Phone Tree

If you want to receive notifications of crimes, emergencies, and neighborhood-wide events, be sure your phone number is registered in our W-PP phone tree. Cell phone numbers will receive notifications via text while home numbers will receive a recorded phone call. Steve Foster is our phone tree coordinator. Please submit requests to be added to the system or to remove or change a phone number to Steve.

If you have been the victim of a crime, we would like to warn our neighbors, but you must inform us before we can do a broadcast. You can contact Steve Foster (coordinator) at 225-328-8424 or email <u>steven-liz91@gmail.com</u> or David Carnes (Crime Prevention) at 225-266-4822 or email <u>davidcarnes@cox.net</u>.

When you receive a call or text from our phone tree, the call will be identified as coming from 877-565 -8456. Put that number into your contacts so you will not think it is spam. If you call that number from a phone that is registered in our system you will hear a replay of the most recent message (provided it is within 7 days of the broadcast). The system will attempt to call your phone three different times. If your line is busy or you have no answering machine, you will not receive the phone tree message. We generally do not do a follow-up message, but if a crime has occurred someone on the crime prevention board usually does a post in Nextdoor.com with more details and follow-up. Thank You! Real Estate Recap for 2020

No one knew what to expect would happen with real estate during the pandemic lockdown. Much to our surprise, real estate not only survived but thrived and exceeded all expectations last year. Sales in East Baton Rouge surpassed those in 2019, and today inventory is down by nearly 1000 properties.

Westminster-Pine Park experienced the same increased activity. Since last March, 32 homes have sold in Westminster/Pine Park (24 sold in 2019). The average sales price was \$259,000, with an average of 36 days on market before contract. At press time there are only 2 active on the market, and 2 are currently pending.

W-PP continues to have a strong following with consistent demand. Thank you to our neighbours for helping to make W-PP a wonderful place to call home ... a home to welcome new babies, celebrate holidays and birthdays, and support one another during hurricanes and ice storms.
