//Subject: Orphan Number Nineteen//

Number Nineteen differs greatly from the other subjects acquired by Site Nine's F.T.F. Capture Operatives. For reasons unknown, whether redacted or simply lost to the foster care system through her multiple household transfers, Number Nineteen only appears to have a first name, that being "Samantha".

After a brief look at her sparse records, and with minor testing, I was able to conclude that Number Nineteen has never once been to a medical practitioner's office. Medical evaluations of the girl seem to indicate that she has never been immunized. However, more pressingly, we've deduced that she suffers from Type One Osteogenesis Imperfecta, or in Layman's Terms, "Brittle Bone Disease". It's nothing short of a miracle that this girl is still standing, let alone able to walk.

Psychologically, Number Nineteen appears to be entirely indifferent to the presence of other individuals. Even when placed in the cafeteria with the other subjects, she has made no effort to befriend or even communicate with any of them. She also appears entirely uncaring, or unaware, that she's even been abducted by the Foundation.

Throughout my evaluation of Number Nineteen, it was brought to my attention by F.T.F. Agent ██████ that Administrator Ford specifically sought out and sent F.T.F. Capture Operatives to secure the girl. I spoke with Administrator Ford's second, Director Lois Sheridan, with hopes of acquiring additional insight as to why. However, she provided no concrete answer.

My largest concern surrounding Number Nineteen is whether or not she'll survive "*The Process*", as Doctor Sterling Magnus put it. As far as I'm aware, what he referred to must have been the manner in which Orphans are created. I too worry greatly about Number Nineteen's survivability. Her myriad of health
