## Village of Wayne

Regular Council Meeting MAY 17<sup>TH</sup>, 2017

The meeting was brought to order by Mayor Everett and the pledge of allegiance was said. Roll call was read: Ault present, Gross absent, Bechstein present, Camden present, Zeigler absent, and Stearns present. Minutes were approved as read. Bechstein moved and Camden second to turn all bills over to finance and to pay all those found favorable. All yeah, M/C.

Deb Brooks discussed about a graduation party on June 17<sup>th</sup> and asking about closing the alley part way. Council agreed as long as neighbors have no issues with the partial alley closing.

Camden moved and Ault second to approve the posting for Village Asst. Seasonal position recommended by Human Resource Comm. All yeah, M/C. Council was shown the electrical quote and concrete quote for park shelter houses. Council would like a few more quotes on the concrete work. Camden moved and Ault second to approve Stahl Electric quote for \$2,400 for new wiring, outlets, etc. for the park shelter houses. All yeah, M/C. Camden moved and Bechstein second to pass Resolution 5-17-170: Increase General Fund 1000-320-430 to \$5,000 (Increase of \$2,500) for electrical work. Motion passed 3:1.

Camden brought up a complaint that was brought to her attention. Issue at Watson St./South St. corners about parking and unable to see oncoming traffic at stop signs. Camden also brought up about the meeting situation in June on Wednesday and discussed about holding on Tuesdays. Council approved to moving the Council Meetings for June only to the 1st & 3rd Tues. at 7:00 p.m.

Police Chief Cory Fairbanks reported some updates on nuisance properties, discussed code enforcement, and will look into parking issues on Watson/South Streets, etc. Stearns reported about loud trucks/vehicles at night.

Joe had nothing to report. Everett reported that Village of Wayne does have a 300foot zone around the well pumps that no chemicals are aloud. However, waiting on a return call from EPA on what chemical are approved to use.

Had 1<sup>st</sup> reading of Ordinance 6-17-708: Street Lighting for 2018 \$14,000.00. Everett with speak with Speweik about animal/livestock ordinance. Stearns discussed about trees uptown, etc. Everett will look into. Council approved the Human Resource Committee to hire who they believe is suitable for the part time seasonal position.

No further business, Bechstein moved and Stearns second to adjourn. All yeah, M/C.
