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22 Things any Christian should know.

Please revise your knowledge, on all these verses, because there is a great chance that Satan has been hindering your walk by injecting lies through your pastors, loved ones and not so holy bibles.

Here are some basic things we should all know as "Christians."

Now check what your bible says and compare it to the provided verses!

You may be amazed of how many bibles change or delete content just to have more revised versions and therefore make more money.

1- Concerning Lucifer: Satan is styled the "accuser of the brethren" (Rev. 12:10; Job 1:6; Zech. 3:1), as seeking to uphold his influence among men by bringing false charges against Christians, with the view of weakening their influence and injuring the cause with which they are identified. He was regarded by the Jews as the accuser of men before God, laying to their charge the violations of the law of which they were guilty, and demanding their punishment.

Satan is the father of all lies, cults and indoctrination. Lucifer/Satan is a fallen angel who was cast out of heaven for his sin of pride and his desire to be God. Even though he was cast out of heaven, he still seeks to elevate his throne above God.

He counterfeits all that God does, "even bibles" hoping to gain the worship of the world and encourage opposition towards God's kingdom.

Satan is the ultimate source behind every false cult and world religion. Satan will do anything and everything in his power to oppose God and those who follow God. However, Satan's destiny is sealed with an eternity in the lake of fire.





Isaiah 14:12 (KJV) How art thou fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning! how art thou cut down to the ground, which didst weaken the nations! Some Bibles are blasphemous. "Morning star" is a term reserved for Jesus elsewhere, yet they have granted to Lucifer this title here. You will notice that it is an addition to the text, though Lucifer is left out. Does this imply Christ has fallen?

*Son of the morning or morning star refers to Jesus Christ, see Rev. 22:16

2- <u>Concerning the Cross:</u> Christ's great sacrifice not only became the atonement for man's sins, but it also became the victory that would defeat and overcome death, which would have otherwise been the inescapable fate of all men who are born under the curse of sin. Sin carries its own inescapable penalty, and that penalty is death.

Mark 10:21 (KJV) Then Jesus beholding him loved him, and said unto him, One thing thou lackest: go thy way, sell whatsoever thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and follow me. Some Bibles leave out the concept of "taking up the cross." Why?

3- <u>Concerning Confession:</u> Primarily is about Confessing Christ as our Lord and Saviour.

Matthew 10:32 (KJV) Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change the word from confess to acknowledge? They interpret instead of translating. Confess and acknowledge are two completely different things. confess is (sensed) to admit to the truth, particularly in the context of sins or crimes committed while acknowledge is to admit the knowledge of; to recognize as a fact or truth; to declare one's belief in; as, to acknowledge the being of a god.







Luke 12:8 (KJV) Also I say unto you, Whosoever shall confess me before men, him shall the Son of man also confess before the angels of God: Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change the word from confess to acknowledge.

1 John 4:3 (KJV) And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change the word from confess to acknowledge.

Romans 10:10 (KJV) For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change the word from confess to profess? They interpret instead of translating.

Confess and profess are two completely different things. confess is (sensed) to admit to the truth, particularly in the context of sins or crimes committed. while **profess** is to administer the vows of a religious order to (someone); to admit to a religious order (chiefly in passive)

When it comes to confession of sin, believers are told to confess their sins to God. God is faithful and just to forgive our sins as we confess them to Him. The word of God speaks of confessing our **faults or trespasses** "to one another," but this is not the same as confessing sins to a priest as the Roman Catholic Church teaches. Priests / church leaders are nowhere mentioned in the context of **James 5:16**.

Further, **James 5:16** does not link forgiveness of sins with the confession of sins "to one another."

James 5:16 (**KJV**) Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

Other Bibles change the word from faults to sins. They interpret instead of translating. Faults and sins are two completely different things. "Sin" and "fault" are two different words in the Greek. The word "sin" is translated from the word *harmatia* (G266), 172 times. The word *paraptoma* (G3900) is translated "fault, trespass, offense, fall." We see here two distinct words for two different kinds of offenses.





According to the word of God, we are to confess our sins to God in order to receive forgiveness from Him!

1 John 1:9 (**KJV**) If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Romans 14:11 (KJV) For it is written, As I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God. Once again some Bibles have changed confess to acknowledge which we know are two completely different things

4- <u>Concerning Salvation:</u> Salvation is defined as being delivered, by God's grace, from sin & its consequence of eternal punishment and being raised to newness of life in Christ.

Salvation comes to those who fulfill God's requirements for salvation. For example, believing is one requirement.

If we do not believe, will God give us His salvation? No, He will not. So, there we have one requirement. repentance is another example of His requirements. And there are a couple of more, so we all better make sure we know exactly what God is asking of us so we can meet or do all that He requires of us to receive His promised salvation. (See Study on "your salvation" for a better understanding).

Matthew 6:33 (KJV) But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Most Bibles deleted this part! Whose kingdom are we to seek?

Matthew 18:11 (KJV) For the Son of man is come to save that which was lost. Most New age Bibles delete or change this salvation verse from is to have. Is (is about being) Has is about Possessing.

Matthew 20:16 (KJV) So the last shall be first, and the first last: for many be called, but few chosen. Most New age Bibles omit this verse. They leave out half of Jesus' statement.







John 6:47 (KJV) Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me hath everlasting life. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. KJV is clear regarding the object of belief. Others obscure this to say anyone who believes. Does it matter what one believes or what they believe on?

Luke 4:4 (KJV) And Jesus answered him, saying, It is written, That man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God. Why would new age bibles delete or change this? Does it not matter what a believer lives by?

Acts 8:37 (KJV) And Philip said, If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. New age bibles tend to omit this complete verse. Why omit a confession of Christ? Trying to hide His true identity?

<u>5- Salvation by believing alone or faith alone:</u> There is still nowhere in the Holy and unholy bibles where it states that anyone can or will receive salvation "By believing **ALONE** or by faith **ALONE**."

Sadly, most churches are running with doctrines of devils and are choosing the product that sells the most seats in their church. All their congregants need to do is choose how they want to be saved and decide what product fits their lifestyle to choose their salvation. Whether it be once saved always saved, meaning they can continue in sin, no matter what. Or just saved by grace on which EVERYONE is automatically saved, no matter on their walk.

HOW WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE SAVED?

- By Grace "alone" (Acts 15:11, Eph 2:8-9, Titus 2:11) "For by grace are ye saved"
- By believing "alone", (Mark 16:16, Rom 10:9, Acts 16:31, Joh 3:16) "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved, and thy house"
- By hope "alone", Romans 8:24 (KJV) "For we are saved by hope"
- By works "alone". Acts 26:20, James 2:24 (KJV) "by works a man is justified, and not by faith only"





- By just by hearing "alone" (John 5:25) "they that hear shall live"
- By washing away our sins "alone" Washing our sins away? (Acts 22:16) "wash away thy sins"
- By just confession (Romans 10:9) "if thou shalt confess with thy mouth...... thou shalt be saved"
- By eating Christ's flesh and drinking His blood (John 6:54) "Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, hath eternal life"
- Better yet, just Calling out the name of the Lord (Acts 20:16, Rom 10:13) using the sinners prayer" that should be sufficient as to calling on the name of the Lord; right? ...

>>>>>**Dead wrong!**

Matthew 7:13 for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat:

This is very similar to the situation of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. God in Genesis 2:17 told them not to eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil, "For in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die." But Satan told Eve in Genesis 3:4, "Then the serpent said to the woman, you will not surely die." Satan only added the one word "not" to what God had said and completely changed the meaning. That is what men are doing to God's commands today. Who are you going to accept, the word of men or the Word of God?

1 Peter 3:20-21 (KJV) Which sometime were disobedient, when once the longsuffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls were saved by water. The like figure whereunto even baptism doth also now save us (not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God,) by the resurrection of Jesus Christ: (The answer of a clear conscience for us of doing what He told us to do!)

Ephesians 4:5 (KJV) One Lord, one faith, one baptism.

Numbers 19:7-9 (KJV) "for a water of separation: it is a purification for sin."





Acts 2:38 (KJV) Then Peter said unto them, Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

6- Remission of sins!

Without Remission of sins, there is **NO** salvation! Unless Christ shows Himself in person to you before you die and saves you in person!

What happened to remission of sins?

Why is the church preaching forgiveness of sins and NOT teaching and preaching remission of sins like Christ commanded us to do so?

Luke 24:47 (KJV) And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.

Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change the word remission?

Remission and forgiveness are two different things.

When you forgive someone, it does NOT mean you forget it ever happened. When you receive remission of sins it means God let's go as if they NEVER happened!

*The Biblical definition of **Remission** is to be released from bondage or imprisonment; forgiveness or pardon of sins (**letting them go as if they had never been committed**), remission of the penalty.

Romans 3:25 (KJV) Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God;

A- We know that we are given knowledge of salvation by the remission of sins. **Luke 1:77** (**KJV**) To give knowledge of salvation unto his people by the remission of their sins,

B- We know that without Christ sacrifice, there would be no remission of sins! **Hebrews 9:22 (KJV)** And almost all things are by the law purged with blood; and without shedding of blood is no remission.





C- We know that Christ sacrifice provides the remission of sins!

Mathew 26:28 (KJV) For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.

D- We know that whosoever believes in shall receive remission of sins. **Acts 10:43 (KJV)** To him give all the prophets witness, that through his name whosoever believeth in him shall receive remission of sins.

The problem here is that we know that salvation by believing ALONE is **NOT** biblical. So, the question remains, what other action do we need to do in order to receive remission of sins?

E- We are told clearly by Mark and Paul that we must Repent and be baptized for the remission of sins! Here it shows us what action we must take in order to receive remission of sins!

Acts 2:38 (KJV) Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

Mark 1:4 (KJV) John did baptize in the wilderness and preach the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins.

So, we have learned so far that believing, repenting and baptism are all necessary to receive remission for our sins! **Mark 16:16** also confirms the first and last thing we need to do to be saved. In the other hand, it also common since that anyone that does NOT believe will not follow up with anything else, specially baptism.

Mark 16:16 (KJV) he that believeth and is baptized shall be saved, he that believeth not shall be dammed.





<u>7- Repentance:</u> Repentance is not a work we do to earn salvation. No one can repent and come to God unless God pulls that person to Himself. Repentance is something God gives—it is only possible because of His grace. No one can repent unless God grants repentance. All of salvation, including repentance and faith, is a result of God drawing us, opening our eyes, and changing our hearts.

Matthew 9:13 (KJV) But go ye and learn what that meaneth, I will have mercy, and not sacrifice: for I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it?

Mark 2:17 (KJV) When Jesus heard it, he saith unto them, they that are whole have no need of the physician, but they that are sick: I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.

Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it?

8- Concerning Baptism: Water baptism is an essential part of salvation. Baptism **alone** does not save from sin, but it erases/cleanses away our sins so we can receive newness of life and the Holy Ghost within us.

Water baptism is done for the **REMMISION** of sins and not just forgiveness of our sins!

There is a great difference between forgiveness of sins and remission of sins!

Acts 2:37-42 (KJV) Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their heart, and said unto Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men and brethren, what shall we do? 38 Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. 39 For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call. 40 And with many other words did he testify and exhort, saying, Save yourselves from this untoward generation. 41 Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls. 42 And they continued stedfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers.





<u>9- Water:</u> God has always used water as a reagent for purification and cleansing of sins and therefore during baptism; it washes away our sins. (Washing and forgiveness are 2 different things)

The word of God tells us that in the **old testament** God used water as a regent for cleansing and purification!

Numbers 19:7-9 (KJV) "for a water of separation: it is a purification for sin."

Exodus 29:4 (KJV) And Aaron and his sons thou shalt bring unto the door of the tabernacle of the congregation, and shalt wash them with water.

Exodus 30:20 (KJV) When they go into the tabernacle of the congregation, they shall wash with water, that they die not;

Exodus 30:21 (KJV) So they shall wash their hands and their feet, that they die not:

Leviticus 22:6 (KJV) The soul which hath touched any such shall be unclean until even, and shall not eat of the holy things, unless he wash his flesh with water.

God tells us in the **New testament** that God **STILL** uses water as a regent for cleansing and purification of sins!

Acts 2:38 (KJV) Then Peter said unto them, Repent and **be baptized** every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

Acts 8:38 (KJV) And he commanded the chariot to stand still: and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him.

Acts 22:16 (KJV) And now why tarriest thou? arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord.

Titus 3:5 (KJV) Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost;





10- Worship: True worship is not confined to what we do in church or open praise (although these things are both good, and we are told in the Bible to do them). True worship is the acknowledgment of God and all His power and glory in everything we do. The highest form of praise and worship is obedience to Him and His Word. To do this, we must know God; we cannot be ignorant of Him. Worship is to glorify and exalt God—to show our loyalty and admiration to our Father. Worship is to study His word and applied it into our lives.

Matthew 9:18 (KJV) While he spake these things unto them, behold, there came a certain ruler, and worshipped him, saying, My daughter is even now dead: but come and lay thy hand upon her, and she shall live. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? they changed "worshipped" to "fell on his knees in front of". This is interpretation, not translation.

Matthew 18:26 (KJV) The servant therefore fell down, and worshipped him, saying, Lord, have patience with me, and I will pay thee all. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it?

Matthew 20:20 (KJV) Then came to him the mother of Zebedees children with her sons, worshipping him, and desiring a certain thing of him. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? They Change the concept of "worship" to that of "kneeling." Again!

Mark 5:6 (KJV) But when he saw Jesus afar off, he ran and worshipped him, Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? they changed "worshipped" to "fell on his knees in front of". This is interpretation, not translation.

<u>11- Prayer:</u> Prayer is something that we all should want to do on a daily basis. Daily prayer with God is daily fellowship with our heavenly Father. It is truly amazing that God would want to have fellowship with us at all.

Mark 9:29 (KJV) And he said unto them, This kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does





your bible omit or change it? The concepts of obedience, spiritual wakefulness, and prayer are all removed. They demonstrate its anti-fasting philosophy.

Mark 13:33 (KJV) Take ye heed, watch and pray: for ye know not when the time is. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? The concepts of obedience, spiritual wakefulness, and prayer are all removed in all new age bibles.

Luke 11:2 (KJV) And he said unto them, When ye pray, say, Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, as in heaven, so in earth. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? They have a specific reason for leaving out the "in heaven" part. Catholics pray to the pope as "Father" but he is not in heaven! This would be too clearly a reference to God Himself if they did not change this verse!

Matthew 17:21 (KJV) Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Perhaps the New Age bible translators do not wish to promote prayer and fasting.

Act 14:23 (KJV) And when they had ordained them elders in every church, and had prayed with fasting, they commended them to the Lord, on whom they believed.

<u>12- Fasting:</u> Scripture does not command Christians to fast. God does not require or demand it of Christians. At the same time, the Bible presents fasting as something that is good, profitable, and beneficial. By taking our eyes off the things of this world, we can more successfully turn our attention to Christ. Fasting is not a way to get God to do what we want. Fasting changes us, not God. Fasting is not a way to appear more spiritual than others. Fasting is to be done in a spirit of humility and a joyful attitude.

Matthew 17:21 (KJV) Howbeit this kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Again, Perhaps the New age translators do not wish to promote prayer and fasting.





Mark 9:29 (KJV) And he said unto them, This kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Once again, they demonstrate its anti-fasting philosophy.

13- Sacrifice: We are to sacrifice our lives to Christ.

Mark 9:49 (KJV) For everyone shall be salted with fire, and every sacrifice shall be salted with salt. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? The significance of Jesus' words can never be understood if they are never read! Yet the translators dare to leave out, once again, something they must have seen as unimportant. Do they truly think Jesus had no reason for speaking?

14- The Trinity:

1 John 5:7 (KJV) For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? New age bibles attack the Trinity.

15- Christ's Divinity:

Matthew. 1:25 (KJV) And knew her not till she had brought forth her firstborn son: and he called his name JESUS. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? As a virgin, Jesus must have been a firstborn. They leave it open as to whether or not she had had other children previously, perhaps by another man, thus a subtle blow to Christ's divinity.

Luke 2:33 (KJV) And Joseph and his mother marveled at those things which were spoken of him. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Was Joseph Jesus' father? New Age Bibles again obscure the virgin birth, another attack on the divinity of Christ. Additionally, the Greek contains the word "Ioseph", and there is simply no excuse for translators to leave it out.

Luke 2:43 (KJV) And when they had fulfilled the days, as they returned, the child Jesus tarried behind in Jerusalem; and Joseph and his mother knew not of it. Most

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Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Again, they would have you believe that Joseph was Jesus' father, instead of preserving the truth of Jesus' birth to Mary the virgin.

Luke 23:42 (KJV) And he said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Again, other bibles leave out the concept of Jesus' Lordship.

John 3:16 (KJV) For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? The term "only begotten" has great significance. It means that Christ is the only one of the Godhead to have ever been born as a son. To say He is God's only Son contradicts other verses which say we can be the sons of God (see John 1:12).

John 4:42 (KJV) And said unto the woman, Now we believe, not because of thy saying: for we have heard him ourselves, and know that this is indeed the Christ, the Saviour of the world. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? (Yes, the word "Christ" appears in the Greek text.)

<u>16- Christ's Lordship:</u> When a person yields to the lordship of Jesus Christ, he or she acknowledges His ownership and gives up his or her personal rights. Yielding to the lordship of Jesus Christ also involves total and unreserved obedience. If He is the Lord of your life, you are going to do what He tells you to do.

Mark 11:10 (KJV) Blessed be the kingdom of our father David, that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? They change the kingdom from present to future, thereby denying Jesus' present Lordship.

Luke 23:42 (KJV) And he said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Again, most new age religion translators leave out the concept of Jesus' Lordship.





John 3:16 (KJV) For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? The term "only begotten" has great significance. It means that Christ is the only one of the Godhead to have ever been born as a son. For New Age translator to say He is God's only Son contradicts other verses which say we can be the sons of God (see John 1:12).

John 4:42 (KJV) And said unto the woman, Now we believe, not because of thy saying: for we have heard him ourselves, and know that this is indeed the Christ, the Saviour of the world. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? It just makes me sick to think that translators of God's Holy Word would really work this hard to remove references to His Son from the book! (Yes, the word "Christ" appears here in the Greek text.)

John 6:69 (KJV) And we believe and are sure that thou art that Christ, the Son of the living God. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? New age agenda translators choose to leave out the full identification of Christ

John 10:30 (KJV) I and my Father are one. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Whose Father?

Acts 2:30 (KJV) Therefore being a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him, that of the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh, he would raise up Christ to sit on his throne; Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Really, why did they omit this?

Acts 3:13 (KJV) his Son Jesus

Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it?







17- Christ's Prophecy:

Matthew 27:35 (KJV) And they crucified him, and parted his garments, casting lots: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, They parted my garments among them, and upon my vesture did they cast lots. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? New age bibles separate out the fact of fulfilled prophecy regarding Jesus Christ's death. This is another direct attack on His Messiahship.

Mark 15:28 (KJV) And the scripture was fulfilled, which saith, And he was numbered with the transgressors. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? They decided to Omit the fulfillment of prophecy.

John 9:4 (KJV) I must work the works of Him that sent me. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? I is for Jesus Christ not for anyone else!

<u>18- Forgiveness:</u> Christ is our example for all attitude and conduct in life, and His example and His commandments go hand in hand. That is why we are commanded both to seek forgiveness and to forgive.

Matthew 5:44 (KJV) But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you; Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? New age translators Slice out most of the verse! Perhaps the translators thought Jesus' words too boring.

Matthew 6:13 (KJV) And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Some Bibles remove to a footnote the identification of God's authority. Some even admit the change from "evil" (sin) to "evil one" (the devil) may be unfounded.

Matthew 9:13 (KJV) But go ye and learn what that meaneth, I will have mercy, and not sacrifice: for I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.

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Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Most Bibles do not recognize the need for repentance.

Mark 11:26 (KJV) But if ye do not forgive, neither will your Father which is in heaven forgive your trespasses. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? WOW, Satan through the New age translators have completely omitted this critical issue relative to our salvation. These were Jesus' own words. Was Jesus not important enough to be heard?

Colossians 1:14 (KJV) In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins: Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Where is the blood in the other bibles? Without the shedding of blood there is no remission

19- Miracles: Yes, God still performs miracles in a personal level with each believer.

Mark 16:9-20 (KJV) Now when Jesus was risen early the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had cast seven devils. And she went and told them that had been with him, as they mourned and wept. And they, when they had heard that he was alive, and had been seen of her, believed not.

After that he appeared in another form unto two of them, as they walked, and went into the country.

And they went and told it unto the residue: neither believed they them.

Afterward he appeared unto the eleven as they sat at meat, and upbraided them with their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they believed not them which had seen him after he was risen.

And he said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every creature.

He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned.

And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues;

They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover.





So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, he was received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God.

And they went forth, and preached every where, the Lord working with them, and confirming the word with signs following. Amen. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Sometimes they leave it, but put a note in it stating, "this was an addition, it was never on the original scrolls" LIES and Lies... Which two MSS do they mean? If we look at the Note in the NKJV beside this same passage we see: "They are lacking in Codex Siniaticus and Codex Vaticanus, although nearly all other manuscripts of Mark contain them."

John 5:4 (KJV) For an angel went down at a certain season into the pool, and troubled the water: whosoever then first after the troubling of the water stepped in was made whole of whatsoever disease he had. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Again, they omit this without any mention. Is this to reduce the belief in the supernatural? Might that also be the reason behind the footnote for Luke 22:43?

<u>20- Spiritual warfare:</u> We rely on God's power, not our own. We put on the whole armor of God. We draw on the power of Scripture—the Word of God is the Spirit's sword. We pray in perseverance and holiness, making our appeal to God.

Luke 4:4 (KJV) And Jesus answered him, saying, It is written, That man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Other Bibles Misquote Jesus during His temptation. The part omitted is crucial to His reason for making the statement as our example for how to face trials.

Luke 4:8 (KJV) And Jesus answered and said unto him, Get thee behind me, Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? They have excluded the command forms of "thou shalt" which show Jesus was being obedient to God's command instead of falling prey to temptation. It also omits Jesus' command to Satan.

Luke 9:55 (KJV) But he turned, and rebuked them, and said, Ye know not what manner of spirit ye are of. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part.

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Does your bible omit or change it? And here, again, the reason of the rebuke is lighten, leaving us to question Jesus' response.

21- The Holy Spirit and His power: We rely on God's power, not our own. We put on the whole armor of God. We draw on the power of Scripture—the Word of God is the Spirit's sword

1 John 5:7 (KJV) For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one. Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it? Here most Bibles will take away the trinity.

John 14:16 (KJV) And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; Most Bibles will change or omit the highlighted part. Does your bible omit or change it?

22- About deviating from the Apostles teachings:

Luke 13:23-24 (KJV) Then said one unto him, Lord, are there few that be saved? And he said unto them, Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able.

One of the reasons why many will seek and strive to enter at the straight gate and shall not be able is due to blindness and lack of knowledge in the word of God. It is also due to lies and indoctrination. It is brought by Satan through unbiblical teachings by our pastors, ancestors and their customs. We need to put pride aside and question every teaching and

accept the truth that Christ has for us. We need to turn away from the infinity of lies Satan has for us.

What did Jesus Christ "teach" His apostles and disciples?

Teach all nations what?







"To continue steadfastly in the apostle's doctrine" in verse 42 And the reason for baptism, which is for the remission of your sins and the receiving of the Holy Ghost in verse 38.

Acts 2:37-42 (KJV) Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their heart, and said unto Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men and brethren, what shall we do? 38 Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. 39 For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call. 40 And with many other words did he testify and exhort, saying, Save yourselves from this untoward generation. 41 Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls. 42 And they continued stedfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers.

Now, when did all this change. Why did the apostles not stop/change their doctrine during or after Christ was Glorified or after Pentecost?

When did the apostle's doctrine about salvation stop and started becoming only about faith alone or believing alone or that it ends in the cross just and only by accepting Christ.

2 Timothy 4:3 (**KJV**) For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears;

There is nothing in the bible that tells us that the apostle's doctrine has changed. Only Satan wants you to believe that. Satan wants you to be short of salvation and will even give you the feeling of euphoria and happiness and will even throw in some miracles to maintain you BELIEVING you have received salvation.

For Satan it is better for you to stop sin in most areas and learn other truths from the word of God than seeing and knowing the primary truth of salvation. Because without salvation, it does not matter how much you know or follow Gods word. Satan will still win because you never got saved and will not make it inside the gates of heaven.







The doctrine of the apostles is a direct teaching of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ in connection to eternal life. Anything different are doctrines of devils and therefore we must not deviate from it!

1 Timothy 4:1 (KJV) Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils;

"He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches."





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
