Save Elm Thicket Forces Builder to Comply with Dallas Sidewalk Code Requirements

Did you know all new home construction in Dallas requires builders to put in new sidewalks even if no sidewalks existed prior to construction? And if the sidewalk on the street corner does not have a curb cut for wheelchair access, then the builder must also put that in to improve pedestrian safety.

When Save Elm Thicket saw that the builder at the corner of Newmore Ave. and Kaywood Dr. was not complying with these code requirements, they contacted Code Compliance who then forwarded the report to the City Public Works department. The city then made the builder go back to the newly-poured curb and install a curb cut and complete the sidewalk all the way to the street corner. The city is also making sure the builder installs a sidewalk that continues along the Kaywood Dr. side of the property to comply with city code..

Save Elm Thicket is always grateful when neighbors point out issues like this to us. We are happy to followup with the city to make our neighborhood sidewalks are accessible and safe for all of us.

Extended Neighborhood Patrol Survey Seeks Your Input

The Elm Thicket/Northpark Enhanced Neighborhood Patrol (ENP) Program, being organized by concerned neighbors, is looking for 10 more households to participate so they can finalize their budget and begin additional police patrols before the holiday season begins.

The ENP is a program where neighborhoods contract with the Dallas Police Department to hire off-duty officers for increased patrols. The ENP program aims to increase police presence, reduce crime, and improve communication between residents and law enforcement.

There is a cost to the program, however, but participation is completely voluntary. No homeowner will be required to participate. The more neighbors that participate, though, the lower the cost will be per home. If you are interested in learning more, scan the QR code or click the image to go to the survey website.



Keep ETNP Looking Nice and Report Bandit Signs to 311

For many years, the Elm Thicket/Northpark neighborhood has been targeted by ugly "bandit signs" posted in public parkways and utility poles with messages like, "We Buy Junk Cars, Sell Us Your Ugly Home," etc.. With the passage of a new Texas law that went into effect Sept. 1, the enforcement of penalties for these illegal signs just got easier. The advertisers, not just those who place the signs, can be fined between \$1000 and \$5000 per offense.

As *ETNP News* reported in December 2024 (<u>click here</u>), there is a way to report these signs to the City of Dallas to have them removed. Now, the owner can be fined if they do not comply with any removal notice issued.

To have these eyesores removed, call 311 and notify the city of a "Code Concern" that involves these types of signs posted in public right of ways and utility poles. The only exception is if these signs are placed on private property. When calling, be sure to provide a specific location/street intersection.

If you have the Dallas 311 app, you can also submit it under Code Concerns --> Nuisance --> Signs.



With this new Texas law that makes it easier to hold the advertisers accountable, neighbors should be happy to see these ugly signs disappear completely from our beloved neighborhood.
