

## DART Holding Public Hearing July 8 Concerning Possible Service Reductions and Fee Changes

You have the opportunity to voice your opinion on DART eliminating service routes and changing their fees at a public hearing to be held July 8 at DART Headquarter, 1401 Pacific Ave, Dallas, at 6 pm. The Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART) Board of Directors has called for a Public Hearing to hear from the community on the potential changes that could go into effect in January 2026.

DART is proposing several changes which include the elimination of 9 bus routes, the reduction of the frequency of bus and rail service,



and the increase in fares for ADA Paratransit services. More information on all the proposed changes can be found on the DART website (<u>click here</u>).

These changes are the result of sales tax revenue being redistributed to other member cities that are served by DART which means there is less money for Dallas services. DART has stated that they are proposing the largest service cuts in their history.

For those who rely or has a friend or family member who relies on DART services to get to and from work, doctor appointments, grocery store trips, and to do other necessary activities, they are encouraged to attend the public hearing to be held at the DART Headquarters at 1401 Pacific Ave, Dallas, TX 75202, on Tuesday, July 8, at 6:00 pm.
