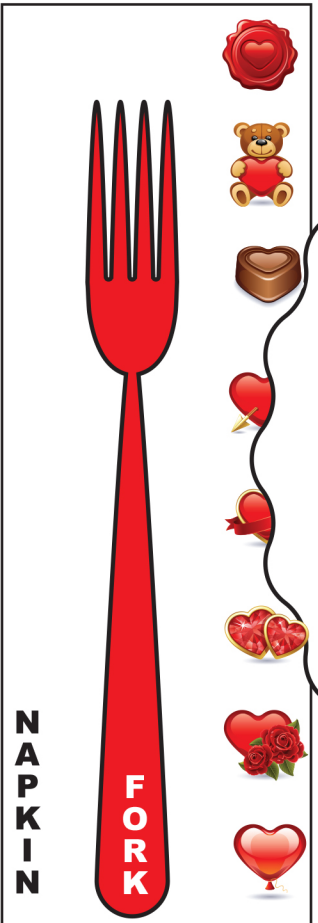
What person in history do you admire the most?

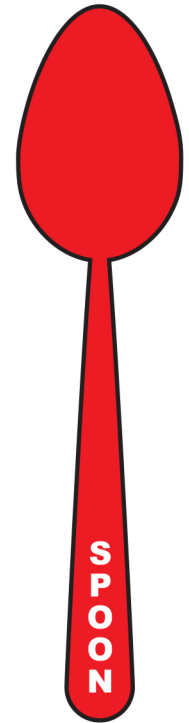


KNIFE

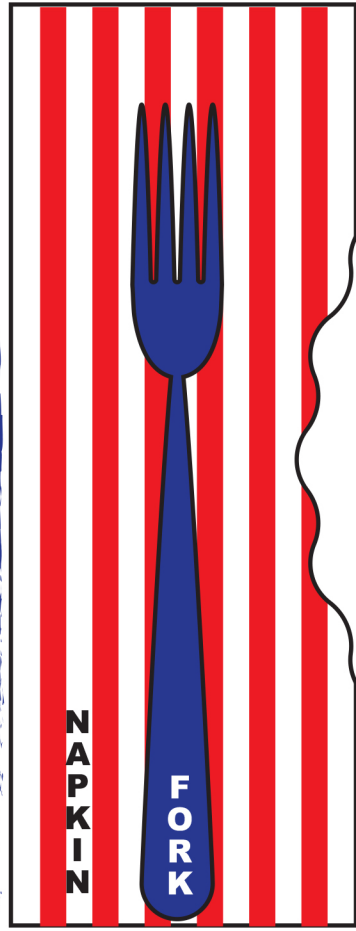
