Hilliard Memorial Golf Course Historical Marker Closer to Unveiling

The process of getting a new Texas Historical Marker commemorating the 9-hole Hilliard Memorial Golf Course placed in Ellum Thicket took another step forward with the marker order being sent to the foundry to be cast earlier this year.

The Hilliard Memorial Golf Course was billed as the first municipal golf course open for African-Americans in the South when it opened on April 16, 1950. The course was named to honor Thomas J. Hilliard who advocated for a city golf course for African-Americans to use

while he was working in the Greens
Department of the Cedar Crest Country
Club. There, he organized times for AfricanAmericans to play during the country club's
off days and times when it was closed to
members. He then went on to organize the
first exhibition match for Dallas AfricanAmerican golfers and the formation of the
Dallas Negro Golfers association.

Sadly, Mr. Hilliard passed away before his dream of having a municipal golf course for African American golfers was created. His widow, however, was there at the opening ceremony to help cut the ribbon on the course along with other city dignitaries.

As Ellum Thicket prepares for another Juneteenth celebration, it is important to note that the Hilliard Memorial Golf Course was a source of pride within the community. Seventy-five years ago, the golf course hosted a Juneteenth (Emancipation Day) celebration complete with a parade, speeches, a carnival, refreshments, singing, baseball, and – of course – a golf tournament.

Although the Hilliard Memorial Golf Course was demolished between 1954 and 1955 to

OVER 800 PEOPLE ATTENDED THE COURSE'S DEDICATION ON APRIL 16, 1950. THOSE IN ATTENDANCE INCLUDED DALLAS CITY OFFICIALS, DALLAS NEGRO GOLF ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT LEO SHEAD, NEGRO CHAMBER OF COMMERCE REPRESENTATIVE JAMES TAYLOR, ELM THICKET RESIDENTS AND ENTHUSIASTS FROM AROUND THE STATE AND NATION. THE NEW SITE CONTINUED TO DRAW VISITORS, TOURNAMENTS AND NEWSPAPER HEADLINES. NOTABLE GOLFERS INCLUDED V.W. ROSS AND IKE OLIVER. HILLIARD HOSTED A JUNETEENTH CELEBRATION IN 1950. EVEN AS THE COURSE GREW IN POPULARITY, LOVE FIELD EXPERIENCED UNFORESEEN GROWTH. A JANUARY 1953 BOND ELECTION PROVIDED FUNDS TO EXPAND THE CITY'S AIRPORTS, LOVE FIELD'S PLAN EXPANDED INTO THE SITE OCCUPIED BY THE GOLF COURSE'S PRO SHOP AND FOUR OF THE NINE HOLES. AFTER THE PRO SHOP CLOSED, THE PARKS DEPARTMENT WAIVED ALL FEES AND GOLFERS CONTINUED TO ENJOYTHE COURSE, EVEN THOUGH THEY HAD TO BRING THEIR OWN EQUIPMENT. ON MAY 17, 1954, BULL DOZERS RAZED PORTIONS OF HILLIARD AS GOLFERS CONTINUED TO PLAY THEIR ROUNDS. FURTHER EXPANSIONS IN 1955 ERASED THE COURSE ENTIRELY, DURING ITS YEARS OF OPERATION, HILLIARD MEMORIAL GOLF COURSE STOOD AS A BEACON OF BLACK RESILIENCY AND ATHLETICISM IN THE FACE OF JIM CROW SEGREGATION OF PUBLIC FACILITIES. MARKER IS PROPERTY OF THE STATE OF TEXAS

make way for the Love Field expansion, this Texas Historical Marker will continue to remind us all of the legacy of this historic freedmen's community.

No time for the unveiling ceremony has been announced given that the historical marker has yet to be delivered to the Elm Thicket/Northpark Neighborhood Association who is leading the effort. The marker is set to be placed at Mable Street and Thedford Avenue in the cityowned parkway next to Lemmon Avenue and across the street from the Frontiers of Flight museum, according to the paperwork filed with the state.

Once an unveiling time is announced, ETNP News will communicate the time to our readers.


