#### **GDOT Proposes Worth County Wooden Bridge Replacement**



Trees shade the wooden Town Creek bridge on a quiet dirt road in Worth County. It's charming, but motorists who drive across the weathered boards might see it differently.

The Melton Road bridge, two miles southwest of Poulan, was built in 1986 and the creosote-soaked timber is decaying, splitting, and cracking. The Georgia Department of Transportation has determined the bridge needs to be replaced.

Before that happens, the Department would like to hear

what the public has to say about the proposed replacement and the detour it would require during construction. 

#### Mural Represents Tifton, Honors 150th Anniversary

A mural in honor of Tifton's 150th anniversary is taking shape downtown on the wall of Fifth Street Interiors on U.S. Highway 82 W. near the railroad tracks. It features artwork representing elements of Tifton, including Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College and the University of Georgia, Tift Theatre and Fulwood Park, and long-time businesses such as the Town Terrace Motel and Coca-Cola. "The tourism staff has been talking for years about wanting to develop at least one mural in the community," said Angela Elder, assistant coordinator of the Tifton-Tift County Tourism Association. "We just think it brings a fun spirit and creates interest." As the 150th anniversary rolled around for Tifton's founding, Elder said the staff started working together with the Plough Art Gallery to contact mural artist Taylor Shaw, a Destin, Fla., native, UGA graduate, and Valdosta State University art instructor. They met and brainstormed ideas. "We wanted this first mural to be representative of our entire community," Elder said. "All cultures, landmarks, people, history, and even the flowers we are known for. While we couldn't put everything in there, we think we've got a great start." Taylor Shaw and Kaleena Stasiak began painting the mural a few days ago. The Tourism Association thanked Mark Shiver and Lamar Boyer at Fifth Street Interiors for allowing the side of their building to be used for the mural, as well as thanked the Downtown Development Authority for its support. "What a grand entrance to Downtown Tifton it creates," Elder said. "Our hope is to keep this momentum going and create additional murals around town that can eventually evolve into some sort of trail for us to advertise to tourists. Public art brings the community together and creates a buzz that makes people want to know more. "We are so excited with how the mural is turning out," Elder said. "It's vibrant, fun and definitely eye-catching. We can't wait to see the finished product!"

#### Lights, Camera, ... Tifton! Lifetime TV Holiday Movie Being Shot In Tifton Will Be Set In Tifton As Well



Spoiler alert! The Christmas-themed Lifetime TV movie being filmed in Tifton right now is actually going to take place in Tifton on screen. The screenplay was originally written using another location as the scene of the story, but now director Brian Herzlinger has decided to change the story's location to Tifton, where the filming is being done. "After seeing all the unique landmarks around town, Brian decided to change the setting to Tifton," said Brent Bailey, the movie's male lead and the author of the original screenplay. Bailey related the news to me Friday night at Tifton's Peach Barn, where he was acting in one of the movie's crucial scenes. In the TV movie, "Abigale Seaver," portrayed by Maria Menounos, is a dating coach on the way to being a published author. In the voiceover of the first scene, she says, "This is my home, Tifton. It's also home to the best book publisher this side of New York City." Setting the stage, the first lines of the movie are: "Tifton, Georgia; it's beautiful." When the movie, "The Holiday Dating Guide," debuts on the Lifetime network during the 2023 holiday season, viewers around the country will discover Tifton. I had the honor of playing a part in the movie's festivities all night – literally – from 7 p.m. Friday to 6 a.m. Saturday. A Christmas party of grand proportions was staged at

the Peach Barn just outside of Tifton. About 40 or 50 extras from Tifton, Albany, Fitzgerald, and Sylvester came to fill the roles of "background" party-goers at the company dinner for "McNeille Books." We were dressed in our finest cocktail attire and were coached to toast each other with fake champagne (sparkling grape juice), to pretend to eat the hors d'oeuvres on gold-rimmed plates, and to enthusiastically wish each other Merry Christmas – all in the background as actors rehearsed and acted out their scenes. About eight extras wore white shirts and black vests to portray servers. They served and took away and served again the glasses and savory appetizers, about 15 or 20 times. A power couple that included Miss Georgia circulated around the tables, along with other friendly "extras," repeatedly and exuberantly greeting those of us seated at the round tables. I overheard one lovely extra wearing high heels exclaim that she had seven blisters on her feet. I told my table that I felt like I was overacting, but first assistant director Josh Friedman of Hollywood told us, "This is your time to shine! Go for it!" At one point in the long evening, around 5 a.m., he sat beside me at our table and called out direction to everyone: "Camera rehearsals up, set rehearsal. Everyone's crossing. Quiet on the set!" The greeters and servers crisscrossed constantly. We learned how lucky were to be the seated guests. A total of three scenes were shot from a variety of angles with the actors - Bailey, Menounos, Steve Vinovich, and others - repeating their lines with the same fervor and enthusiasm a multitude of times. One scene was a key moment in the movie's plot, when "Seaver" learns ... Well, you'll have to watch the movie; no other spoilers here! A light moment in the long evening was when Menounos had everyone lift a mysterious red box and guess how much it weighed. One of the directors called out for her to punch holes in the box in case it contained an animal. It turned out to be the box holding her dress, a bright red number with many sparkling and obviously heavy gems affixed to it. Tifton's Gina Purvis, one of the extras, guessed 16 pounds, which was closest to the actual 18 pounds. Also among the extras was WALB-TV reporter Alicia Lewis and Jennie Bassett of Tifton, who said it was the fourth local film in which she has participated. "This has been a pleasant change of pace for us," said producer Mike Donovan, who with Alexander Kane of Fitzgerald manages Workhorse Cinema. The two, along with directors Herzlinger and Friedman, made the action films "Gasoline Alley" and "White Elephant" with Bruce Willis in Tifton during 2021. Kane said that Valdosta is giving him 100 acres for his movie studio to be located there, close to the airport, so more local movies will be in our future. As for the change of location in the script, Kane said, "It's easier to work with police cars and signage. It all says 'Tifton,' so why not use it? "It's for the promotion of the town's tourism," Kane added. "We try to benefit the local community as much as possible."

#### **Positive Parenting Tips: Infants**

During the first year of life, babies learn to focus their vision, reach out, explore, and learn about the things that are around them. Cognitive development means the learning process of memory, language, thinking, and reasoning. Learning language is more than just making sounds or saying "ma-ma" and "da-da". Listening, understanding, and knowing the names of people and things are all a part of language development. During this stage, babies also are developing bonds of love and trust with their parents and others as part of social and emotional development. The way you cuddle, hold, and play with your baby will set the stage for how he will interact with you and others. Following are some things you, as a parent, can do to help your baby during this time: Talk to your baby. She will find your voice calming. Answer when your baby makes sounds by repeating the sounds and adding words. This will help him learn to use language. Read to your baby. This will help her develop and understand language and sounds. Sing to your baby and play music. This will help your baby develop a love for music and will help his brain development. Praise your baby and give her lots of loving attention. Spend time cuddling and holding your baby. This will help him feel cared for and secure. Play with your baby when she's alert and relaxed. Watch your baby closely for signs of being tired or fussy so that she can take a break from playing. Distract your baby with toys and move him to safe areas when he starts moving and touching things that he shouldn't touch. Take care of yourself physically, mentally, and emotionally. It is easier to enjoy your new baby and be a positive, loving parent when you are feeling good yourself. Parenting can be hard but rewarding work! #### **Protecting Their Eye Sight**

Annual Eye Exams is the best way to make sure your child's eyes are allowing them to do their best in school. August has arrived and that means that many parents are preparing their children for another school year. August has been declared Children's Eye Health and Safety Month by Prevent Blindness America. When 80% of learning occurs through the eyes, healthy vision is essential to a child's success in the classroom. Having a child's vision tested by an eye-care professional can lead to greater success in the classroom because much of a child's learning occurs visually. Studies have shown that some students where learning disabilities have been diagnosed actually have undiagnosed vision problems instead. Although an eye exam is the ideal way for parents to know whether their children have vision problems, there are some signs and behaviors parents can watch for that may indicate a child is struggling with his or her vision. Do you know what your child's eyes look like? Eyes don't line up, one eye may appear to cross or look inwards or outwards, Eyes are red, crusty or swollen, Eyes seem to be red or watery and Eye rubbing can be a sign that your child is having eye problems. How your child acts matter as well. Does your child rub their eyes frequently? Close or cover an eye? Thrust head forward, hold in an unusual position or tilt their head especially when reading or looking at small objects far away? Has any trouble or delays in reading, trouble doing close work, or pulls objects in very close to see? Avoids up close work? Blinks more than usual? Tends to squint or frown? Get headaches? Feel sick or nauseous? Listening to your child is very important too. Does your child ever make comments like My eyes are blurry?, My eyes feel scratchy? My eyes are burning? I can't see very well? Things look double? If you notice these symptoms, make sure you schedule an appointment with an eye care professional. Amblyopia, strabismus, color blindness and refractive errors are the most common conditions that affect children's vision. Eye safety is also another important part of your child's eye health. Each year thousands of kids sustain some form of eye injury. Taking proper precautions such as wearing protective eyewear can prevent about 90% of those injuries. From sports to toys and fireworks, eye injuries can happen any time anywhere. Of course accidents do happen, so if your child does experience an eye injury, make sure they do not rub or touch their eye and seek medical attention from a trusted eye care professional as soon as possible.



#### Peanuts: Senator Reverend Warnock Secures Language Addressing Trade Barriers for Georgia Peanut Farmers in Draft Government Bill

Senator Reverend Warnock, a champion of Georgia agriculture, secured a directive in the Senate's draft government funding bill addressing restrictive international trade barriers for Georgia peanut farmers New language secured by Senator Reverend Warnock directs the federal government to "develop effective and lasting solutions" to open the EU market to Georgia peanuts Removal of existing trade barriers would give a financial boost to Georgia peanut sector, increase international market access, and create job opportunities across the state Georgia is the leading producer of peanuts in the U.S., producing over half the total domestic peanut crop with a recent farmgate value exceeding \$650 million.


WASHINGTON, Aug. 1, 2022 - Today, U.S. Senator Reverend Raphael Warnock (D-GA), a champion of Georgia agriculture, announced he secured a directive in the draft Senate government funding bill directing the federal government to address existing, restrictive trade barriers Georgia peanut farmers are facing when trying to do business with markets in the European Union. "As a senator for the state that leads the U.S. in peanut production, and as chair of the Agriculture subcommittee that deals with trade, I've been in Washington lifting up the stories of the many peanut farmers I've met across Georgia who have told me they need the federal government to take action to reduce restrictive trade barriers. Without a doubt Georgia farmers grow the world's best peanuts, and I'm going to keep working across the aisle to ensure our peanut farmers secure the market access they need to thrive," said Senator Reverend Warnock. Since arriving in the U.S. Senate, Senator Warnock has worked to uplift Georgia's agriculture industry. His first series of visits as a sitting senator was an agriculture tour across southwest Georgia, which included stops with Georgia's peanut farmers and shellers. Senator Warnock then partnered with Senator Tommy Tuberville to send a bipartisan letter, cosigned by 17 of their colleagues, pressing the U.S. Department of Agriculture and U.S. Trade Representative to address persistent trade barriers facing Georgia's peanut farmers from accessing markets in the European Union. Senator Warnock has continued to raise this issue as Chair of the Subcommittee on Commodities, Risk Management, and Trade, most recently when he convened a hearing titled "Agricultural Trade: Priorities and Issues Facing America's Farmers." In this hearing, Senator Warnock underscored the urgency for USDA and USTR action, and well as the need for the Senate to quickly confirm agricultural trade leaders within the administration who will champion these issues. Below is the directive Senator Reverend Warnock secured in the draft Senate government funding bill (page 111):

Peanut Exports—The Committee remains concerned with persistent non-tariff trade barriers faced by the domestic peanut industry when attempting to export peanuts to the European Union. The Committee encourages the Department to prioritize interagency coordination with the Office of the United States Trade Representative and industry engagement in order to develop effective and lasting solutions that will allow increased market access for domestic peanuts into the European Union.


