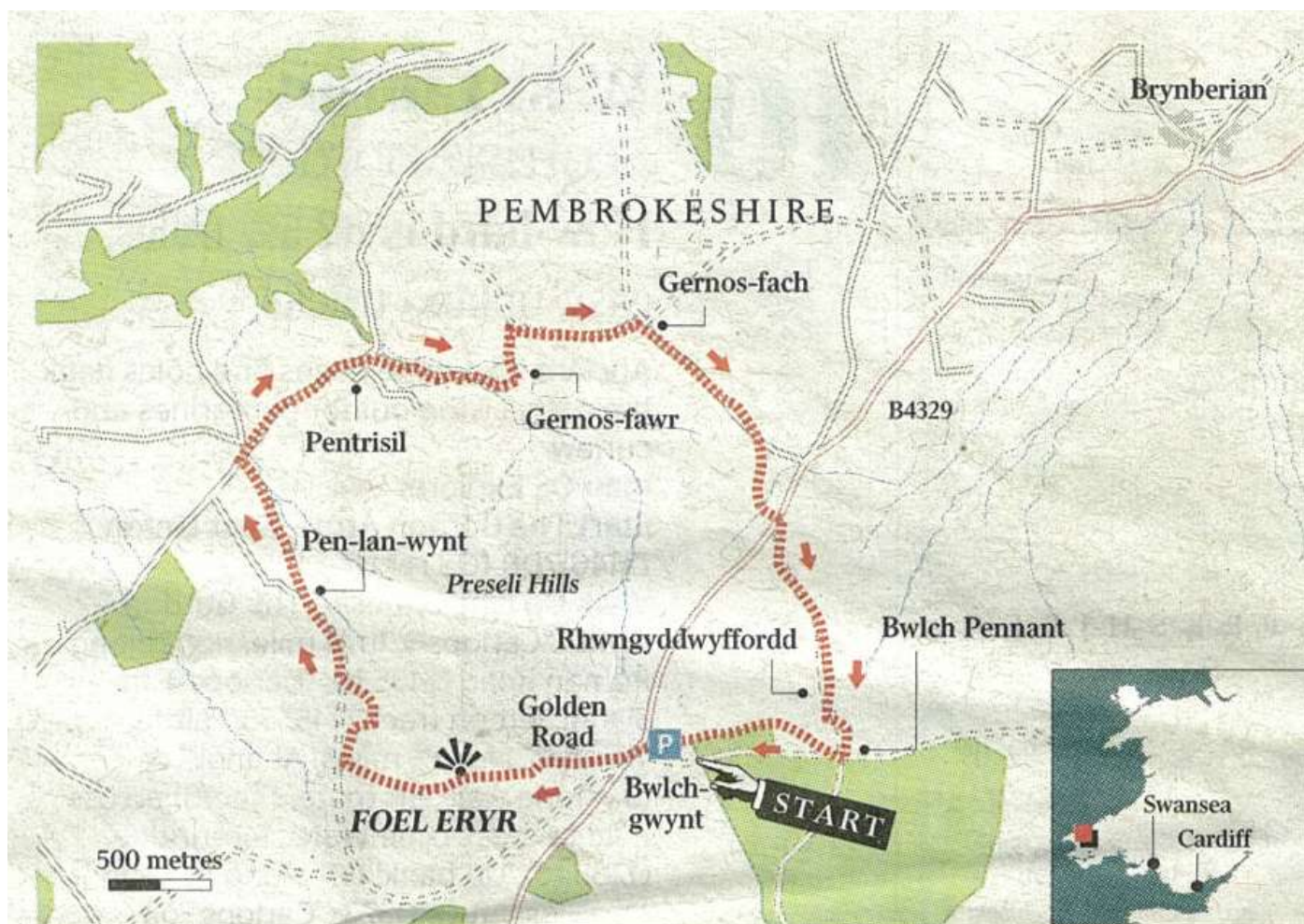




11 Foel Eryr and Preseli Hills Pembrokeshire

How hard is it? 6½ miles; moderate, two easy hills

A ramble along the “Golden Road”, the old drove track crests the spine of the Preseli Hills. Views at the summit of Foel Eryr, from Lundy and Ramsey islands to Worms Head and the Cambrian Mountains. We passed a standing stone under the slope of Rhwngyddwyffordd.

Map OS Explorer OL35

Start Bwlch-gwynt car park, near Tafarn-y-Bwlch, Pembrokeshire SA66 7RB approx (OS ref SN 075322)

Walk Cross B4329; path to Foel Eryr summit (066321). Keep same line descending. In 600m at fingerpost with arrow (061321) bear right, gradually descending to Pen-lan-wynt farm

(058330). Blue arrows/BA to track (057333), then road (055337). Right; 250m beyond Pentrisil, right (062342, “Tafarn Bwlch, Pembrokeshire Trail”) to pass Gernos-fawr (069341, BAs) and reach Gernos-fach (075343). Right (fingerpost) on track to B4329 (084337). Right; in 350m, fork left (082333, BA) up hill track for ¾ mile to Bwlch Pennant (085321). Right along fence to car park.

Getting there Bwlch-gwynt car park is on B4329 (Cardigan-Haverfordwest), between Tafarn-y-bwlch and Tufton. (Unless you live locally, don’t go until after lockdown.)
