

VANDALISM & MISCHIEF



On Canada Day, July 1st, around 7am, I looked out the front window and noticed one of the two strings running along the dug out for the new walkway cut in the middle. On July 3rd, I found the other string cut, also in the middle. On July 4th, I tied the cut ends together. Around July 10th, both strings broke again in the same area. It could have been a rabbit running through. So far the string along the other dug out running at the side of the house is okay and rabbits are also in that area.

TWO FLAT TIRES

Just before the cut strings on the property, around June 24, the right tire on my car began losing air. I added air for about 2 days; at the mall, the tire deflated, which I thought would happen - I quickly changed it. There were no nail, screw or hole at the bottom. On June 28, I took the tire to the repair shop and they found a tiny hole that looks like a nail hole or a dart hole in the sidewall; they couldn't repair the tire because the hole is in the sidewall; they showed some concerns and said the tire is a good tire. On around June 25 or 26, the back left tire also began losing air and I added air a few times, and around June 29 as the tire was half way down, I changed it. I have not taken this one in as yet for repair. Just about 2 weeks before, I was at the Auto Pick Your Parks and managed to find 4 good tires on a vehicle; I was lucky I found them. To replace the two back tires with new tires will cost about \$500.

Took off left back tire, and place 2 spares in the trunk plus small spare that comes with the car, as it was around Canada day and vandalism can increase.

TWO CARS SET ON FIRE IN EDMONTON

Recently, the inside of the vehicle of someone I know was set on fire, along with one of his neighbor's vehicle.

It was around 2011 when I began having many flat tires, which I had reported to the police; I reported my recent flat tires to the police on July 3rd, 2019 around 11am just incase it was vandalism; two officers arrived around 11pm on July 3rd. I had also discussed the string incident just incase it was done by a human. I filled out a report and dropped it off at the Kensington police station. I included the following two observation incase mischiefs are involved. *Continue on the next page...*

THE FEATHER

For the past month, it's been raining almost every day which is very unusual for Edmonton, and on July 4th around 5:30pm, I found a feather that looks black and green in color stuck into the pebbles standing around a 45 degree angle, around where the constable was standing the night before as I explained my tire incidents and the cut strings.



I took a picture of the same feather on July 7th, and just from a little rain the feather was now lying flat. Birds fly around in the area, but how did the feather end up standing upright?



TRANSPLANTING & THE WISHING BONE



A few weeks before the flat tires and cut strings, around the end of May or beginning of June, I was transplanting some flower plants; some were drying out due to the periodic heat and I was advised to cover them. I covered the one in the picture on the left with the garbage can cover, and not long after, I found what looks like a wishing bone next to the flower plants. See picture on the left. I kept checking to see if the flowers would catch. About a week later, the wishing bone disappeared. Did a bird place it there? Or was it a dog? Something seems strange.

With a growing diversity, in 1938 Muslims in Edmonton built the first mosque in Canada

The city of Edmonton in Alberta, Canada continues to grow in diversity and multiculturalism. In the year 1901, according to Stat Canada, Edmonton only had about 2,626 people. As a comparison of population and people contributing to the growth of the world, I will use another place that's very familiar to me - Georgetown, Guyana in South America. The city of Georgetown in Guvana, South America, which may be around the same size of Edmonton, had a much greater population back in 1902 with people contributing to the growth of the world. In 1902, Guyana was already very diverse and multicultural and had thousands of Europeans including approx. 30,000 Portuguese, 10 percent of the population is Amerindians American Indians, and possibly over 100,000 'Blacks', and possibly over 100,000 Indians from (India, including Pakistan, some from Afghans), thousands of Chinese, and even Syrian/Lebanese and others laboring in Guyana, contributing to the development and growth of the world, as the production of sugar, rum, tobacco and many other products were sold across the entire globe but unfortunately intoxicating many and destroying their lives - bringing great wealth to big corporations and the rest of the world. Today, you will find Demerara sugar in cafés in Edmonton and in the grocery stories. You will also find Demerara Rum and El Dorado Rum from Guyana across the globe. Continue on p. 10

Thus there were already large diverse populations in the Americas in the year 1901, such as the East Indians and Chinese. Thus diversity and multiculturalism is not new to the Americas. It's people of diverse backgrounds that have been building the Americas for hundreds of years now, where big corporations have been recruiting laborers from across the globe and continues to do so today to build the world and our lives the way they envisioned us to be - soon to be microchipped.

The population of Edmonton slowly grew in the 1900s, bringing more diversity. Many Italians entered Canada in the 1950s; Portuguese were also arriving. But before the 1950s back in 1938, the first Mosque (masjid) the 'Al-Rashid Mosque' was already built in Canada, which was also one of the first masjids built in North America. In 1991, the 'Al-Rashid Mosque' was moved to Fort Edmonton. There's also an Islamic school in Edmonton, and although there has been some vandalism, this city continues to become more multicultural. Today we not only see many churches in Edmonton, but there are many Masjids, Hindu temples, Buddhist Temples. The world continues to change.

Iranians own West Edmonton Mall, the Mall of America, and Triple Five Group

West Edmonton Mall which is one of the biggest attractions in Edmonton and was the world's largest mall until 2004 is owned by Ghermezian family. This family also owns the Mall of America, the future American Dream Meadowlands and other properties. They also own Tripple Five Group which is management company.

The Ghermezian family is an Iranian Jewish family from Iran that arrived in Edmonton in the 1960s. West Edmonton Mall, which became a four-phase mall was opened on September 15, 1981 and was completed in 1999. This attractive and dynamic mall was the largest indoor shopping centre in the world until 2004. In 1964, Jacob Ghermezian, (1902 – January 3, 2000) emigrated from Iran to Canada with his wife and four sons. The mall has over 24,000 people are employed at the mall with approx. 32 million visitors per year, and depending on the time of the year, holidays, day of the week, seasons there's approx. 90,000 and 200,000 shoppers daily. Spiritual Healing by Usheda Akbar-Shanks

Shamanism is pure and simple spirit work used to heal people.

TRADITIONAL TECHNIQUES

Using traditional techniques to invoke the ancestral Spirits, the shaman / spirit healer acts as a 'bridge between the spirit and the mundane world'. Once the ancestral spirits are called they do the healing work.

SOUL DOCTOR AND THREE TYPES OF RITUALS

A shaman is a soul doctor who facilitated healing on a soul level. There are three types of rituals, which are usually done in stages for each healing session. The first is soul resonance where the shaman scans the bodily energies of the client to get a basic blue print. Once this is done the client is debriefed and the second part called soul extraction is done. With the help of an extraction guide the unwanted residual is removed. The third part is soul retrieval where the missing parts of the soul are called back in with the help of guides. The length and intensity of each session varies from client to client. Some may require more than one session.

These techniques are used with clients who come to the shaman as a last resort. Some clients may have suffered from soul imbalance etc... all their lives and finally get some relief. Often childhood traumas cause irreparable "damage" on a soul level. The shaman will receive visions and other pertinent information to relay to the client. This is done with a lot of compassion and empathy in a respectful and comfortable place.

RESULTS

Results are normally excellent and can be recognized almost immediately. Clients usually feel happy and relaxed right away.

After transplanting 3 of the pepper plant into a bigger pot, the 3 plant became withered. It takes time to fully catch. The key is to water lots and keep out of the sun.

Tip from Naz

1) When transplanting, keep in the shade, or cover to prevent from drying out.

2) Know your plants, as some plants will die from over watering.

Some plants died after transplanting from the egg trays

Transplanting cucumbers and watermelons that were started inside in egg trays, and the roots were wrapping around the bottom of the egg tray and when transplanting the roots were broken and most died upon transplanting. If you do not have time to transplant from egg trays to bigger pots, then explore other options before using egg trays, such as using Styrofoam cups instead.

Transplanting broccoli and Brussels sprout that started in Styrofoam cups were good because there were lots of room for the roots to spread out. Covered to prevent from drying out, or keep in the garage where it's cooler.

Brought their Devotion workshop to Edmonton, Alberta, Canada July 1, 2019 by F. Ally

Quran: It is only in the remembrance of God that hearts are comforted (13:28) 'Here comfort means not just the temporary solace to be found in everyday convenience, but the real comfort with it's implications of peace of mind that can stem only from God Almighty' *Ref: Spirituality of Islam by M. W Khan; p.7*

Pearls of Islam

Two sisters, Rabia and Zakina, are known as 'Pearls of Islam.' Both of them sing and play instruments such as drums and the guitar. The acclaimed pair performs across Europe, and had recently performed in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada on July 1, 2019, bringing a workshop called 'The Sound of Devotion.' They refer to what they do as 'sharing,' sharing their devotional songs from their heart to the heart of others and taking you closer to the divine.

Their inspiration

Dress modest in headscarves and long dresses, the duo is inspired by Islamic traditions, and has a background of 'Jamaican folk music and Guyanese soca and soul music. '

Meditation

Like practitioners of 'Primordial Meditation' and other types of meditation that repeats a phrase over and over to silence the mind and rambling thoughts, most Muslims repeat phrases over and over as a part of their prayers, or daily life, and many are also involved in dhikr (remembrance of the creator) which is explained below.

Islamic prayer and dhikr (remembrance of God)

Not only are countries with a Muslim majority rich in art, culture and science, which many in the West are unaware of, but aside from regular Islamic prayers which many performs 5 times a day taking the person to a higher plane and away from the material world, like Rabia and Zakina ('Pearls of Islam'), many Muslims are also engaged in other devotional practices during the week taking them closer to the ALMIGHTY, such as singing, and even dancing as in the whirling dervish that's common in places like Turkey, where practitioners spin in circles which is a form as dhikr (the remembrance of God) or meditation, taking the practitioner closer to the divine. Many phrases of their singing come directly from the Quran.

Workshop focuses on the following areas:

A brief history of the roots of devotional praise

- The role of women in devotional singing throughout generations
- Learning to write & sing a devotional song
- Group praise & dhikr choir

Their instruments

During the workshop the duo sang, played drums and the guitar, bringing their devotional sounds to life with melodies. The melody and lyrics takes you closer to the heart and brings peace to the heart.

"Feeling that divine mercy." Song called mercy...starts in English...

The sisters commence their song in a melodic voice with lines from surah (chapter) Al Fatiha, meaning The opening. One of the sisters starts with "Bismillah hir rahman nir Rahim" (In the name of God, the merciful, the compassionate). The other sister follows with the same phrase and they continue singing "Bismillah hir rahman nir Rahim" over and over while playing drums, then the phrase "Bismillah" which begins to fade. Repeating a phrase over and over is referred to as dhikr, the remembrance of God, and is a form of meditation. Phrases such as 'Allahu Akbar' (God is great) 'Bismillah hir rahman nir Rahim' (In the name of God, the merciful, the compassionate), 'la illaha illalah' ((There's no god (deity) but God (the one God that's described in the Quran, Bible and Vedas that has no image)), 'Subhannalah' (Glory to God) and many more are used in dhikr.

Dhikr and meditation is explained below.

In their performances, often English phrases are also sang. As they sing, play their drums and guitar, clapping also comes in.

One of the sisters starts picking the acoustic guitar and begin singing a devotional song in Arabic. Then the other sister starts to sing in English. Singing in Arabic and the drumming comes in. Shakers came in at the same time.

The sisters sang, "la illaha illalah" (There's no god but God) repeating the phrase over and over in melodic voice with the guitar and drums playing, and after a while the instruments stopped and the phrase continued and then fades.

The pair also sings complete songs called Nasheeds that brings peace to the heart.

Dhikr & Medtation

Dhikr, known as the remembrance of God is a big part of their workshop. For example, the phrase "la illaha illalah" meaning there's 'No god but God' is repeated over and over. Most Muslims does this silently or in a spoken or melodic voice. The duo does this, accompanied with drums and the guitar, and for example, they would stop playing their instrument and keep repeating the phrase and let it fade.

Sufism, the mystic side of Islam, or simply the spiritual side of Islam

There are many ways to meditate, such as using phrases in Sanskrit, such as 'Om shanti, shanti. In Islam phrases such as 'Subhanallah Glory to God, and Allahu Akbar God is great is repeated over and over. Sessions which focuses on dhikr often falls under the name 'Sufism' and is a meditation session. Many Muslims that are engaged in their regular prayers and also practices extra dhikr (repeating the phrases) that do not create new names such as Sufism for themselves, but sees this as a deeper spiritual side of Islam taking them closer to the Almighty.



LOOKING BACK AT SOME RECORDING SESSIONS FROM 1999 BY F. ALLY AT ALBERTA SOUND ENG. WITH OWNER / ENGINEER CAM GUSE IN EDMONTON, ALBERTA, CANADA

Recording Backing Tracks for songs such as Sometimes, New Clear Society, A Kiss Goodnight.

As an Indie artists, all of my recordings mark a period in time and I refer to the songs as my CLASSICS.

ALBERTA SOUND ENG. WORKING WITH CAM GUSE

From what I remember, this studio had a half-inch or a one-inch reel to reel tape. The owner / engineer Cam Guse of this new studio called Alberta Sound Eng. and I had made a deal for me to use a number of hours, where Cam worked on the drum tracks using a drum machine while I complete some backing Tracks along with some vocals.

BACKING TRACKS FROM POWERSOUND AND ALBERTA SOUND ENG. ARE STILL USED

It was an opportunity for me to learn about programming drums using a drum machine from a professional in the business. Cam was very creative when it came to creating the drum tracks. He was also a very good drummer. No doubt he is very talented. While he put together the drum tracks, he checked with me, and I provided feedback while the backing tracks for songs like Sometimes, New Clear Society, True Love, A Kiss Goodnight were being created.

RECORDING VOCAL TRACKS

The BACKING TRACKS tracks were coming along very well and it was time for me to do some vocal tracks and to get directions from the professionals. While recording the very first vocal tracks for my song 'A Kiss Goodnight' the sound kept switching from side to side as if something was faulty. I could not hear myself and I explained that a few times. It became very annoying and frustrating because there were no solutions to resolve this, and thus the vocal tracks were not completed. My time spent in this studio was much shorter than planned for. As I have explained before, for me to lay down vocal tracks - with me having injured vocals - I had needed the kind of vocal production, which I've had at Beta Studios and Powersound Studio so I could stay in tune; there are singers that would record a line over and over until they get it right, and there are also equipment to adjust the pitch. I was out of luck and the vocals were not completed, but the backing tracks are still used once in awhile along with the backing tracks from other studios.

COST WAS A MAIN FACTOR FOR MY INDIE RECORDINGS

On these tapes, you will not see the quality and playing that goes on in a professional studios where there are producers, engineers and top musicians being hired to play on the tracks. But I'm an indie artist and that was fine with me. At other times the production was better.

ALLY'S SONGS ARE PUBLISHED AND COPYRIGHT

Once my songs were on cassettes or on CDs where some were handed out, that means <u>MY</u> <u>SONGS ARE COPYRIGHT AND PUBLISHED, and nobody can use parts and or hooks</u> <u>and ideas without permission and without a contract, meaning that my lawyer must be</u> involved.

RECORDINGS

Often there will be a second version and other recordings, and if I can afford it, I will enter a studio and pay for the production and other musicians. I have different versions, and I consider my older versions to be my CLASSICS.

REHEARSING SONGS

AND PLAYING THE COMPLETE LEAD GUITAR INSTRUMENTALS

I enjoy playing lead guitar, and I had created leads for my songs such as The Birds Won't Come My Way, True Love, Missing You Going Crazy, That's Crazy Love, SoCrazy4u. Others have also created leads for my songs such as when True Love was recorded at Power Sound in Edmonton in 1999.

Today I enjoy playing many instrumental leads. It's fun just taking my guitar over to relatives functions, play and then enjoy a nice dinner and conversations and this is what I will continue to do because of the love for this art.

PLAYING COMPLETE LEADS SUCH AS SAMBA PA TI

I play approximately 100 cover tunes (by other artists, including instrumentals) along with a selection of my original songs. In my teenage days, when I played lead, it was mostly a part of the song and the rest were chords and triads. In those days, I also played complete instrumentals like Wipe out, pipeline, Let's Go, Tequila etc...

I knew parts of Samba Pa Ti by Carlos Santana, but I never used to play the rest of the lead, only a part. When I played 'Sultans of Swings' I played the open lead and the small licks, but I do not remember playing all the leads, but today I play all the leads and the song as an instrumental.

For this Summer and Fall, I have been rehearsing instrument leads for songs such as All Along The Watch Tower (Jimi Hendrix version), Samba Pati, The Thrill Is Gone (B. B King version), Sultans of Swings, La Bamba (Lob Lobos version) and a few others, along with some Bollywood instruments such as Neele Neele Ambar Par, Tujhe Dekho, oh mere sona, Humse churalo, Tuha wahi (Bollywood tunes)

COVER SONGS (OLDER SONGS MAINLY FROM THE 1950s

I enjoy playing some older tunes such as In The Still of The Night, Stand by Me, Love story (Englebert Humperdink), The Last Waltz (Englebert Humperdink). I also like oldies by Elvis, Chuck Berry, The Beatles, Rolling Stones. I also do finger picking such as 'Dust in the wind', 'Stairway to heaven' and others.

PLAYING MY ORIGINAL SONGS

My selection of my original songs are for this summer and fall are: A Kiss Good Night, True Love, Sometimes, Keep The Peace, New Clear Society, In A Special Way, My Home, Precious Holidays / Christmas, Reaching out, Rain Go Away, Wide Eyed Innocent, Estos Sentimientos (These Feelings), Out of Control.


