The True Death, Burial, and Resurrection of Christ

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The False Teaching About Firstfruits

First-fruits (Reishit)

Offerings are given for the spring barley harvest.

Date observed: 15 Nisan (1st Month).

On *Reishit* (Re-SHEET) people offered the first ripe sheaf, the firstfruits of barley, to the Lord as an act of dedicating the harvest to Him. On the first day of unleavened bread, the priest waved the sheaf before the Lord.

Leviticus 23:9-14 (KJV)

And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

10 Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, When ye be come into the land which I give unto you, and shall reap the harvest thereof, then ye shall bring a sheaf of the firstfruits of your harvest unto the priest:

11 And he shall wave the sheaf before the LORD, to be accepted for you: on the morrow after the sabbath the priest shall wave it.

12 And ye shall offer that day when ye wave the sheaf an he lamb without blemish of the first year for a burnt offering unto the LORD.

13 And the meat offering thereof shall be two tenth deals of fine flour mingled with oil, an offering made by fire unto the LORD for a sweet savour, and the drink offering thereof shall be of wine, the fourth part of an hin.

14 And ye shall eat neither bread, nor parched corn, nor green ears, until the selfsame day that ye have brought an offering unto your God. It shall be a statute for ever throughout your generations in all your dwellings.

Google says that the Jewish people rarely celebrate *Reishit* today, but that it holds great significance for followers of Christ (יהושע יהושע Hamashiach) because they claim it is the most important day of the year, the day of His resurrection.

There is a false teaching about firstfruits. Many who keep the Sabbath and the holydays believe and teach that firstfruits is a picture of Christ's resurrection. They say and teach a heartwarming story that Christ became the "firstfruits" by being the first to be resurrected from the dead, a supposed fulfillment of the Old Testament Feast of Firstfruits and its symbolic sheaf offering. They claim that just as the first sheaf of barley was offered to God, signifying the beginning of the harvest, Christ's resurrection symbolizes the beginning of the spiritual harvest of God's people.

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However, that claim collapses immediately when tested by Scripture. Christ was not the first person to be resurrected from the dead. The prophets and Christ Himself raised others long before His own resurrection.

- Elijah raised the widow's son (1 Kings 17:22).
- Elisha raised the Shunammite's son (2 Kings 4:35).
- A man revived after touching Elisha's bones (2 Kings 13:21).
- Christ raised Jairus' daughter (Mark 5:41-42).
- He raised the widow's son at Nain (Luke 7:14-15).
- He raised Lazarus after four days in the tomb (John 11:43-44).

All these came back to life before His death and resurrection. So even by the plain definition, He was not the first person resurrected. The "firstfruits" language in 1 Corinthians 15:20 refers to the first resurrection unto immortality, not the first to rise in history. Every person raised before Him eventually died again, but His resurrection was the first that conquered death permanently. That is what makes Him "the firstfruits of them that slept," not the first human being to ever rise.

What the Bible Actually Shows

1. The Feast of Firstfruits is about grain, not resurrection.

The passage above defines Firstfruits as an offering from the field. The ritual concerns barley, land, and harvest. No death, burial, or new life imagery appears. The purpose is dedicating the crop to God before it is eaten. Nothing in the text connects the ritual to the Messiah or to resurrection.

2. The timing disproves the "Firstfruits Resurrection" claim.

According to the Law:

- 14 Nisan: Passover
- 15 Nisan: First Day of Unleavened Bread (sometimes also called Firstfruits)

If Christ rose on Firstfruits, that would place His resurrection the day after Passover. That means His crucifixion would have to occur two days before Passover, which contradicts Scripture. The Gospels clearly state that He ate the Passover meal with His disciples on the first day of Unleavened Bread (Matthew 26:17-19, Mark 14:12-18, Luke 22:7-15).

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The disciples prepared and ate the Passover before His arrest, proving He was crucified during the Passover week, not before it. The “Firstfruits resurrection” timeline does not fit the biblical record

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3. The resurrection fulfilled Christ’s own prophecy, not a Levitical feast.

Matthew 12:40

“For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the whale’s belly, so shall the Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.”

Mark 9:31

“After that He is killed, He shall rise the third day.”

The Word ties His resurrection to three days and three nights, not to the morrow after the Sabbath. The fulfillment was in the timing He gave, not in a festival shadow.

4. Paul’s statement in 1 Corinthians 15:20 is symbolic.

When Paul called Christ the “firstfruits of them that slept,” he was identifying sequence, not a feast. Christ was the first to rise from the dead to eternal life, guaranteeing that others who belong to Him will also rise later. The word “firstfruits” expresses order, not ritual. No apostle ever said His resurrection fulfilled the Feast of Firstfruits.

The Truth

The Feast of Firstfruits was an agricultural dedication, not a prophetic picture of resurrection. Christ rose exactly as He said He would, after three days and three nights, and not because of a Levitical feast.

To claim that His resurrection fulfilled Firstfruits requires twisting the calendar, ignoring direct verses, and forcing a symbolic meaning that God never declared. The resurrection stands on the power of His Word, not on the traditions or emotional stories of men.

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Exposing the Contradiction

Now that we understand what the Feast of Firstfruits truly represents and that Christ's resurrection had nothing to do with it, let's examine the deeper problem with the modern claim. If we follow what the world teaches about the "Firstfruits resurrection," the timing in Scripture completely falls apart. Their version cannot be reconciled with the Hebrew calendar or with the Gospel accounts. The more closely you look, the more impossible their story becomes.

There's a huge problem with this teaching, because according to the God's word; the 14th of Nisan is Passover, the 15th of Nisan is the first day of the feast of unleavened bread and also the day of first fruits.

If this was true then that means that "Christ" (יהוֹשֻׁעַ Jehoshua Hamashiach) should have been crucified at least by the 13th of Nisan, On which is the day before Passover.

So, their calendar, if you count a 3 night-death would look like this:

But the biggest problem with this belief, Is that the gospel tells us that the disciples we're getting ready the place where they were going to eat the Passover meal with "Christ" (יהוֹשֻׁעַ Jehoshua Hamashiach) on the first day of the feast of unleavened bread!

Matthew 26:17-19 (KJV) Now the first day of the feast of unleavened bread the disciples came to "Christ" (יהוֹשֻׁעַ Jehoshua Hamashiach), saying unto him, Where wilt thou that we prepare for thee to eat the Passover? **18** And he said, Go into the city to such a man, and say unto him, The Master saith, My time is at hand; I will keep the Passover at thy house with my disciples. **19** And

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the disciples did as “Christ” (יהושע Jehoshua Hamashiach) had appointed them; and they made ready the Passover.

And later it tells us that He ate the Passover with His disciples!

Mark 14:17-18 (KJV) And in the evening, He cometh with the twelve. **18** And as **they sat and did eat**, “Christ” (יהושע Jehoshua Hamashiach) said, Verily I say unto you, One of you which eateth with me shall betray me. Also, in **Luke 22:14-15, Luke 22:17-21**

To understand this “Passover meal” we need to ask, how many days is Passover?

So, the answer is that in Israel and for most Reform Jews around the world, **Pesach is seven days**, but for many other Jews (including the ones who seem to print most calendars), it is eight days.

Ezekiel 45:21 (KJV) In the first month, in the fourteenth day of the month, ye shall have the Passover, **a feast of seven days**; unleavened bread shall be eaten.

Another big issue we have to note is that nowhere in scripture does it say that “Christ” (יהושע Jehoshua Hamashiach) resurrected on the day of first fruits or that He even had to die on the day of Passover before eating the lamb, just because He was to become the sacrificed lamb!

So, if we really take what the bible says and put it in their calendar, then the calendar should look something like this:

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And if we continue reading the verse we will even get more information for the calendar.

Matthew 26:20 (KJV) Now when the even was come, he sat down with the twelve. 21 And as they did eat, he said, Verily I say unto you, that one of you shall betray me. 22 And they were exceeding sorrowful, and began every one of them to say unto him, Lord, is it I? Continue with the story.

Now the calendar will look something like this:

But if we combine the biblical truth and the story of “Christ” and the story we are given by the world for the resurrection on the day of first fruit, then the calendar will look like this,

More of a time loop discrepancy here. NOT that God can't make this happen, but really? The numbers and days do not biblically add up!

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So, if you take their distortions of the truth and blend them with the Gospel, the resulting story will sound something like this:

“Christ” (יהושע Jehoshua Hamashiach) was crucified and buried on the 13th of Nissan - 2 days before the Passover. Then, “two days later” on the 15th, which is the first day of Unleavened Bread, He supposedly rose from the tomb, appeared to His disciples, and told them to prepare the Passover meal so He could eat with them. After that, He supposedly went back into the tomb just so He could reappear the next day to show them He had risen. Then, on the very same day He allegedly staged His resurrection, He had the Passover meal with the disciples, where Judas betrayed Him again and was taken once more before the chief priests to be tried all over again?

It just doesn't make sense, so I guess, since I believe I am an unlearned person and all this religious stuff is hard to understand, then I'll just blindly follow what my pastor says without questioning it.

It's no wonder the Catholic tradition still portrays Him hanging on the cross. Maybe, in their version, Christ is stuck in some kind of time loop continually being crucified. Perhaps that's why many believers also promote the idea that the wave sheaf offering represents His resurrection another twist added by the Pharisees to fit their narrative.

And wasn't there something in Scripture about the Pharisees bribing the guards at the tomb to spread a false story? It seems like certain leaders both then and now have gone to great lengths to make the resurrection appear like fraud.

So how come some believers keep the Sabbath the same day as the Jews because they have it right?

- **AI overview.**

Even the name the Jewish people call JESUS is a fraud! They call Him YESHUA. Yeshu: (ישׁוּ) While a shortened form of Yeshua, it is also an acronym in some Jewish circles for "Yimach Shemo Ve-zikro" (מַחְקֵּ שְׁמוֹ וַיִּכְרֹּ), which means "May his name and memory be blotted out," indicating a negative view of Christ.

- **The name in Jewish literature:** In Jewish sources like the Talmud, "Yeshu" is used to refer to a figure believed to be the Christ of the New Testament. However, the use of the acronym "Yeshu" to mean "May his name and memory be blotted out" is a more negative and widespread

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The Crucifixion and Resurrection Timeline

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Summary and Final Warning

The modern resurrection calendar does not align with the Word of God, no matter how teachers try to force it. Their version of the crucifixion and resurrection depends on a man-made pattern that ignores the biblical structure of time itself. The reason their timeline never fits is because they are using the Gregorian calendar, created by men, instead of the lunar calendar established by God at creation.

According to Scripture, each new month begins with the new moon, not with a continuous weekly cycle. God's days and Sabbaths are marked by the cycle of light, darkness, and the renewal of the moon.

Genesis 1:14 “And God said, Let there be lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night, and let them be for signs, and for seasons, and for days, and years.”

Isaiah 66:23 “From one new moon to another, and from one sabbath to another, shall all flesh come to worship before me, saith the LORD.”

In God's design, the new moon day is the first day of each month, and the Sabbaths fall on the 7th, 14th, 21st, and 28th days of every lunar month. This pattern resets each month with the new moon. The modern system, however, never resets. It runs on a repeating weekly cycle that is separated from the lunar signs God appointed.

Because of this, when people try to place Christ's death and resurrection into the Gregorian calendar, the sequence of Passover, Unleavened Bread, and Firstfruits can never align properly. They end up inventing timelines that contradict the Gospels and distort the commandments of God. The Word shows that Christ kept the true Passover, ate with His disciples on the first day of Unleavened Bread, was crucified and buried before the Sabbath began, and rose after three days and three

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nights, exactly as He said. It did not happen on a Roman Sunday morning or on a calendar built by men.

This is why the resurrection story based on the Gregorian system will always fail. The days of the week, the days of the month, and the Sabbaths in that system are not the same days that God sanctified. Their count begins with Rome, not with the new moon that God created.

Exodus 31:17 “It shall be a sign between me and the children of Israel for ever, for in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, and on the seventh day he rested, and was refreshed.”

Ezekiel 20:12 “Moreover also I gave them my sabbaths, to be a sign between me and them, that they might know that I am the LORD that sanctify them.”

The confusion about the resurrection timeline exists because men replaced God's calendar with their own. When that substitution entered the church, every festival, Sabbath, and appointed time shifted out of harmony with heaven. The true pattern is written in Genesis, declared in Exodus, upheld by the prophets, and confirmed by the new moon that appears every month.

For a full study on the true biblical calendar, the new moon, and God's appointed Sabbaths, read Book 4, Chapter 3, Study 1: “The Sabbath, God's Covenant Sign and Appointed Rest.”

Those who return to God's calendar will see that His feasts, His Sabbaths, and the resurrection of His Son all stand in perfect order, without contradiction or human alteration.

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
