Today's Jesus House is more than a shelter, it is a hub of community support which helps the homeless, hungry and poverty-stricken of Oklahoma City. Jesus House is an inner-city, non-denominational Christian outreach to the homeless, near homeless, addicted, and mentally ill. We spread the love of Christ by providing food, shelter, clothing, and assistance to those in need. We serve Oklahoma City's needy with integrity and in a manner that exemplifies our commitment to the love of Jesus Christ and biblical principles of stewardship.

WAYS TO SERVE

Under our ministry model, anyone can help. From financial contributions and the donation of used clothing and furniture, to volunteer programs that are centered around service, love and relationship-building. We're also seeking involvement from churches, businesses, families and school groups that want to come and directly serve homeless and low income people in our community through the Love Thy Neighbor Street Ministry. Volunteer groups will need to provide their own table, chairs and supplies. Suggestions for handouts: hygiene packs, socks, can openers, cupcakes, sandwiches, hot dogs, soda, bottled water, clothes, shoes, sleeping bags, combs, sunscreen, candy, underwear, coats, and blankets. Love Thy Neighbor happens on the second Saturday of each month from 10:00am-12:00pm at 1335 W. Sheridan Avenue in Oklahoma City.

TurningPoint is a faith-based ministry providing quality, affordable housing for qualified individuals or families in Edmond, Oklahoma. Our purpose is to develop new neighborhoods and build new homes for modest-income clients who work in or need to live in Edmond.

WAYS TO SERVE

Volunteers are needed to help with interior and exterior painting, construction clean-up, and final clean-up in our neighborhood, Heritage Village. Heritage Village is on the west side of Fretz, between 2nd street and Danforth. Individuals or groups are encouraged to volunteer. The volunteer coordinator can generally coordinate a work day for a group 2 weeks in advance. Scheduling with more advance notice than 2 weeks is not possible due to the nature of construction schedules. We can accommodate a group of about 15 people.

Opportunities for groups, depending on our current needs and project availability. Prior training and background checks are not always required. We require that all volunteers be at least 16 years old. If under the age of 18, volunteers must be accompanied by a legal guardian at all times. Exceptions may be made for high school seniors on a case-by-case basis. Minors can participate in collection projects or host their own fundraiser or special project. Lunch is served Monday - Friday at 11:30 am but we have a specific need for help on Fridays. The volunteer shift is from 11:00am-12:00pm and volunteers are tasked with organizing packaged goods for serving, helping to serve food on the food line with instruction from certified food handlers, and cleaning the dining area after members are finished eating. Volunteers may also help bring meals from the kitchen to the table for those seniors who aren't mobile.

Volunteer qualifications are; at least eighteen (18) years of age, capable of standing for long periods, able to lift at least 20 lbs., and demonstrate the ability to work well with others. Volunteers must wear a disposable apron, hair net/ hat and latex/plastic gloves (all provided).

WAYS TO SERVE

Group volunteer opportunities come in two-hour shifts and are available Tuesday through Saturday. Weekday shifts are either 10am-12pm in the morning or 2-4pm in the afternoon. Saturday the shift is from 10am-12pm. Saturdays do fill up more quickly. Our maximum number per group is 15 people. Our groups work mainly in our temperature-controlled warehouse either packing diapers, making food packs, hanging and folding clothes, restocking our shelves, rolling pajamas, or sorting donations. These “at risk” kids face daily pressures of school violence, gangs, crime, and fragmented homes. Shiloh offers year-round programming for at-risk children and their families. Shiloh Camp targets our camping experience to disadvantaged kids who live in Oklahoma City and the surrounding area. We provide a great opportunity for young people to experience the love of God and discover His purpose for their lives. Shiloh Camp desires that each child know, without a doubt, that they are important, valued and loved. Kids who are served by the OK Messages Project, serving children of incarcerated parents, often attend camp.

WAYS TO SERVE

Adventure Day Camp is held mid-June from 9am-2pm. Volunteers can serve in a variety of areas; small group leaders to guide kids to activity stations, volunteers to serve at activity stations like zip line, welcome/registration table, distributing backpacks, books and school supplies, arts and crafts, cooking/serving lunch, and more. We want to ensure the kids remain hydrated throughout the day so donations of water bottle cases is another way to serve. Small group leaders have about six kids within a particular age group in their care on camp day, depending on how many kids attend camp.

MISSION

Edmond Mobile Meals in Edmond, Oklahoma is a non-profit charitable organization, and has operated independently since 1974. We provide hot, nourishing meals to elderly and disabled persons who are unable to prepare meals for themselves. The meals and daily contact by caring volunteers allow frail, homebound persons to remain independent and in their own homes. Mobile Meals requires a team effort of volunteers of all ages, from retired to young adults. Some help every week, while others volunteer once a month. The generous support of the people of the community, churches, the City of Edmond, and the civic and social organizations has been tremendous.

WAYS TO SERVE

Kitchen Volunteers: Monday – Friday, 8am-11am

A meal preparation volunteer helps cook, package the meals in time for delivery, and clean the kitchen. No professional cooking experience is required, and cooking is done each day in groups of 4–5.

Delivery Volunteers: Monday – Friday, 10:30am-12:30pm

On weekdays, meal delivery volunteers use their own cars and gas to bring hot meals to homebound individuals in the community. Volunteers can deliver as often as their schedules allow. Corporate and group routes are also available.

Weekend Meal Preparation Volunteers: Thursday afternoon

Volunteers will help prepare & package a weekend meal that is delivered on Friday with our regular meal delivery.

MISSION

The Urban Mission is a non-profit formed in 1972 when the congregation of Second Presbyterian Church was dissolved. Trustees of the property decided to leave the building as a type of neighborhood outreach center. In 2000, The Urban Mission moved to our current location at 3737 N. Portland. This move gave the organization the space to help many more people. The Urban Mission assists approximately 20,000 people each year in the Oklahoma City metro area. Our funds are secured from private, individual donations.

WAYS TO SERVE

Shopping Helper: Assist clients with making their food choices in the food resource center. This can include helping push their cart or bag items. Mon–Thurs: 1PM to 4PM. Volunteers are encouraged to come and go as they please during these times.

Stocker: Unbox food and organize it on the shelves. Make sure that the shelves are full and look nice; everything is located in the proper section and it is facing the correct direction. Some heavy lifting. Serve anytime from 9AM to 1PM.

Waiting Room Host: Keep client paperwork in order while clients wait for their turn to shop. This position is needed the same hours as a Shopping Helper.

Tutor: Help students (K-6) in our after school program with their homework. This could include reading with the students or helping them with any other homework they might have. Mon–Thurs from 3PM to 6PM.
