

Lewis Latimer, the electrical pioneering genius

Back in the 1800s, Lewis Latimer had worked with inventors such as Alexander Graham Bell, and Thomas A. Edison. He had invented the carbon filament light bulb in 1897, where he had spent hour after hour and day after day carrying out thousands of tests that led to the use of the electric light across the globe. He had also worked in New York, Philadelphia, Montreal and London supervising the installation of public electric lights. He had worked with Bell and had also drawn up the diagrams for the patent of the telephone. He was on Edison's research team and was a witness in court for Edison's patents. He had contributed greatly to the development of the United States with his many inventions. His patents were: Water closet for railroad cars, improvement on electric lamp, process for manufacturing carbon filament, arc light glove support, patent for apparatus for cooling and disinfecting, device for locking hats, coats, and umbrellas on hanging racks. He also wrote 'the first book on electric lighting called Incandescent Electric which was a technical engineering book and thus became a guide for lighting engineers.

HOLI 2018 - FESTIVAL OF COLORS

The Hindu celebration, Holi, also known as the Festival of Colors, is on Friday, March 2, 2018 with the arrival of spring in India. With a diverse world today, Holi will be celebrated world wide, and amongst many. This celebration commences on the evening of March 1, which is known as Holika Dahan or Chhoti Holi and the following day on March 2, the day of the festival, the vibrant celebration takes place by tossing color powder known as gulal and spraying color liquid on each other. It's best to dress in white where you will be decorated in colors, from head to toe. Many will also be dressed in their traditional and colorful attires.



It's origin in Hindu Mythology

Holi has its root in Hindu mythology where Holika was ordered by her wicked brother, King Hiranya Kashipu to partake in a hostile event where she was killed in a fire that was intended to kill the king's son, Prahlad, because the boy was devoted to Lord Vishnu (other myths states that Prahlad was devoted to Lord Narayana). Thus Holi celebrates the burning of Holika, the triumph of good over evil. Legend also has it that Holi has its roots in the love story Radha and Krishna, and also in other stories

Holi is celebrated across India, and during this celebration in Uttar Pradesh, rituals are carried out where people light a fire, and the ashes are kept to protect them.

This celebration arrived in the Americas back around 1838, and in the past few decades have become very popular in England America and Canada

Although, today this celebration is grand in places like New York, California, and London due to these countries cultural diversity, this celebration was being celebrated in the Americas back in the 1800s. The indentured laborers from India, arriving in Guiana (Guyana), South America in 1838, as sugar cane laborers would have been celebrating Holi back in those days, which became to be known as Phagwah in Guyana. Holi is also celebrated in places like Trinidad and Tobago in the Caribbean where the first Indian laborers from India arrived in 1845. A group of Indians from French Guiana in South America also went to work in Rio, Brazil back in the 1800s and thus Holi could have been celebrated in Brazil back in the 1800s also. Many Indians also went to places like Jamaica in the Caribbean and Dutch Guiana (Surinam) in South America taking their cultures.

Like many Syrians that arrived in the 1800s and early 1900s and assimilated into the fabric of our societies, so did my grandfather on my father's side who was of Syrian background, and would have most likely left Syria through the Port of Beriut heading to Marseilles, France and from France to South America. I have read some articles on the Syrians in Guyana, and I had learned that around the early 1900s many Syrians and Portuguese in a town called New Amsterdam in Guyana were very successful in commerce. And from what I was told, the Syrians in Guyana used to go door to door peddling, selling clothes, threads, cloth and other items, similar to what they were doing in America. Some Syrians remained in Guyana while other may have moved on to places that have more Syrians, and while others also returned to Syria, whether they were actually from the area of Damascus, Aleppo, Lebanon, or other places in Syria...Fisal Ally

People from Greater Syria

The Syrians from Greater Syria began their journey to America before the 1880s in small numbers. From around 1880 onwards, they began to arrive in large numbers where most had settled in New York, Detroit and Boston. Many became peddlers and sold dry goods. Whether they were from Damascus, Aleppo, the country called the Republic of Lebanon today, or other areas that were a part of Greater Syria, they were often identified as Syrians, and because Syria was a part of the Ottoman Empire, some could have also been labeled as Turks upon their arrival, as stated in the article 'Syrian Americans' by J. Sydney Jones.

200,000 Syrians in America before 1920

According to the article, between 1899 and 1919 there were approximately 90,000 Syrians from Greater Syria in America. This article also states that according to the book 'The Syrians in America', the author Philip Hitti, stated that there were around 200,000 Syrians in America that were born in America or that were immigrants. According to the article, many of the early Syrians were orthodox Christians, and amongst them were also Muslims, Jews, Druze and some Protestants. Many of the Christians came from the area known as Mount Lebanon during those days.

The American Dream and making America their homes

Many Syrians came to America because of the American dream. It was an opportunity for them to work, earn money and return to their homeland and families with their savings. Many also made America their home. The ones that returned to Syria had returned with their wealth and many stories that entranced their relatives and friends about the American dream, and after hearing those captivating success stories, many more Syrians would venture out to America.

The Syrians were contributing to the development of America like anyone else

The Syrians ended up living in most states across America carrying out their work. Many Syrians became successful in America. According to the article, by 1910, a Syrian had become a millionaire in America. Over time they progressed and entered may fields such as the medical field becoming doctors, bankers, lawyers, engineers and many other professions.

Immigration decreased

Due to the "Immigration Act of 1924" immigration from Syria to America had considerably decreased.

A new wave of Syrians in 1965

Forty one years later, in 1965, with "The Immigration Act of 1965" a new wave of Syrians arrived in America, where most were Muslims. At this time, Lebanon was not a part of Syria as Syria had new boarders and Lebanon was its own country, and the people now coming from places like Damascus and Aleppo were Syrians where most were Muslims. The ones now coming from Lebanon were mainly Lebanese Christians, Muslims and Druze.

Syrians across the entire Americas

Most Syrians had set out for the American dream, but Syrians did not only land in America, many went to most of the countries in the Americas. They were working and living in places like Brazil, Columbia, the Guyanas (British Guiana (now Guyana), French Guiana, Dutch Guiana (Surinam), Jamaica, Trinidad and Tobago, and many countries in the Americas. Many remained in these countries, while many returned to their homeland with their savings.

Little Syria in America

In America, you will find 'Little Syria' in Brooklyn, New York where the environment gives you a feeling of Syria. The dishes are prepared as a simple vegetarian dishes. Any or all of the following can be added to the dishes below: Garlic, onions, tomatoes.

Add meats if required such as beef, chicken, shrimp or others while cooking. Some of the dishes have potatoes. You can add potatoes to any, if required.

Preparation time 10 minutes.
Cooking time 20 minutes to half hour. Can also serve with rice.
Serves four.



1) Fresh karela



2) Remove seeds



3) Cut into slices



4) Complete cutting



5) Add salt to taste if required



6) Add garlic and onions. Can also add tomatoes



7) Add oil to pan for frying karela



8) Add karela to pan



9) Cook on medium



10) As karela becomes slightly burned. Turn over with a spoon



11) Removed cooked ones (a little burned) and place in bowl



12) Continue frying, and removing the ones that are cooked (slightly burned)

STEPS FOR PREPARING FRIED BAIGAN (EGGPLANT)



Preparation time 10 minutes. Cooking time 20 minutes to half hour. Preparing baigan using a microwave. Can also serve with rice. Serves six.



1) Cut into eggplan about six inches long with a knife. Place two cloves of garlic in each cut.

2) Place eggplant in microwave for approx. 3 minutes. It will be steaming hot. Turn over. Microwave for another 3 minutes

3) Take a spoon and remove the inside and place in a bowl. Discard the outside skin.



4) Use masher to mash up eggplant



5) Pour oil into frying pan



6) Add onions, garlic, tomatoes etc...



7) Add onions and fry on



9) Let onions fry until burned a little



10) Place baigan in pan and fry



11) Stir every few minutes



12) Baigan dish completed

STEPS FOR PREPARING BAJI (SPINACH)



Preparation time 10 minutes. Cooking time 20 minutes to half hour. *Can also serve with rice*. Serves six.







2) Place spinach in bowl



3) Add oil to pot



4) Set stove to hi



5) Add spinach to pot



6) Stir spinach



7) Add onions and cloves of garlic



8) Let it cook



9) Add salt to taste



10) Stir



11) Cook on hi and liquid slowly goes down



12) Cover and continue cooking on medium



13) Keep for approx 10 minutes cooking so liquid boils down



14) Take cover off and continue cooking on hi for about 5 minutes



15) Bagi complete

STEPS FOR PREPARING BORA (STRING BEANS)



This dish takes longer where the first step is to boil the potatoes and the string beans together, and the second step is frying the string beans and potatoes together.

Preparation time 10 minutes. Cooking time approximately 1 hour. *Can also serve with rice*. Serves six.





1) Cut into pieces. Also peel and cut up two potatoes.

2) Place in bowl

3) Add string beans and potatoes into bowl with approx.. 2 cups of water









4) Beans and potatoes in water

5) Add to pan and let beans and potatoes boil in the water

6) Approx. 1/2 hour later, water dries down

7) Add oil to pan for frying









8) Add beans and potatoes to frying pan and fry for approx. 20 minutes on hi

GUYANA IS KNOWN FOR ITS EASTER WEEKEND KITE FLYING FESTIVAL By F. Ally

As far as I'm aware, Guyana in South America is probably the only country in the world that is known for flying kites on Easter, which is actually a cultural celebration. In 1853, the Chinese Indentured Laborers arrived in Guyana (formerly Guiana) and brought their kite flying tradition with them, as China is know for its history in kite flying. While the Chinese laborers were in the fields flying their kites, their bosses had tried to stop them, but a new and everlasting tradition was born into the Guyanese culture when the Chinese laborers had told their bosses that kite flying symbolized the rising of Jesus Christ, words that would please their Christian bosses. Upon hearing those inspirational words from the mouths of the Chinese laborers, their bosses smiled at the though and told them to continue flying their kites. Today kite flying is one of the biggest traditions in the Guyanese culture amongst all people of all faiths and takes place during the Easter long weekend. For some Guyanese kite flying is all year long. Although Easter is a Christian celebration in Guyana, kite flying during Easter is a cultural celebration with lots of events and competition surrounding kites for people of all faiths and background, and its event as such that brings people together.

THE SINGING ENGINE

Although there are many types of kites flown during Easter, such as the Box kite, Bird kite and many others kites, the 'Singing Engine' kite is no doubt the favorite and is unique in its design, as it soars the Atlantic Ocean, buzzing and singing and throughout this South American country.

KITE FLYING IS BIG AROUND THE GLOBE

Kite flying is also big in many countries around the world such as in Afghanistan and many cities across Canada, America, but these places do not celebrate Easter with kite flying in the way Guyana does. The President of Guyana calls it a GUYANA INVENTION - FLYING KITES DURING EASTER. For example Trinidad, which is near Guyana, has their kite flying festival in December and not during Easter like Guyana does.

KITE FLYING IN CANADA, AMERICA AND OTHER PLACES

Like Guyana, many countries around the world have their own kite flying festivals, but in places like Canada, these festivals DO NOT take place during Easter like it does in Guyana, but often takes place during the summer when the days are warmer. Kite flying festivals are held in Trinidad in December, New York Kite Festival in July, Brampton Ontario (Canada) in June, Vancouver in June, Edmonton (Alberta, Canada) in September (Kites over Callingwood). (These dates are also subject to changes for these locations mentioned, where as in Guyana it's always during Easter.) IN GUYANA AND MAYBE ONLY IN GUYANA, KITE FLYING TAKES PLACE DURING EASTER, UNLESS OTHERS ARE ADOPTING TO THIS GUYANESE TRADITION, as a way of showing the 'rising of Christ.' BUT IT'S UNIQUE TO GUYANA.

Our Diverse City Magazine has been promoting our Kite Building Competition and the Easter Kite flying that takes place in Guyana. Immediately after edition 1.0 of the Diverse City Magazine was released on February 22, it began to feel more like Easter Kite Flying in Edmonton, when on March 2, 2018 and a few times after that, I noticed an advertisement with a kite on the big bulletin board on 170 St exiting off to Yellowhead Trail showing a kite. (I take this route all the time). We know that no one fly kites on Easter in Edmonton because it's a 'Guyanese Thing' and it can be cold to stand out there in Edmonton during the month of March or at the end of March not to mention there can be lots of snow, but during Easter in Guyana, kites are hovering above the Atlantic Ocean and soaring the sky in the scorching sun for hours upon hours. Will it catch on in Edmonton? Maybe, maybe not, but it may catch on for fun and for sales by using the Guyanese theme about kite flying symbolizing the 'rising of Christ.'

In the novel, SIGNATURE WITH LOVE a novel I wrote on cats, published back around December 2012, kite flying is a part of the story of Mustapha, Salima and their cats.


Some steps in building a 1-foot singing engine and a 2 foot singing engine kite




1) This is a simple 1-foot kite made by using the wood from a broom.




2) Make an X with two of the 1-foot stick. Then add the middle stick which is about 10 inches long.

5) Run the string around the frame. This is a simple 1-foot kite made by using the wood




SHOWS A 2-FOOT KITE FRAME. A design is made using the string.

On prayers

Some words in the Quran, which is written in classical Arabic and not modern Arabic, are not easily translated to English and have different meanings in the way an English word also have different meanings. When it comes to Islam, we often hear about the five daily prayers. Using the word, prayer, is not fully correct because the classical Arabic word, 'salah' does not only translate to the word prayer, although prayer is a part of 'salah.' Connecting to the creator and focusing on the inspirational verses and phrases are one of the main goals of 'salah.' During salah, there is prayers which is known as 'dua', there is also worshipping where you only praise Allah (the creator of the Heaven, the Earth and all things), then there's dikr (zikr) which is actually closer to a meditation practice where worshippers repeats a phrase such as 'subhannalah' over and over during salah and this is rejuvenating in the way meditation is - in fact, salah purifies the heart and soul where worshippers should attain calmness, release stress, quiet their busy minds etc... and that's healthy for the body, soul and mind, and the goal is to become an enlightened being. It's also important to be aware that in Arabic speaking countries such as Iraq, the word, Allah, is also used by the Christians.

The symbol of the moon and star that's seen on the Masjids (prayer halls), flags and books The symbol of the moon and the star has nothing to do with Islam and Muslims, since Islam has no objects or images. These symbols used together predates Islam, but was adopted by the Turkish Empire. In the way places like Canada and America have symbols on its flags but does not represent Christianity or any other faiths, the same goes for the moon and the star, which are often found on flags in countries where there are large Muslim populations and other faiths such as Christianity, Hinduism, Judaism etc, yet have nothing to do with Islam. For whatever reason(s) the star and moon are place on Masjids (prayer halls), books and flags its important not to judge Islam and Muslims according to what or and who these symbols may represent, as practitioners of Islam enters a prayer hall to carry out their 'salah' and 'salah' has nothing to do with these symbols.


