



### Southwell Has \$895M Economic Impact - Report

Southwell, which includes Tift Regional Medical Center in Tifton and Southwell Medical in Adel, has more than a \$894.9 million impact on the local economy, according to a new report. The report by the Georgia Hospital Association (GHA), the state's largest hospital trade association, noted that Southwell had direct expenditures of more than \$390.8 million in 2019. When combined with an economic multiplier developed by the U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Economic Analysis, the total economic impact of the expenditures was \$894.9 million. The multiplier considers the ripple effect of direct hospital expenditures on other sectors, such as medical supplies, medical equipment and pharmaceuticals. "We are dedicated to providing timely, quality care to our patients and community," said Chris Dorman, Southwell president & CEO. "Over the years, we have grown and expanded to better serve the needs of our community, and we are excited to continue that growth." Tift Regional Medical Center is Tift County's largest employer with 2,675 employees. Southwell Medical in Cook County adds another 246 employees. The GHA report noted that as a supplement to the people directly employed by Southwell, the hospital system's presence in the region creates an additional 6,824 jobs in the area. This includes physician offices, nursing homes, suppliers, home health care and more. "Every community needs a strong, vibrant healthcare system that will attract other industries and businesses to the area in addition to meeting the healthcare needs of its residents," Dorman said. "Preserving access to health care is extremely important, and we are the primary guardian of health in our community."

## SRTC Honors 800+ Graduates At Spring - Summer Commencement



Southern Regional Technical College's (SRTC) commencement Thursday honored more than 800 graduates from the spring and summer semesters at all of SRTC's campuses, including Tifton. More than 250 of the students participated in the ceremony, held at SRTC's Bainbridge campus, during which degrees, diplomas, and certificates were conferred to students who have completed their credit programs or high school equivalency credentials. Many graduates received multiple honors as some programs have embedded certificates that are obtained when completing a program in its entirety. In total, 240 degrees, 169 diplomas, 441 technical certificates of credit, and 44 high school equivalency credentials were presented. Stephanie Butler, a certified veterinary technician and SRTC alumnus, delivered the commencement address. She is an adjunct instructor for the SRTC veterinary technology program and manages a clinic in Cairo. The technical college's fall semester begins Aug. 17.

## Protecting Their Eye Sight

Although an eye exam is the ideal way for parents to know whether their children have vision problems, there are some signs and behaviors parents can watch for that may indicate a child is struggling with his or her vision. Do you know what your child's eyes look like? Eyes don't line up, one eye may appear to cross or look inwards or outwards, Eyes are red, crusty or swollen, Eyes seem to be red or watery and Eye rubbing can be a sign that your child is having eye problems. How your child acts matter as well. Does your child rub their eyes frequently? Close or cover an eye? Thrust head forward, hold in an unusual position or tilt their head especially when reading or looking at small objects far away? Has any trouble or delays in reading, trouble doing close work, or pulls objects in very close to see? Avoids up close work? Blinks more than usual? Tends to squint or frown? Get headaches? Feel sick or nauseous? Listening to your child is very important too. Does your child ever make comments like My eyes are blurry?, My eyes feel scratchy? My eyes are burning? I can't see very well? Things look double? If you notice these symptoms, make sure you schedule an appointment with an eye care professional. Amblyopia, strabismus, color blindness and refractive errors are the most common conditions that affect children's vision. Eye safety is also another important part of your child's eye health. Each year thousands of kids sustain some form of eye injury. Taking proper precautions such as wearing protective eyewear can prevent about 90% of those injuries. From sports to toys and fireworks, eye injuries can happen any time anywhere. Of course accidents do happen, so if your child does experience an eye injury, make sure they do not rub or touch their eye and seek medical attention from a trusted eye care professional as soon as possible.





The way you cuddle, hold, and play with your baby will set the stage for how he will interact with you and others. Following are some things you, as a parent, can do to help your baby during this time: Talk to your baby. She will find your voice calming. Answer when your baby makes sounds by repeating the sounds and adding words. This will help him learn to use language. Read to your baby. This will help her develop and understand language and sounds. Sing to your baby and play music. This will help your baby develop a love for music and will help his brain development. Praise your baby and give her lots of loving attention. Spend time cuddling and holding your baby. This will help him feel cared for and secure. Play with your baby when she's alert and relaxed. Watch your baby closely for signs of being tired or fussy so that she can take a break from playing. Distract your baby with toys and move him to safe areas when he starts moving and touching things that he shouldn't touch. Take care of yourself physically, mentally, and emotionally. It is easier to enjoy your new baby and be a positive, loving parent when you are feeling good yourself. Parenting can be hard but rewarding work! 

## GDOL Processes More Than 5 Million Regular UI Claims

AUGUST 05, 2021 Atlanta, GA – Please see below weekly UI claims information for week ending date 7/31/2021. Since week ending March 21, 2020, 5,011,446 regular UI initial claims have been processed, breaking the 5 million plateau, and totaling more than the ten years prior to the pandemic combined (4.8 million). Last week, regular UI initial claims totaled 13,406, up 1,421 over the week. Initial claims are defined as any notice of unemployment filed to request a determination of entitlement to or eligibility of unemployment insurance compensation OR to begin a second or subsequent period of eligibility within a benefit year. Initial claims numbers are not a direct correlation to layoffs. The GDOL has paid almost \$23 billion in state and federal benefits in the past seventy-two weeks. Last week, the GDOL issued almost \$24 million in benefits, which included regular unemployment and federally funded Lost Wages Assistance (LWA) supplements, Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC), Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA), Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC), and State Extended Benefits.
