." Congress passed the legislation, proclaiming the first Sunday after Labor Day as National Grandparent's Day. On August 3, 1978, Jimmy Carter signed the proclamation, and the day was finally celebrated the following year. Be sure to recognize your grandparents on September 11th by just a simple card, message or phone call to wish them a Happy Grandparents Day and make them feel special. 


