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A NOTICE TO THE READER

As you review the books, chapters, studies, letters, and research materials listed throughout this directory, it is important to understand that not every title listed is currently available for distribution.

The Zion's Roar Library represents a continuing work that began in 2011. Since that time, countless hours have been devoted to prayer, study, research, examination, verification, writing, revision, correction, and testing. What started as a personal search for answers gradually developed into a growing collection of studies, letters, research materials, and teaching resources. The work continues even now as new questions arise, additional subjects are examined, and existing materials are refined and improved.

The purpose of this directory is to provide an overview of the Zion's Roar Library as a whole, including studies that are completed, studies that are under revision, studies currently being developed, and studies planned for future completion. The presence of a title within this directory should not be understood as meaning that the study has been finalized, published, or approved for public release.

Only those studies currently available through the Zion's Roar Library website have completed the process of research, writing, revision, verification, testing, correction, and review necessary for distribution. These are the studies we presently believe contain sufficient evidence, clarity, and biblical support to fulfill their intended purpose.

All completed studies are produced as individual foldable booklets designed to be practical, portable, and easy to distribute. Their format allows them to be conveniently carried, shared, and used for personal study, one-on-one discipleship, outreach, counseling, evangelism, and small group discussions. Each booklet is intended to stand on its own while also serving as part of the larger library.

This detailed index, directory, and reference guide is different. Because of its size and purpose, it cannot reasonably fit within the standard foldable booklet format used for the individual studies. For this reason, those wishing to keep a copy of this directory will need to print it using standard full-size paper or request a printed copy directly from Zion's Roar Holy Spirit Ministry. Any printed copies of this directory will likewise be produced in a larger format suitable for reference and study purposes.

Many other studies exist only as outlines, notes, research files, partial drafts, or working manuscripts. Some may require additional months, and occasionally years, of

prayer, study, examination, verification, correction, rewriting, and refinement before they are considered ready for release. Our goal is not merely to provide information, but to ensure that what is provided is accurate, useful, understandable, and faithful to the Word of God.

If you are interested in a study that is not yet available, you are welcome to contact us. In many cases, we may be able to discuss the subject, provide a summary of the conclusions reached thus far, answer questions, or explain the general direction of the research. However, until a study has completed the review process, we may choose not to distribute the unfinished manuscript itself.

There is another reason for this approach.

The Zion's Roar Library was intentionally organized in a progressive order. Foundational studies prepare the reader for later studies, and later studies often depend upon principles established earlier. Because of this, we may occasionally recommend delaying certain studies until foundational subjects have first been examined and understood.

This is not done to withhold information, but to avoid confusion, misunderstanding, and instability. A strong foundation often determines whether a difficult subject produces understanding or merely raises more questions.

Our primary goal has never been the distribution of information. Our primary goal is to help people understand God's Word, respond to His call, receive salvation according to Scripture, and continue walking faithfully in obedience to Him. Knowledge alone is not the objective. Transformation, faithfulness, and perseverance are.

God is a God of order, not confusion. Throughout Scripture we see that He builds line upon line, precept upon precept, foundation upon foundation. For this reason, we seek to follow that same pattern within this library whenever possible.

We encourage every reader to be patient, to continue examining the studies that are currently available, and to remember that spiritual growth is not a race to gather information. It is a lifelong process of learning, obedience, correction, and maturity.

May we all pursue truth together, walk in unity, and remain faithful to the calling we have received, just as the apostles encouraged believers to stand together as one body under the authority of Christ.

Book 1 – The Call

This book is written for non-believers. It presents the foundational message that the apostles themselves proclaimed the moment they encountered people, before church language, traditions, or assumptions ever entered the picture. It lays out the truth about salvation from the ground up, confronting indifference, exposing false security, and explaining why mankind fell, what the curse produced, and how God answered through Christ, the Son of God. It explains grace and mercy as Scripture defines them, the work of the Holy Spirit, how to call upon the Lord according to the Word, and why being a believer is not the same as being a disciple. This book is not meant to reassure the comfortable, but to clearly declare the message the apostles preached, so those who do not yet believe can understand what God is actually calling them to.

Book 1 – Chapter 1 - The Truth About Salvation

This chapter lays the foundation for the entire work by restoring the apostolic understanding of salvation.

It begins by confronting indifference and false assurance, then explains the fall of man, the curse of sin, and why salvation is necessary. It presents Christ as the only begotten Son of God and the only way to reconciliation with the Father. The chapter defines grace, mercy, and the work of the Holy Spirit biblically, correcting modern distortions.

It concludes by clarifying what true conversion looks like, belief, repentance, baptism, obedience, and discipleship, showing that salvation is not mere belief, but a life surrendered to Christ.

B1-C01-S01 - Do You Even Care About the Truth?

This study confronts indifference. It asks the most basic question the apostles pressed upon people, do you actually care about truth and your soul. It exposes distractions, false security, and religious excuses, and warns that ignoring truth has eternal consequences. It is a direct wake-up call meant to break apathy and stir seriousness about God, obedience, and eternity.

B1-C01-S02 - The Fall, the Curse, and God's Answer

This study explains why the world is broken and why every person is born separated from God. It walks through the fall of Adam and Eve, the entrance of sin and death, and the curse that came upon all mankind. Then it presents God's answer, Christ, as the only solution to sin, separation, and spiritual death. This is the foundation the apostles used to explain why salvation is even necessary.

B1-C01-S03 - Christ, the Son of God

This study introduces Christ exactly as the apostles preached Him, not as a religious figure, but as the only begotten Son of God. It explains who Christ is, why He had to come, what His death accomplished, and why His resurrection matters. It makes clear that salvation is only found in Christ and that no one comes to the Father apart from Him.

B1-C01-S04 - Grace and Mercy What God Gives and What He Withholds

This study explains grace and mercy as the Bible defines them, not as modern religion redefines them. It shows that mercy is God withholding the punishment we deserve, and grace is God giving what we do not deserve. It makes clear that grace and mercy are not excuses to continue in sin, but God's provision to bring sinners to repentance, obedience, and new life through Christ.

B1-C01-S05 - What the Holy Spirit Does for Us and In Us

This study explains the role of the Holy Spirit from a biblical perspective. It shows how the Spirit draws people to God, convicts of sin, leads to repentance, regenerates, indwells, teaches truth, and empowers obedience. It makes clear that the Holy Spirit is not a feeling or an emotion, but God's active presence working in and through those who truly submit to Him.

B1-C01-S06 - What Every Believer Must Know

This study exposes how many people have been misled by false teachings, altered translations, and incomplete doctrines. It lays out essential biblical truths that every believer must understand to avoid deception. Like the apostles, it warns that ignorance is dangerous and that salvation requires knowing and obeying what God actually said, not what religious systems prefer to teach.

B1-C01-S07 - If You Die Today, Are You Ready

This study confronts false assurance head-on. It asks whether a person is truly prepared to stand before God if death came today. Using Scripture and apostolic teaching, it exposes counterfeit salvation plans and proves that believing alone is not the finish line. It explains conversion, obedience, and the biblical process of salvation exactly as the apostles preached it.

B1-C01-S08 - How to Call Upon the Lord According to Scripture

This study corrects one of the most misunderstood phrases in Christianity, “calling upon the Lord.” It explains, step by step, what Scripture actually requires calling on God rightly. It shows that calling on the Lord is not a prayer formula, but a response of belief, repentance, conversion, baptism, and obedience, just as the apostles taught in the book of Acts.

B1-C01-S09 - Believers and Disciples Not the Same Thing

This study draws a clear biblical distinction between believing in Christ and following Christ. It explains why many people believe but never become disciples. Using Scripture, it shows that salvation is tied to discipleship, obedience, and submission, not titles or labels. This reflects the apostolic message that following Christ costs everything, and that belief without obedience is incomplete.

BOOK 2

Book 2 - Salvation According to Scripture

This book is a full biblical examination of salvation, written to dismantle assumption and replace it with certainty grounded in Scripture. It follows the same method used by Christ and the apostles, questioning, proving, and tracing salvation exactly as God revealed it, not as modern religion assumes it. The book begins by exposing false assurance and emotional substitutes for truth, then walks step by step through the biblical path of salvation, belief, repentance, faith, confession, baptism, remission of sins, receiving the Holy Ghost, conversion, and endurance. It defines the true Gospel, clarifies grace and mercy within God's conditions, and explains entry into the New Covenant according to Scripture alone. By the end, the reader is called to test everything they once believed against the Word of God, so salvation rests not on tradition, feelings, or memory, but on obedience to the complete biblical pattern revealed by Christ and His apostles.

Book 2- Chapter 1 - The Biblical Examination of Salvation

This chapter exposes what salvation truly is according to Scripture, not tradition. It begins by shaking people out of indifference, showing why truth matters and why humanity's fall created the need for redemption. It reveals who Christ truly is, why His death and resurrection are the only way back to God, and clarifies the real meaning of grace, mercy, and the work of the Holy Spirit. The book tears down modern distortions about belief, emotion, and "easy faith," explaining that salvation requires repentance, obedience, and transformation. It corrects false teachings about calling on the Lord, warns against counterfeit assurance, and draws the dividing line between those who simply believe and those who actually follow. In short, it restores the original apostolic message of salvation that demands truth, surrender, and a living walk with God.

B2-C01-S01 - God's Call to Examine Salvation

This study shows that God Himself commands believers to examine their salvation. It establishes that self-examination is not doubt, but obedience. Scripture is used to prove that assurance without testing is dangerous and that salvation must withstand the scrutiny of God's Word.

B2-C01-S02 - Questions That Reveal What We Truly Believe

This study uses biblical questions to expose gaps, assumptions, and contradictions in modern salvation beliefs. It shows how simple questions, when answered honestly from Scripture, reveal whether faith is informed, partial, or misplaced. This mirrors how the apostles reasoned with people publicly and directly.

B2-C01-S03 - Tracing the Biblical Path to Salvation

This study traces salvation exactly as it unfolds in Scripture, step by step. It follows the apostolic order, belief, repentance, faith, confession, baptism, and obedience, showing that salvation is a process revealed progressively, not a single moment detached from action.

B2-C01-S04 - The Full Biblical Pattern of Salvation

This study gathers all relevant Scriptures into one complete pattern, removing isolated verses and selective teaching. It demonstrates that salvation has a clear, repeatable biblical structure that never changes, regardless of culture, time period, or denomination.

B2-C01-S05 - Are You Truly Saved

This study confronts personal assurance directly. It compares modern salvation claims with the biblical requirements revealed in Scripture. Like the apostles, it presses the reader to test belief, obedience, and conversion honestly, without emotion, excuses, or tradition.

B2-C01-S06 - Challenging the Common Salvation Narrative

This study places today's popular salvation message side by side with Scripture and exposes where they diverge. It shows how phrases like "saved by belief alone" developed over time and why they cannot survive a full biblical examination.

B2-C01-S07 - A Common Salvation Story Examined

This study analyzes a typical modern salvation testimony and measures it against Scripture. Step by step, it identifies what is present, what is missing, and what is assumed. This mirrors the apostolic method of reasoning from Scripture to reveal whether salvation is complete or incomplete.

B2-C01-S08 - Why Feelings Cannot Be Trusted for Salvation

This study exposes the danger of using feelings as proof of salvation. It shows from Scripture that the heart is unstable, easily influenced, and often deceptive. Like the apostles, it redirects assurance away from emotions and back to obedience, faith, and truth grounded in the Word of God, not internal sensations or religious experiences.

B2-C01-S09 - When Doubt Is a Call to Examine, Not to Fear

This study corrects the modern teaching that questioning salvation is sinful. It shows that Scripture presents doubt as a signal to examine, repent, grow, and mature, not something to suppress or fear. It explains how the Holy Spirit, conviction, trials, and even spiritual warfare can expose weak foundations so true faith can be strengthened.

B2-C01-S10 - Believing Nearer to Salvation, Not Saved

This study dismantles the idea that salvation is completed at the moment of belief. Using clear Scripture, it proves that believing brings a person nearer to salvation and seals them with God's promise but does not complete salvation by itself. Like the apostles taught, it shows that belief initiates the process, but obedience to God's full plan brings it to completion.

CHAPTER 2

Book 2 - Chapter 2 - RESPONDING TO THE GOSPEL

This chapter establishes what the true Gospel actually is and why authority is bound to the Name God appointed. It explains how the apostles preached Christ, why salvation is tied to His Name, and how authority, covenant, and obedience operate together. It confronts altered traditions and calls the reader back to the original apostolic message.

B2-C02-S01 - The Gospel of Christ and the Authority of His Name

This study defines repentance biblically, not emotionally. It proves that repentance is not regret, sorrow, or words, but a decisive turning away from sin and toward God. It shows that repentance is commanded, precedes conversion, and must be demonstrated through obedience, exactly as preached by John the Baptist, Christ, and the apostles.

B2-C02-S02 - Repentance A Complete Change of Direction

This study defines repentance biblically, not emotionally. It proves that repentance is not regret, sorrow, or words, but a decisive turning away from sin and toward God. It shows that repentance is commanded, precedes conversion, and must be demonstrated through obedience, exactly as preached by John the Baptist, Christ, and the apostles.

B2-C02-S03 - Faith That Leads to Salvation

This study explains what saving faith actually is and why faith without obedience is incomplete. It shows that faith develops, grows, and must be perfected through works, endurance, and submission to God's will. It dismantles the idea of "faith alone" and traces faith from belief to its intended end, the salvation of the soul.

B2-C02-S04 - Grace and Mercy Within God's Conditions

This study clarifies grace and mercy as Scripture defines them, not as modern religion portrays them. It shows that grace is not automatic and mercy is not unconditional, but both operate within God's revealed order. The study proves that grace comes through faith and obedience, not assumption, and never excuses continued disobedience.

B2-C02-S05 - Confessing Christ According to Scripture

This study explains what it truly means to confess Christ. It shows that biblical confession is public, verbal, obedient, and connected to conversion and baptism, not merely a private prayer. It exposes false substitutes for confession and restores the apostolic teaching that confession is part of entering covenant with Christ.

B2-C02-S06 - A Good Conscience Toward God

This study explains why salvation must result in a cleansed conscience before God. It shows that a good conscience is not achieved through sincerity or intention, but through obedience to God's appointed means. Scripture is used to demonstrate that baptism is directly connected to receiving a good conscience and full assurance of faith.

CHAPTER 3

Book 2 - Chapter 3 - Entering the New Covenant

This chapter reveals what it truly means to enter the New Covenant and become part of God's redeemed people. It explains that remission of sins is not symbolic forgiveness but the complete erasure of the past, and that baptism is the appointed moment when this remission takes place. It shows that receiving the Holy Ghost is part of the same process, completing true conversion as the apostles taught. The book exposes and refutes modern objections to baptism's role in salvation, then challenges every reader to test their own faith and experience against Scripture, not tradition. It clarifies that belief must lead to obedience, transformation, and endurance, proving that salvation is not secured by a single act but maintained through continual faithfulness. In the end, it calls believers to re-examine everything they were taught and rebuild their foundation fully upon God's Word.

B2-C03-S01 - Remission of Sins When God Erases the Past

This study explains what remission of sins truly means according to Scripture. It shows the difference between forgiveness and remission and proves that remission is the complete removal of past sins, not merely overlooking them. It establishes that without remission; there is no new birth and no salvation.

B2-C03-S02 - Baptism God's Appointed Moment of Remission

This study identifies the exact biblical moment when remission of sins takes place. It demonstrates that baptism is not symbolic, optional, or secondary, but God's appointed act where sins are remitted. Using Scripture alone, it shows why baptism is inseparable from salvation under the New Covenant.

B2-C03-S03 - The Holy Ghost: The Indwelling Gift of the New Covenant

This study explains when, how, and why the Holy Ghost indwells a believer. It distinguishes between conviction, filling, and indwelling, and proves that the indwelling of the Holy Ghost follows obedience to God's established order. It restores the apostolic teaching of receiving the Spirit as part of completed conversion.

B2-C03-S04 - Answering the Objections to Baptism and Salvation

This study directly confronts the most common arguments used to deny baptism's role in salvation. It examines claims such as the thief on the cross, symbolic baptism, and spiritual-only baptism, and refutes them using Scripture, covenant timing, and apostolic authority. It exposes exceptions being misused as doctrine.

B2-C03-S05 - Examining Your Salvation According to Scripture

This study calls the reader to personally test their salvation against God's Word. It provides biblical criteria to evaluate belief, repentance, baptism, remission, the Holy Ghost, and obedience. Like the apostles, it presses for certainty grounded in truth, not memory, emotion, or tradition.

B2-C03-S06 - Conversion: From Belief to a Changed Life

This study explains conversion as a process, not a moment. Using Scripture and the example of Peter, it shows that belief alone does not equal conversion. It proves that conversion requires transformation, obedience, and completion of God's requirements before a person can enter the Kingdom of Heaven.

B2-C03-S07 - Enduring to the End: Salvation Maintained by Faithfulness

This study establishes that salvation must be maintained through endurance. It shows that Scripture repeatedly ties final salvation to perseverance, obedience, and faithfulness through trials, correction, and suffering. It dismantles once-saved-always-saved thinking by restoring Christ's and the apostles' warnings.

B2-C03-S08 - Measuring What You Once Believed Against Scripture

This final study brings everything together. It calls the reader to lay aside past teachings, traditions, and assumptions, and measure them honestly against Scripture. It mirrors the Berean example, urging humility, correction, and submission to truth so that salvation rests on God's Word alone.

BOOK 3

Book 3 - Walking Worthy

“Walking Worthy” calls every believer to live a life that matches the faith they claim. This book reveals that salvation is not a one-time confession but a continual walk of obedience, holiness, and endurance. It begins by defining who we are, spirit, soul, and body, and how true identity in Christ demands the death of the old self. It then exposes how love is proven only through obedience, that works reveal faith, and that grace loses meaning when used to excuse sin.

Readers are led through the cost of discipleship, the truth of the Lord’s Supper as a covenant command, and the difference between human religion and the works of God. It confronts false doctrines that make holiness optional and shows that justification, righteousness, and sanctification are living processes that must be maintained through submission to God’s Word and Spirit.

The latter chapters train believers in the disciplines that sustain the walk, prayer, fasting, solitude, simplicity, submission, and true worship, each one designed to strengthen communion with God and shape a life of daily obedience. The book concludes with the highest marks of spiritual maturity, discernment, sacrificial love, and righteous judgment that protects the body of Christ.

“Walking Worthy” is not about religion, it is about transformation. It challenges every reader to examine their faith honestly, abandon complacency, and walk in the holiness that God recognizes.

Book 3 - Chapter 01 - Identity

This Chapter reveals the true identity of every believer according to Scripture. It explains that each person is made of spirit, soul, and body, and that the soul stands at the center of the spiritual battle, choosing whether to obey the Spirit of God or surrender to the flesh. The book shows that in Christ, identity is completely transformed the old self dies, and a new life begins under His authority. It warns against spiritual amnesia, the tendency to forget who we are and what we were freed from and shows that losing sight of this new identity leads back into sin and compromise. Ultimately, it calls believers to remember, walk, and live as new creations who belong fully to Christ.

B3-C01-S01 - Spirit, Soul, and Body: Understanding Who You Are

This study explains the biblical makeup of a human being as spirit, soul, and body, and clarifies the distinct role of each. It shows that the spirit is God-given and capable of discernment, the soul is the true self that thinks, chooses, and is held accountable, and the body is the fleshly vessel tied to the physical world. The study emphasizes that the real battle of obedience takes place in the soul, which must choose between yielding to the Spirit of God or the desires of the flesh, and that the soul alone stands before God in judgment.

B3-C01-S02 - Identity in Christ and the Danger of Spiritual Amnesia

This study teaches that coming to Christ brings transformation of identity, not the preservation of the old self. It contrasts worldly identity with identity in Christ, showing that believers are called to die to the old man and live under Christ's rule. The study warns against spiritual amnesia, forgetting who we are in Christ, what we were delivered from, and who now reigns as King, and explains how forgetfulness leads back into sin, disobedience, and compromise if not corrected through remembrance, obedience, and faith.

B3-C01-S03 - The Fear of the Lord

This study teaches that the fear of the Lord is not terror, but reverent submission that produces immediate obedience. It confronts the modern separation of grace from fear, showing that grace does not excuse sin but trains believers to deny it. The study explains that fear guards grace from becoming permission, protects repentance from becoming emotional theater, and keeps prayer, faith, and salvation aligned with obedience. It presents fear as the foundation of endurance, spiritual clarity, and genuine discipleship, exposing delay, rationalization, partial obedience, and self-deception as evidence that fear has weakened. Through repeated scriptural tests, the study calls the reader to examine, repent quickly, obey immediately, and remove resistance, insisting that hearing God always means obeying Him. Fear, it concludes, is the posture that keeps salvation lived rather than assumed and guards the heart from drifting into compromise.

CHAPTER 2

Book 3 - Chapter 02 – Obedience, Doctrine, and the Narrow Way of Salvation

This chapter teaches that true salvation is proven through obedience, not profession. It establishes that love for God is demonstrated only by keeping His commandments, that good works are evidence of genuine faith rather than a way to earn salvation, and that believers must continue steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine without altering the original plan of repentance, baptism, and Spirit indwelling. It warns that many who claim to believe are deceived through false doctrine, emotional religion, or misplaced trust in grace that does not produce obedience. The chapter confronts the abuse of grace as permission to sin, exposing sin as a ruling master that must be crucified, not managed. It calls the reader to test everything by Scripture, reject watered-down teachings, endure faithfully, and examine whether their life reflects submission to Christ or continued allegiance to the flesh. In short, it argues that salvation is maintained through enduring obedience to the truth once delivered, and that anything less is self-deception.

B3-C02-S01 - Love Proven Only Through Obedience

This study defines biblical love as agape, a love that comes from God and is proven through obedience, not emotion or words. It teaches that obedience is the only way God has appointed for believers to show love toward Him. Using extensive Scripture, the study shows that keeping God's commandments is inseparable from loving Him, that obedience is better than sacrifice, and that true faith, worship, and discipleship are demonstrated through a life submitted to God's will.

B3-C02-S02 - Good Works: Evidence, Not Earning

This study addresses the tension between grace, faith, and works, showing that good works do not earn salvation but are essential evidence of genuine faith. It explains that a believer who produces no works denies God through disobedience and is unfruitful. The study distinguishes between man-made religious works and the works God commands, teaching that obedience, repentance, endurance, evangelism, and faithful service are required to maintain salvation and that God judges and rewards every person according to their works.

B3-C02-S03 - Continuing in the Apostles' Doctrine

This study establishes that the apostles' doctrine came directly from Christ and has never changed. It shows that the apostles preached, baptized, taught obedience, and commanded believers to continue steadfastly in that same doctrine. The study warns that any deviation from the apostles' teaching is false doctrine and exposes how Satan counterfeits salvation by altering the gospel. It calls believers to remain in apostolic teaching for their own salvation and for the salvation of those who hear them.

B3-C02-S04 - Truth or Deceit Testing What You Believe

This study confronts the danger of false assurance and exposes how many people assume they are saved based on belief, tradition, feelings, or church affiliation rather than obedience to God's will. It shows that believing alone does not complete salvation and that even believers and disciples are warned in Scripture about falling away. The study challenges the accusation of being "legalistic," explaining that obedience to God's commandments is often mislabeled as legalism, when in reality Scripture condemns lawlessness, not obedience. It further explains that God does not overlook disobedience, but detests evil, lawlessness, and works of iniquity, showing from Scripture that those who refuse obedience, though religious, may be rejected by God. The study calls the reader to test every doctrine, reject common or watered-down salvation narratives, and examine their faith honestly against Scripture to determine whether it is truth or deceit.

B3-C02-S05 - When Grace Is Abused and Sin Rules

This study exposes how grace is often misunderstood and abused as permission to continue in sin rather than power to overcome it. It teaches that sin is not a mistake or weakness, but a ruling master that demands obedience, and that whoever yields to sin places it on the throne of the heart. The study shows how delayed obedience, emotional repentance, and gradual compromise strengthen sin's control and harden the heart over time. It explains that God abhors and detests rebellion, that grace does not excuse disobedience, and that continued willful sin separates a person from God, silences prayer, grieves the Holy Spirit, and leads to spiritual death. The study emphasizes that true freedom comes only through full obedience, death to self, and the covenant process God established, repentance, baptism, and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, and warns that grace without obedience is deception, not salvation.

CHAPTER 3

Book 3 - Chapter 03 – Counting the Cost

This Chapter reveals the true cost of following Christ and what it means to live as a covenant disciple. It teaches that discipleship demands total surrender, where comfort, possessions, and relationships must all submit to obedience. It separates those who are merely called from those who are truly chosen, proving that only those who endure and obey remain set apart. The book corrects long-standing religious traditions by examining the biblical account of Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, urging believers to test every teaching by Scripture rather than habit. It concludes by restoring the Lord's Supper to its rightful place as a weekly covenant command, not a symbolic or occasional ritual. Altogether, it calls believers to walk in full surrender, reject inherited traditions, and live faithfully within the covenant Christ established.

B3-C03-S01 - Counting the Cost of Discipleship

This study teaches that discipleship requires total commitment and cannot be entered lightly. Using Christ's own words, it explains that following Him demands denying self, taking up the cross, and being willing to forsake attachments, relationships, comfort, and possessions if required. The study shows that many are attracted to Christ but fail to endure when obedience becomes costly, and that discipleship without full surrender leads to eventual falling away. It emphasizes that disciples are either all in or not truly disciples at all.

B3-C03-S02 - Called and Chosen Set Apart Through Obedience

This study explains the biblical distinction between being called and being chosen. It shows that God calls many, but only those who respond with obedience, transformation, and endurance become chosen. The study emphasizes that faith without obedience is empty, feelings cannot guide the walk with God, and true identity in Christ requires death to the old self. It teaches that endurance, remembrance, obedience, and good works are the evidence of a life truly set apart, and that those who do not endure fall away despite being called.

B3-C03-S03 - The True Death, Burial, and Resurrection of Christ

This study examines the biblical timeline of Christ's death, burial, and resurrection and challenges commonly accepted traditions that conflict with Scripture. It analyzes Passover, Unleavened Bread, Firstfruits, and the three days and three nights Christ spoke of, showing that many modern explanations do not align with the Gospel accounts. The study emphasizes the need to test tradition against Scripture and warns that distorted timelines create doctrinal confusion rather than truth.

B3-C03-S04 - The Lord's Supper: A Weekly Covenant Calling

This study explains the Lord's Supper as a covenant practice rooted in Passover, not a symbolic or occasional ritual. It teaches that Christ instituted communion using unleavened bread and the cup during the Feast of Unleavened Bread and that Scripture reveals both the timing and frequency for observing it. The study emphasizes remembrance, covenant participation, unity in the body of Christ, and obedience to Christ's instruction, showing that communion is an ongoing covenant responsibility, not a church tradition shaped by preference.

CHAPTER 4

Book 3 - Chapter 04 - Holiness Expressed in Life

This Chapter focuses on how holiness is not only inward but must be lived outwardly through obedience, discipline, and the visible fruit of the Spirit. The chapter teaches that holiness is proven by action and character, not words or emotion.

Each study explains a part of holy living, including serving and giving as evidence of faith, being sanctified by the Word and Spirit, being justified through obedience, pursuing righteousness and holiness, keeping joy through suffering, bearing the fruit of the Spirit, and walking in peace, gentleness, meekness, and self-control. In summary, this chapter shows that holiness is the clear sign of a life changed by God and maintained through obedience.

B3-C04-S01 - Involvement, Service, and Obedience as the Proof of Faith

This study teaches that involvement in the work of God is not optional but required to maintain salvation. It explains that believers who refuse to engage in good works deny God by their actions and are described in Scripture as disobedient, reprobate, and detestable in God's eyes. The study shows that good works are the works God commands, preaching the Gospel, serving the body, giving, supporting ministry, and bearing fruit. It confronts excuses, rejects passive Christianity, and calls believers to active participation as proof of living faith.

B3-C04-S02 – Tithing, Giving, and Supporting the Work of God

This study examines the biblical purpose of tithing, giving, and supporting the work of God. It traces the practice of giving from the Old Covenant into the New Covenant, showing the difference between mandatory tithes, freewill offerings, almsgiving, and support for those who labor in the Gospel. The study confronts both greed and neglect, exposing the error of using giving as a means of gain as well as the failure to support the work God commands. It teaches that everything belongs to God and that faithful stewardship is an act of worship, gratitude, and obedience. Using Scripture, it shows that giving is not merely financial, but includes time, resources, service, hospitality, and care for the poor, the saints, and those who minister in the Word. The study calls believers to examine whether they are storing up treasures on earth or in heaven and demonstrates that cheerful, sacrificial, and obedient giving is evidence of a heart fully surrendered to God.

B3-C04-S03 - Sanctification Being Made Holy by the Word and the Spirit

This study explains sanctification as a progressive process carried out by the Holy Spirit through obedience to the Word of God. It distinguishes sanctification from justification and righteousness, showing that sanctification is purification and consecration for holy living. The study teaches that sanctification does not occur automatically, but requires submission, study, obedience, and endurance. It explains why God allows sanctification to take time, showing that gradual holiness humbles believers, strengthens dependence on God, produces testimony, and prepares the soul for eternal glory.

B3-C04-S04 - Justification Being Cleared Before God

This study defines justification as being rendered innocent and cleared of guilt before God. It rejects the idea that justification comes by belief or faith alone and demonstrates from Scripture that justification involves Christ's sacrifice, belief, faith, grace, and obedience expressed through good works. The study emphasizes that justification is ongoing, conditional, and must be maintained, warning that believers must qualify through obedience rather than assume justification automatically.

B3-C04-S05 - Righteousness and Holiness Obedience That God Recognizes

This study explains that righteousness and holiness are closely related but distinct from justification. The study confronts false teachings that claim righteousness is automatic or imputed without obedience and shows that disciples are commanded to pursue righteousness actively. It emphasizes that righteousness comes through obedience, study, correction, and separation from unrighteousness.

B3-C04-S06 - Joy Strength That Survives Suffering

This study defines biblical joy as a work of the Holy Spirit that is not dependent on circumstances. It shows that joy flows from faith, obedience, justification, and fellowship with God, even in suffering, persecution, and trials. The study contrasts temporary emotional happiness with spiritual joy and demonstrates that true joy strengthens believers to endure hardship, remain faithful, and finish their course with perseverance.

B3-C04-S07 - The Fruit of the Spirit The Evidence of God's Work

This study explains the fruit of the Spirit as the visible evidence of the Holy Spirit working in a believer's life. It defines "fruit" as actions and results, not intentions or words, and contrasts the fruit of the Spirit with the works of the flesh. The study emphasizes that these fruits identify true disciples and demonstrate transformation, showing that spiritual fruit is the outcome of obedience, submission, and life led by the Spirit.

B3-C04-S08 - Peace and Long-Suffering Endurance Without Compromise

This study defines biblical peace as wholeness, security, and harmony with God that results from justification and faithfulness. It teaches that peace is not the absence of trouble but stability in the midst of tribulation. The study explains that long-suffering is required to maintain peace and that believers are called to endure hardship without compromising truth, obedience, or holiness.

B3-C04-S09 - Goodness and Gentleness Strength Governed by God

This study explains goodness and gentleness as moral strength submitted to God's authority. It teaches that gentleness is not weakness, but controlled power guided by humility, truth, and love. The study emphasizes correcting others with patience, forgiving offenses, rejecting pride, and submitting personal judgment to God's wisdom. It shows that true gentleness upholds holiness while remaining firm in truth.

B3-C04-S10 - Meekness and Self-Control Mastery Under God's Authority

This study presents meekness and self-control as disciplined submission to God rather than passivity. It teaches that meekness is strength under restraint and that self-control is evidence of spiritual maturity and Spirit-led living. The study emphasizes mastery over desires, emotions, and reactions, showing that believers who walk in meekness and temperance demonstrate obedience, stability, and readiness for God's use.

CHAPTER 5

Book 3 – Chapter 05 - Disciplines that Sustain the Walk

This chapter focuses on how a believer sustains a faithful and obedient life after entering covenant with God. It teaches that walking worthy requires more than initial repentance or zeal, it demands consistent spiritual discipline that keeps the soul anchored in truth. The study explains various biblical expressions of worship such as singing, lifting hands, bowing, clapping, and dancing, while emphasizing that true worship flows from sincerity, humility, and obedience rather than outward form. Worship is presented as essential to discipleship and central to eternal life with God.

CHAPTER 6

Book 3 - Chapter 06 - Love, Discernment, and Sacrifice

Finally, sacrifice is revealed as the ultimate proof of love, where believers lay down self-interest, comfort, and even reputation for the good of others and the truth of the Gospel.

Altogether, **this chapter is about spiritual maturity expressed through love that corrects, discernment that protects, and sacrifice that proves faith.** It completes the transformation process described throughout Walking Worthy, showing that the end goal of obedience is a life that reflects the character of Christ through purity, truth, and unwavering love.

B3-C06-S01 - The Way of Life: A Transformed Pattern of Living

This study presents the Christian life as a complete transformation rather than a modification of behavior. It explains that entering Christ leads to a renewed mind, new priorities, and a new way of living that reflects obedience, holiness, and separation from the world. Using Scripture, it shows that death to the old life is the gateway to true life, and that believers are called to walk daily in righteousness, endurance, sanctification, prayer, worship, and obedience as evidence of being a new creation.

B3-C06-S02 - Judging Righteously: Discernment Without Hypocrisy

It exposes the modern disconnect that paints God the Father as harsh and Christ as lenient, showing they are one in will, holiness, and judgment. It trains believers to test doctrine and spirits by Scripture, confronts deception that hides behind "grace" and attacks obedience as "legalism," and restores God's appointed times, Sabbath, new moons, holy days, and separation laws as covenant faithfulness, not tradition. It defends the preservation of God's Word against modern corruption, calls out false teachers and counterfeit gospels, and examines cultural and religious practices that mix darkness with worship. Finally, it brings the reader to the end of all things, resurrection, judgment, eternal destiny, and the visible return of Christ, insisting there is no second chance after death and that the narrow way has a real cost that must be paid now, not explained away later.

Book 4 - Chapter 01 - The Great Disconnect

This chapter exposes the growing divide between how people view God the Father and Christ the Son. The study demonstrates from Scripture that salvation originates with God the Father and is carried out through Christ in complete unity, not opposition. Using the apostles' example, it shows that real love corrects error, and that silence in the face of deception is itself disobedience.

B4-C02-S01 - Statement of Faith, Part 1: The Apostolic Foundation

This study lays out the foundational beliefs of the ministry strictly from Scripture, establishing the Word of God as the sole authority for faith, doctrine, and conduct. It affirms the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, the sinfulness of all mankind after the fall, and the necessity of salvation through Christ. The study defines salvation as a process revealed in Scripture, belief, repentance, confession, baptism for the remission of sins, receiving the Holy Ghost, obedience, good works, endurance, and grace given at God's appointed time. It systematically examines doctrines commonly labeled legalistic, repentance, baptism, holiness, sanctification, righteousness, endurance, and works, and shows from Scripture that these are commands of God, not optional practices. The study calls the church back to discernment, correction, and steadfast obedience grounded in the apostles' doctrine.

B4-C02-S03 - Psychology in the Church: Replacing the Cross with Comfort

This study exposes how psychology, motivational speaking, and emotional manipulation have replaced apostolic preaching in many churches. It contrasts true gospel preaching, repentance, obedience, baptism, and holiness, with feel-good messages that emphasize self-esteem, emotional experiences, and comfort without repentance. The study warns that trusting feelings leads to deception, lawlessness, and false assurance, while Scripture calls believers to faith, obedience, and endurance. It shows how psychology-centered teaching diminishes the authority of God the Father, distorts the role of Christ, and avoids the offense of the cross. The study calls for a return to the simplicity of the gospel once delivered to the saints and warns that salvation without obedience is a lie that leads to destruction.

CHAPTER 3

Book 4 - Chapter 03 - God's Appointed Times vs Man's Calendar

This chapter exposes how the modern world and religious systems have replaced God's original calendar with man-made versions that erase His appointed times. It reveals that obedience to God's timekeeping is not cultural or ceremonial, but covenantal. From the beginning, God set His order through creation, the new moons, and the Sabbaths, marking His rhythm for worship, rest, and remembrance. The chapter explains that abandoning that order has not only distorted the understanding of holy days but has also separated many believers from the rhythm of obedience God intended His people to live by.

Through detailed study, the chapter restores the truth about the Sabbath, holy days, and appointed feasts, proving that they were never abolished but fulfilled and upheld through Christ. It confronts calendar corruption, exposes how traditions have replaced biblical reckoning, and clarifies how God's calendar begins with the new moon, not the fixed Roman week. Each study calls believers to examine whether their observance of time aligns with God's Word or with human convenience.

B4-C03-S01 - The Sabbath: God's Covenant Sign and Appointed Rest

This study establishes the Sabbath as a creation-ordained commandment, sanctified by God and identified as a perpetual covenant sign between Him and His people. It shows from Scripture that the Sabbath applies to all who join themselves to the Lord, not Israel alone, and that it carries blessings for obedience and serious consequences for defilement. The study documents that Christ, the apostles, and Gentile believers kept the Sabbath, explains when the biblical day begins, and outlines what God commands, permits, and forbids on the Sabbath, emphasizing obedience, worship, rest, and delight in the Lord rather than human restriction.

B4-C03-S02 - The Sabbath on Trial: Refuting Contradictions and Calendar Corruption

This study directly confronts common claims about the Sabbath being a fixed modern weekday or a continuous Roman cycle. It examines Scripture, history, language, and prophetic timelines to address arguments concerning lunar Sabbaths, new moons, and calendar changes. The study presents competing claims and systematically tests them against creation patterns, manna cycles, historical records, and the example of Christ. Its stated purpose is to expose calendar corruption, refute contradictions, and force the reader to choose between biblical timekeeping and man-made tradition.

B4-C03-S03 - Dietary Laws: Holiness, Separation, and What God Calls Unclean

This study explains the biblical distinction between clean and unclean foods as a matter of holiness, obedience, and separation rather than culture or health trends. It

demonstrates that these distinctions existed before Sinai, continued through the prophets, and were upheld by the apostles. The study teaches that God's dietary laws train His people to discern between holy and profane, reflect His unchanging character, and live set-apart lives. It emphasizes that obedience to these laws is not legalism, but a response to God's call to holiness under the New Covenant.

B4-C03-S04 - Holy Days and Appointed Times: God's Calendar, Not Man's

The study examines Gospel timelines, feast sequencing, and common calendar assumptions, arguing that many popular teachings create contradictions with Scripture. Its focus is restoring God's appointed times as acts of obedience, remembrance, and covenant faithfulness.

CHAPTER 4

Book 4 - Chapter 04 - Tested by Truth

This chapter confronts every believer with the reality that faith must be proven, not presumed. It shows that claiming truth is meaningless until obedience is tested by it. “Tested by Truth” is both a warning and a measure, revealing that every doctrine, belief, and personal conviction must stand the scrutiny of Scripture or be exposed as deception. It presses the reader to examine whether their walk is built on divine revelation or inherited tradition.

The chapter restores the apostolic pattern of living faith; faith that is demonstrated through obedience, separation, and endurance, not words or emotion. It establishes that true belief produces action, and that compromise with error, even in small matters, reveals a divided heart. The studies within it show that the test of truth always exposes counterfeit religion, self-made faith, and worldly compromise.

B4-C04-S01 - Apostolic Faith in Practice

This study presents a practical statement of faith rooted in what the apostles taught and practiced, emphasizing obedience to God’s commandments as lived faith rather than theory. It affirms the ongoing observance of the Sabbath as a perpetual covenant sign, the maintenance of biblical dietary laws, and the continued practice of breaking bread as covenant communion. The study outlines commitment to apostolic doctrine, separation from modern religious movements and doctrines not grounded in Scripture, and rejection of denominational identity in favor of obedience to Christ alone. It also affirms belief in the premillennial return of Christ, the authority of Scripture over tradition, and the call for believers to live holy, separated lives that reflect obedience, endurance, and faithfulness until the end.

CHAPTER 5

Book 4 - Chapter 05 - Testing the Spirits and the Teachings

This chapter equips believers to confront deception head-on by restoring the biblical command to test every spirit, teacher, and message. It exposes how many have replaced discernment with tolerance, confusing love with silence and peace with compromise. “Testing the Spirits and the Teachings” makes clear that spiritual maturity is not found in emotional unity, but in unwavering loyalty to truth.

The chapter shows that false teachers, corrupted authority, and altered Scripture are not new threats but ancient tactics revived in modern form. It calls believers to measure all doctrine by the apostles’ teaching, separating truth from error no matter how persuasive or popular the messenger may be. It corrects the misuse of “judge not” that has silenced correction within the church and reminds readers that God commands His people to mark, rebuke, and separate from those who twist the Word.

B4-C05-S01 - Correcting Error and Calling Out False Teachers: A Biblical Mandate

This study establishes that correcting error and calling out false teachers is not optional, but a biblical command given to all disciples, not only church leaders. It confronts the modern belief that questioning pastors or exposing false doctrine is sinful, showing instead that ungodly tolerance allows false teachers and destructive doctrines to flourish. Using extensive Scripture, the study demonstrates that love, obedience, and faithfulness to God require identifying, rebuking, marking, and separating from those who teach contrary to the apostles' doctrine. It explains that peace must never come at the expense of truth, that misusing "judge not" silences correction improperly, and that believers will be held accountable by God for failing to warn others. The study emphasizes that correction must be grounded in Scripture, exercised with discernment and humility, and directed toward protecting souls, preserving doctrinal purity, and obeying God rather than fearing men.

B4-C05-S02 - The Trinity Examined: Three in One or a Doctrinal Contradiction

The study teaches that love and obedience are inseparable foundations of faith toward YHWH. It explains that true love, called agape in Greek, is not human affection but divine love placed within the believer's spirit by God Himself. This love is proven through obedience, not emotion or words. To love YHWH is to keep His commandments, and to disobey is to reject Him. It traces this truth through both the Old and New Testaments, showing that obedience is the only way to express genuine love, receive blessing, and walk in holiness. Disobedience is revealed as rebellion that brings sin, separation, and unanswered prayer, while obedience brings transformation and fellowship with God. In its conclusion, the study clarifies that "love" means obedience and "iniquity" means lawlessness, exposing how many misunderstand Scripture by reading without this understanding. The message is clear: faith without obedience is self-deception, but obedience is the living proof of love for YHWH.

B4-C05-S03 - Bible Truth or Religious Poison: Testing Modern Translations

This study exposes how many modern Bible translations corrupt or weaken core doctrines through deliberate word changes and omissions. It compares the King James Bible with nine of the most popular modern versions, showing that the Alexandrian-based texts introduce over 6,000 documented errors. Each example is examined line by line to reveal how these altered versions remove or distort key truths about repentance, Christ's divinity, the virgin birth, salvation, remission of sins, the Trinity, fasting, and obedience.

The study concludes that these changes are not accidental but form a consistent pattern of doctrinal erosion. Words like "remission" are replaced with "forgiveness," softening the meaning of salvation. "Worship" is changed to "kneel," reducing divine reverence. Entire verses about prayer, fasting, and the Lord's commands are deleted, while terms that affirm Christ's deity are removed or altered. Through detailed analysis, the study warns believers that many modern translations function as religious poison disguised as updated language. It calls the reader to return to the preserved Word of God in the King James Bible, the only version that maintains the full authority, accuracy, and purity of Scripture.

B4-C05-S04 - Torah vs Talmud: Commandments of God or Traditions of Men

This study exposes the difference between the Torah given by YHWH and the Talmud created by men. It explains that while the Torah represents the written commandments given directly to Moses by God, the Talmud consists of man-made oral laws developed by Pharisees and scribes, which they falsely claimed were divine. Through Scripture and historical comparison, the study shows how these added traditions turned God's commandments into burdensome regulations, twisting His truth into human control.

The author walks through several examples from the 613 Talmudic laws, comparing each one with the actual words of Scripture, proving that many of them contradict the Word of YHWH. These human commandments limit love to Jews only, justify idol worship under certain conditions, and prioritize tradition over faith. The study contrasts this with the teachings of Christ, who exposed the hypocrisy of the Pharisees and brought a new covenant of grace, faith, and inward obedience. It concludes that following the Talmud leads to legalism and deception, while following Christ's covenant leads to righteousness, truth, and relationship with God written on the heart rather than enforced by tradition.

CHAPTER 6

Book 4 - Chapter 06 - Resurrection, Judgement, and Eternal Destiny

This chapter reveals the final stages of God’s plan for humanity, bringing eternal truth into clear focus. It dismantles popular myths about the afterlife and exposes how modern religion has softened the reality of judgment. “Resurrection, Judgment, and Eternal Destiny” teaches that every soul will rise; some to life and some to condemnation and that the choices made in this life determine the outcome in the next.

The chapter explains the sequence of resurrection, the certainty of judgment, and the permanence of each person’s destiny. It clarifies that God’s justice is final and uncompromising, and that there is no second chance after death. It addresses common misconceptions about hell, eternal punishment, and the rapture, proving each by Scripture rather than tradition or emotion. The message restores the fear of God by reminding readers that grace never cancels accountability and that eternity will reveal whether faith was genuine or false.

B4-C06-S01 - Is Hell Eternal

This study examines whether hell is eternal or temporary, and whether Scripture supports the idea of a second chance for salvation after death. It begins by confronting the false teaching that the “second resurrection” offers another opportunity for redemption, warning that this belief gives people a false sense of security and delays repentance. The study lays a clear biblical foundation by distinguishing between body, spirit, and soul showing that when a person dies, the body returns to dust, the spirit returns to God, and the soul remains conscious, awaiting judgment.

It defines hell as a real, subterranean prison also called Hades, where the souls of the wicked and fallen angels are held in torment until judgment. Using extensive Scriptural references, it shows that hell is not eternal but will itself be cast into the lake of fire after the final judgment. The lake of fire, described as everlasting punishment, is the ultimate and irreversible destruction prepared for the devil, his angels, and all who reject God’s commandments. The study further explains that “Abraham’s bosom” once held the righteous before Christ’s resurrection and clarifies that when Christ preached to “spirits in prison,” He spoke to fallen angels, not human souls. The conclusion is firm: there is no second chance after death. Hell is real, its punishment is final, and salvation must be secured in this life through obedience and faith in Christ.

B4-C06-S02 - Do People Burn Forever in Hellfire

This study corrects false teachings found in a pamphlet titled “Do People Burn Forever in a Hellfire?” using the parable of Lazarus and the rich man as the foundation for biblical clarification. It dismantles the emotional and unscriptural arguments that question God’s justice or promote sentimental theology, reminding readers that God is not moved by human feelings but by truth and righteousness. The study teaches that after death, souls do not immediately go to heaven, but either sleep in Christ or are held in hell (Hades) until the resurrection and final judgment. It also explains that Abraham’s bosom was not heaven but a separate compartment in Hades where the righteous awaited Christ’s resurrection. Using scriptural and linguistic evidence, it shows that the word “bosom” refers to a bay or enclosed space, not to a physical embrace. The study refutes the claim that God’s promise to Abraham was limited to earthly land, proving through Galatians 3 and Revelation 21 that the true promise is eternal inheritance in the new heaven and new earth. It exposes how the pamphlet confuses timelines and misuses Scripture, mixing Old and New Testament truths. The conclusion warns against false teachers who twist the Word for personal gain and emphasizes that those who reject truth will share the fate of the ungodly. Ultimately, it reaffirms that eternal life is only in Christ, and those who reject Him will face final judgment, not endless torment based on human tradition.

B4-C06-S03 - A Third Resurrection? A Second Chance After Death

This study continues the discussion from “Is Hell Eternal?” and focuses on whether Scripture supports the idea of a third resurrection or a second chance after death. It clarifies that resurrection means being raised from true death, not temporary revival like Lazarus or others Christ restored to physical life. Using multiple Scriptural references, the study explains that there will be two resurrections only: the first resurrection for the righteous who endured in faith, and the second resurrection for the wicked and unbelieving. Each person experiences only one resurrection, either unto life or unto damnation. Therefore, the idea of a second chance after death is unscriptural.

The study defines the first resurrection as the moment when those who died in Christ rise to reign with Him during the thousand-year Kingdom, receiving incorruptible spiritual bodies. The second resurrection occurs after the millennium, when the rest of the dead, both unbelievers and rebellious, rise to face judgment at the Great White Throne. Those not found in the Book of Life are cast into the lake of fire, which is the second death. It further explains that people who live during the millennium will still have free will. Those who die faithful to Christ will be transformed immediately, while those who sin will go to hell. The final outcome is that death and hell will both be destroyed forever, leaving only life, holiness, and peace in the new heaven and new

earth. The conclusion is absolute: there is no third resurrection, no second chance after death, and no path to salvation beyond this present life.

B4-C06-S04 - A new Heaven and a new Earth

This study explains the prophetic fulfillment of God's promise to create a new heaven and a new earth after the destruction of the old world. It teaches that when sin, death, and hell are finally destroyed, God will restore creation to its original purity and establish an eternal dwelling where righteousness reigns. The study connects Revelation 21 and Isaiah 65, showing that this new creation will not simply repair the old earth but completely replace it. The former things sorrow, pain, death, and corruption will no longer exist because the curse will be permanently removed. It also emphasizes that the New Jerusalem will descend from heaven as the dwelling place of God among His people. This is not symbolic but a literal future reality in which God will personally live with the redeemed. The righteous will inherit eternal life, perfect peace, and everlasting communion with the Father, while all sin and rebellion will have been cast into the lake of fire. The study closes by reminding believers that the ultimate hope of the gospel is not escape from the earth but the renewal of all creation, where heaven and earth unite under the eternal rule of God.

B4-C06-S05 - The Rapture Biblical Truth or Modern Doctrine

It reveals that culture has become one of Satan's most effective tools to disguise rebellion as celebration and mixture as faithfulness. "Cultural and Religious Practices Examined" calls believers to separate fully from what God calls unclean and to measure every tradition, religious or social by Scripture alone.

The chapter dissects practices such as the use of wine, Halloween, Christmas, and certain religious phrases or rituals that appear spiritual but are not supported by the Word of God. Each subject is examined with historical and biblical evidence to uncover where human invention has replaced divine instruction. The message is not about legalism but about purity, showing that obedience cannot coexist with compromise.

B4-C07-S01 - Wine, Grape Juice, and Biblical Honesty

This study exposes the deception behind the belief that drinking alcohol in moderation is acceptable for Christians. It distinguishes between two biblical uses of the word wine: **new wine**, which is pure grape juice, and **old wine**, which is fermented and intoxicating. Through scriptural analysis, it proves that God's people were commanded to drink only the "pure blood of the grape," never fermented drink. The study shows that fermentation is a process of decay, symbolically linked to sin and corruption, and that consuming it defiles the body, which is the temple of the Holy Spirit.

It dismantles the arguments often used to justify moderate drinking, explaining each verse that is commonly misused to defend alcohol consumption. It warns that just as fornication, idolatry, and theft are never acceptable "in moderation," neither is drinking. Alcohol is identified as a counterfeit of the joy of the Holy Spirit, a tool Satan uses to open the door to demonic influence, violence, and loss of self-control. The study also provides a practical path to repentance and deliverance from addiction, calling believers to surrender fully to Christ, replace the desire for alcohol with the filling of the Holy Spirit, and live in holiness. The message is firm: no follower of Christ should consume fermented drink, and those who do must repent and forsake it to remain pure before God.

B4-C07-S02 - Halloween: Harmless Fun or Pagan Worship

It contrasts this with the example of Paul, who never demanded blessings or pleaded for deliverance but trusted God in suffering, persecution, and need. True biblical prayer, the study teaches, is not about claiming authority through phrases but about submission, obedience, and holiness. Believers are reminded that Christ’s blood has already accomplished redemption and that victory comes through resisting sin and wearing the full armor of God, not through repetitive declarations. The conclusion calls for repentance from emotional and manipulative forms of prayer and a return to scriptural submission, purity, and daily obedience under the covering of Christ’s completed work.

CHAPTER 8

Book 4 - Chapter 08 - God's Word Preserved, Man's Words Corrupted

This chapter defends the authority and preservation of God's Word against centuries of human alteration, mistranslation, and manipulation. It exposes how modern versions of Scripture, shaped by academic pride and theological bias, have diluted key truths that once defined the faith of the apostles. "God's Word Preserved, Man's Words Corrupted" confronts the growing disbelief that God kept His Word intact and proves through history and Scripture that divine preservation is not a theory but a promise.

The chapter contrasts the purity of the preserved text with the confusion produced by endless modern revisions. It traces the origins of corruption back to early translators, scholars, and institutions that elevated reason and philosophy over revelation. Through its studies, it shows how subtle word changes weaken doctrine, alter salvation's message, and distort the character of Christ. It also defends the King James Bible as a faithful witness of God's preserved Word, showing its unmatched consistency, stability, and alignment with the Hebrew and Greek foundations.

B4-C08-S01 - Gods promise to preserve His word

This study establishes the absolute authority and divine preservation of God's Word, declaring that the King James Bible is the only translation that has remained pure and unchanged since its creation. It contrasts the formal equivalence method used in the King James translation word-for-word accuracy from the original scrolls with the dynamic equivalence method used in modern versions, which alters words and meaning to fit cultural language or ideology. The study argues that every modern translation weakens doctrine and opens the door for deception and profit rather than truth.

It provides a vast collection of Scriptural evidence confirming God's promise to preserve His words forever. From Psalms 12:6–7 to Matthew 24:35, it shows that God's Word is pure, settled in heaven, and cannot be altered without judgment. The study warns that those who add to or take away from Scripture will lose their part in the Book of Life, echoing Revelation 22:19. It concludes that the King James Bible stands as the preserved, inspired Word of God for English-speaking believers, while all other translations compromise divine truth. The call is clear: to love, defend, and live by the pure Word that God Himself has magnified above His name.

B4-C08-S01A - Scripture Preservation vs Scripture Corruption

This study is a detailed defense of Scripture preservation and a direct challenge to the corruption of God's Word through modern Bible versions. It argues that the King James Version (KJV) alone stands as the pure and preserved Word of God for English-speaking believers, tracing a consistent historical and textual lineage from the earliest manuscripts through pre-1611 English Bibles. It warns that modern versions, influenced by the Jesuit movement and Westcott-Hort text, subtly alter doctrine, diminish Christ's divinity, and promote works-based theology under the guise of clarity and modernization.

The study provides extensive verse comparisons demonstrating where new translations replace or omit key words turning "are saved" into "being saved," "fornication" into "sexual immorality," "Comforter" into "Helper," and "hell" into "Hades." It frames these changes as deliberate attacks on biblical authority, arguing that unity in faith once rested on the shared KJV text, while modern diversity of versions has fractured doctrine and truth. It ties this to a broader spiritual deception aimed at eroding confidence in Scripture, preparing the world for a one-world religion under Antichrist. The conclusion calls believers to reject corrupt translations, hold fast to the preserved KJV, and guard the integrity of God's Word as a divine trust that must never be altered.

B4-C08-S01B - The King James Bible, Facts Not Assumptions

This study delivers a detailed historical and theological defense of the King James Bible (KJV) as the divinely preserved and pure Word of God. It contrasts the KJV's origins with the corruption that entered through early heretical movements, the Alexandrian manuscripts, and later Roman Catholic influence. It traces a direct line from the original writings, through faithful early believers such as the Waldenses, to the 1611 translation commissioned by King James I, portraying it as the culmination of God's promise to preserve His Word for all generations.

The study explains how the translators were godly men of prayer, fasting, and linguistic mastery who worked with thousands of authentic manuscripts. It contrasts them with figures such as Origen, Jerome, and the Jesuit order, who introduced philosophical and pagan doctrines into their corrupted versions of Scripture. The document condemns modern Bible translations for relying on these compromised sources, arguing they dilute or alter essential doctrines about Christ's divinity, salvation, and holiness. It presents the history of persecution under Rome, the preservation efforts of believers like Wycliffe and Tyndale, and the spiritual warfare surrounding the Scriptures' transmission. The conclusion declares the KJV to be the final, providentially protected English Bible untainted by modern revisionism and calls believers to uphold it as the true Word of God, unchanging, inspired, and magnified above all names.

B4-C08-S01C - Origen of Alexandria and the Roots of Textual Corruption

This study explores the life and influence of Origen of Alexandria (AD 185–254), exposing his role in the early corruption of Scripture and the blending of Greek philosophy with biblical interpretation. It explains that while Origen was a prolific scholar who sought to defend Christianity intellectually, his methods and theology laid the groundwork for later doctrinal compromise. His Hexapla project, which compiled multiple Greek versions of the Old Testament alongside Hebrew text, is identified as a major source of textual alteration that weakened faith in the pure Word of God. The study points out that Origen’s acceptance of allegorical interpretation and his belief in the pre-existence of souls, universal salvation, and the subordination of the Son to the Father directly opposed Scripture. His teachings blurred the line between Christian revelation and pagan philosophy, influencing later Alexandrian scholars and translators who further corrupted the biblical text. Though he lived an ascetic and zealous life, his intellectual pride and philosophical mindset caused lasting damage to the purity of God’s Word. The conclusion warns that the spirit of Origen’s compromise lives on through modern translations and liberal theology, calling believers to reject intellectual distortion and return to the preserved truth found in the King James Bible.

B4-C08-S01D - Four Hundred Years Unchanged, The Stability of the KJV

This study defends the King James Bible as the only English translation that has remained unchanged and uncorrupted for over four hundred years. It presents direct textual comparisons between editions from 1611 through 2004, proving that aside from minor spelling and punctuation updates, the wording has never been altered. The study contrasts this stability with modern Bible versions, which have been repeatedly revised, diluted, or reinterpreted to fit cultural or theological trends. It declares that the preservation of the King James Bible fulfills God’s promise that His Word would never pass away or be lost.

The document refutes common myths, such as the claim that the KJV has been revised multiple times or that its early editions are too difficult to read. It explains the Gothic printing and stylistic features of the 1611 edition, showing that even a young reader can understand it with minimal effort. Supported by dozens of Scripture references, the study proclaims that God Himself preserved every word through the ages and warns that altering Scripture invites divine judgment. The message concludes with confidence that the KJV stands as the perfect, unbroken record of God’s Word proven pure, inspired, and preserved from generation to generation.

B4-C08-S01E - The 1611 KJV Revision Myth Exposed

This study dismantles the long-standing claim that the King James Bible has undergone multiple major revisions since 1611. It argues that the so-called “revisions” were in fact minor corrections of early printing errors or updates to spelling and typeface, not changes to the text or meaning. The work exposes how modern scholars and Bible publishers have weaponized this myth to justify creating new, corrupted versions such as the New King James, NIV, and others.

It begins by explaining the difficult printing conditions of 1611, showing how manual typesetting naturally introduced typographical errors simple mistakes later corrected by men who had worked on the original translation. By 1638, the majority of these adjustments were completed, and subsequent editions in 1762 and 1769 merely standardized spelling, not doctrine. The study lists examples of supposed “changes” (like “seek good” corrected to “seek God”), proving they were mechanical errors, not textual alterations. It also exposes how modern versions have made tens of thousands of substantive word changes, corrupting doctrine and diminishing divine authority. The conclusion is emphatic: there were no true revisions to the 1611 KJV only purification. The King James Bible remains the preserved, inspired Word of God in English, unaltered in meaning since its completion. All modern translation projects claiming continuity with it are deceitful. The authority of the KJV rests not in human scholarship or printers but in the power and promise of God Himself, who has kept His Word pure through every generation.

CHAPTER 9

Book 4 - Chapter 09 - Cults & False Religions

This chapter exposes the counterfeit systems that claim to represent God but operate in direct opposition to His Word. It identifies the spiritual roots, doctrines, and deceptive tactics of false religions that draw people away from the truth of the Gospel. “Cults and False Religions” dismantles the appearance of holiness that these movements present and reveals how each one either adds to, removes from, or redefines the Word of God.

The chapter examines well-known groups such as the World Mission Society Church of God, Mormonism, Jehovah’s Witnesses, Roman Catholicism, Wicca, and other pagan or occult systems. It shows that beneath their differences lies the same spirit of rebellion that denies the authority of Christ, replaces God’s commands with man-made traditions, and offers salvation through false mediators or works. Every religion, no matter how moral or sincere, is tested against the apostles’ doctrine and found wanting wherever it departs from Scripture.

B4-C09-S01 - Mother god - World Mission Society Church of God (WMSCOG or WMSCG)

This study thoroughly refutes the World Mission Society Church of God (WMSCOG) doctrine of a “Mother God,” exposing it as a false teaching that twists Scripture through modern corrupted Bible versions like the NIV and NLT. It begins by comparing Genesis 1:26–27 across translations, proving through Hebrew study that the word ’ādām refers specifically to the first man, not mankind in general. Therefore, the claim that both male and female were created “in the image of God” is rejected as a mistranslation, with the study affirming that only Adam was created directly in God’s image while Eve was formed from Adam’s rib as a helper.

The study then dismantles the WMSCOG’s misuse of Galatians 4:26 and Revelation 22:17. It explains that “Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all” refers metaphorically to the motherland or the heavenly origin of believers, not a literal female deity. Revelation’s “bride” is shown to represent the saints, not a divine woman. The WMSCOG’s teachings about Ahn Sahng-Hong as the second coming of Christ and his wife Zahng Gil-Jah as “God the Mother” are exposed as blasphemous heresies since Scripture declares that Christ’s return will be visible to every eye (Revelation 1:7). The study concludes by warning that the WMSCOG deceives through emotional appeal and corrupted texts, leading souls away from Christ, the only mediator between God and man. It calls all believers to stand firm on the preserved Word of God; the King James Bible and reject every counterfeit gospel that replaces truth with human invention

B4-C09-S02 - The Mormon Religion

This study dismantles the teachings of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (LDS), exposing the falsehoods behind Joseph Smith's revelations and the foundational contradictions within Mormon doctrine. It begins by analyzing official LDS booklets such as The Restoration of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, comparing their claims against the preserved Word of God. The study proves that Mormonism's view of Christ as merely "the Son of God" rejects the truth that He is the only begotten Son, a central distinction found in the King James Bible but removed from Alexandrian-based translations like the NIV and NLT.

It goes on to expose the LDS teaching of "following the prophets," showing that Scripture commands believers to follow only Christ, not men. The study rebukes the false claim that priesthood authority was lost from the earth and needed restoration, pointing to verses such as Matthew 16:18 and Ephesians 3:21 to prove the true Church never died out. It also exposes how Joseph Smith falsely claimed both the Aaronic and Melchizedek priesthoods, roles that no man but Christ alone could hold. The study then traces Smith's life, showing his contradictions claiming divine instruction not to join any church while later becoming a Freemason and notes that by his death he had amassed wealth and influence far from the humility of Christ. It concludes by warning that Mormonism's dependence on emotion, feelings, and human revelation contradicts biblical faith, which is grounded in obedience to Scripture, not subjective experience. Believers are called to test every spirit, reject emotional manipulation disguised as "personal revelation," and trust the Holy Ghost as the only teacher of truth. The closing message is clear: Joseph Smith was a false prophet, Mormonism is a counterfeit gospel, and salvation is found only through faith and obedience to the true Christ revealed in the preserved Word of God.

B4-C09-S03 - Wicca Witchcraft

This study presents a comprehensive biblical examination of Wicca and witchcraft, exposing it as a modern deception cloaked in moral language and nature worship. It begins by explaining that Wicca portrays itself as a peaceful, nature-based “white magic” religion, rejecting violence, Satan, and traditional evil imagery. However, it warns that this self-described purity is a façade, since the supernatural power Wiccans believe they are “tapping into” is not neutral energy from nature but the influence of demonic forces masquerading as light.

The study traces Wicca’s explosive growth, especially among youth, fueled by media such as Harry Potter, Charmed, and Buffy the Vampire Slayer. It documents how occult authors and organizations like Llewellyn Publications have exploited this fascination by producing books that openly train young readers in witchcraft. The paper connects these cultural trends to prophecy, warning that Scripture predicted a global rise in sorcery before Christ’s return. Through Scripture such as Acts 26:18, Revelation 21:8, and Romans 1:25, it contrasts the false spirituality of witchcraft with the truth of God’s Word, affirming that only two spiritual powers exist God and Satan and there is no neutral ground.

In closing, the study calls for compassion toward those ensnared by Wicca, emphasizing that they are not enemies but victims of deception. It urges Christians to respond not with condemnation but with truth and love, pointing Wiccans to the redemption found only in Christ. The conclusion declares that the battle between witchcraft and Christianity is not cultural but spiritual, and only Christ’s power can break the illusion of “white magic.”

B4-C09-S04 - Jehovah witnesses

This study traces the origins, teachings, and doctrinal errors of the Jehovah’s Witnesses, revealing how the movement departs from biblical truth. It explains that the group began in Pennsylvania in 1870 under Charles Taze Russell, who founded the “Millennial Dawn Bible Study.” His writings, later known as The Millennial Dawn series, became the foundation for what is now called the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society. After Russell’s death, Judge Joseph Rutherford took leadership, expanded the theology, and renamed the organization Jehovah’s Witnesses in 1931.

The study exposes their major doctrinal distortions: denying the divinity of Christ by claiming He is Michael the Archangel, teaching that salvation is achieved through faith and works, and rejecting the Trinity and the Holy Spirit’s personhood, reducing Him to an impersonal force. It rebukes their “ransom theory” of the atonement, which contradicts Scripture’s teaching that Christ died as the substitutionary sacrifice for sin. The New World Translation, their altered version of the Bible, is identified as a deliberate corruption of God’s Word, edited to sustain false doctrine rather than reveal truth.

It also exposes the Watchtower's authoritarian control, where followers are forbidden to interpret Scripture independently and must accept the governing body's decrees as final. The study calls this a direct violation of 2 Timothy 2:15, where believers are commanded to study the Word for themselves. The conclusion warns that while Jehovah's Witnesses are zealous in outreach, their message is built on deception. The final prayer is that their eyes may be opened to the true gospel of grace through Christ, the eternal Son of God, not a created being but the Lord Himself.

B4-C09-S04B - Questions for Jehovah witnesses

This study provides a historical and doctrinal analysis of the Jehovah's Witnesses, exposing the unbiblical foundations of their beliefs and their departure from true Christianity. It traces their origin to Charles Taze Russell, who began the Millennial Dawn Bible Study in Pennsylvania in 1870. His writings formed the core theology that later evolved into the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society. After his death, Judge Joseph Rutherford continued his work and renamed the movement Jehovah's Witnesses in 1931.

The study identifies several key heresies: Jehovah's Witnesses deny the divinity of Christ, teaching that He is merely Michael the Archangel—a created being rather than God incarnate. They also claim salvation is earned through a mixture of faith, works, and obedience instead of by grace through faith alone. They reject the Trinity and view the Holy Spirit not as a divine Person but as an impersonal force. Their “ransom theory” of atonement diminishes Christ's sacrifice to a transaction for Adam's sin rather than a full substitutionary payment for humanity's redemption.

The study further exposes the New World Translation as a corrupted version of Scripture, deliberately altered to fit their doctrine and conceal contradictions. The Watchtower governing body is revealed as an authoritarian hierarchy claiming exclusive power to interpret Scripture, forbidding members from independent study or disagreement—an outright violation of 2 Timothy 2:15 and the Berean model of testing truth by Scripture.

The conclusion acknowledges the zeal of Jehovah's Witnesses in spreading their message but warns that zeal does not equal truth. Their gospel is built on deception, their translation is perverted, and their Christ is counterfeit. The closing prayer is that God will open their eyes to the real gospel of Christ, the eternal Word made flesh, who alone saves by grace and truth.

B4-C09-S05 - Coptic Orthodox Church

This study presents a biblical critique of the Coptic Orthodox Church, examining its historical claims, sacramental theology, priesthood, intercession of saints, Marian devotion, infant baptism, and liturgical practices. It argues that although the Coptic Church claims apostolic roots through Mark, its current doctrines and rituals cannot be found in the apostolic record and therefore lack biblical authority. The study rejects prayers to Mary and the saints, priestly absolution, repeated Eucharistic sacrifice, ritual blessings, and the use of religious titles such as “Abuna,” asserting that these practices create unauthorized mediators between God and man. It further contends that infant baptism reverses the biblical order of repentance, faith, confession, and baptism, replacing personal belief with institutional tradition. The conclusion declares that the Coptic system substitutes ceremony for conversion, tradition for Scripture, and ritual for regeneration, and calls believers back to repentance, faith in Christ alone, baptism after belief, and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit as the true apostolic pattern.

B4-C09-S13 - Roman Catholicism

This study presents a thorough critique of Roman Catholicism, focusing on how its teachings on salvation, justification, and grace deviate from Scripture. It explains that while the Catholic Church claims to teach justification by grace through faith in Christ, it corrupts the truth by removing the word alone. By doing so, the Church redefines grace and faith to depend upon human effort and sacramental mediation rather than the finished work of Christ.

It exposes how Catholic theology teaches that Christ’s death merited grace but did not accomplish a complete atonement. This grace, according to Rome, is dispensed through the Church and its sacraments, enabling people to perform good works in cooperation with God. The study contrasts this with the biblical truth that salvation is a finished act, not an ongoing process of earning righteousness. It quotes theologians like Ludwig Ott and Robert Sungenis to show that Rome denies Christ’s sacrifice as fully sufficient, treating it instead as a partial appeasement that requires human cooperation and continual penance.

The conclusion emphasizes that this system transforms grace into a substance infused through rituals rather than the unearned favor of God freely given through faith. True justification, as revealed in Scripture, is a once-for-all declaration of righteousness based on Christ’s imputed merit, not on works, sacraments, or ongoing penance. The study condemns the Roman system as a theological counterfeit that undermines the cross by replacing divine accomplishment with human participation.

BOOK 5

Each chapter calls family members to stand individually accountable before YHWH rather than blaming one another. The study challenges passivity, counterfeit faith, and selfish leadership, insisting that a godly marriage rises or falls primarily on the husband's obedience to YHWH. It presses him to ask whether he truly seeks to please God above himself and whether he is keeping the vows he made before Heaven.

This study is to be read by the husband alone. He must not read it while watching to see if his wife is doing her part. He must not wait for her change before he obeys. He is accountable to YHWH for his role regardless of her response. False expectations destroy marriages when a man focuses on what she is failing to do. He must concentrate only on his obedience before God, not on managing hers.

B5-C01-S03 - The Wife as Helper in Covenant Order

This study teaches that a wife's role as helper is strength, dignity, and divine assignment, not weakness. It emphasizes submission as obedience to YHWH, not inferiority, and presents reverence, encouragement, faithfulness, and stewardship of the home as essential to covenant unity. The study warns against domination, contention, disrespect, and subtle rebellion, showing how a wife can either crown her husband with honor or undermine him through criticism and resistance. It calls women to guard their tongue, keep their vows, protect unity, and support their husband's leadership in raising children and pursuing righteousness.

This study is to be read by the wife alone. She must not read it while measuring whether her husband deserves her obedience. She must not wait for him to improve before she submits to YHWH. She answers to God for her role. False expectations grow when she focuses on his failures instead of her obedience. Her responsibility is before YHWH, not conditioned upon his performance.

BOOK 6

Book 6 - Spiritual Warfare

Book 6 confronts one of the most misunderstood and abused subjects within modern Christianity, spiritual warfare. While some ignore the reality of the spiritual realm entirely, others become consumed with fear, superstition, emotionalism, and unbiblical teachings concerning demons, deliverance, and spiritual power.
