LOOKING BACK AT ALLY'S 1999 RECORDINGS AT

POWERSOUND STUDIOS, EDMONTON, ALBERTA, CANADA

THE 1999 RECORDINGS THE SESSIONS

INTRODUCTION

IN 1999, I BEGAN WORKING ON A NEW INDEPENDENT MUSIC PROJECT

In late 1999, I headed down to Power Sound Studio in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada to meet Phil Anderson and to discuss my upcoming INDEPENDENT RECRODING PROJECT. Before entering any studio, my songs are complete from beginning to end, and I always have the chord progression charts, rhythm guitar and bass lines ready, and sometimes the keyboards and the drums. All of my recording projects are INDEPENDENT and I have covered all of the costs for studio time, and for paying STUDIO MUSICIANS to lay down some tracks. In those days, I was working as a computer programmer and I was also in the stock market making money, and I would put aside the FUNDS my recordings.

PART I - MY HOME RECORDINGS AND FRIENDS

RENTING THE EQUIPMENT AND RECORDING AT HOME AND WITH FRIENDS

My recordings were fun. I enjoyed the song writing and recording experience. Like writing books while working a full time job, writing songs and recording music were also my hobby. AND I TOOK SONG WRITING AND RECORDING SERIOUSLY.

Before entering professional studios like BETA STUDIOS, POWERSOUND STUDIOS and BIG RECORDS, I used to rent low cost recording equipment where I would play and record all of the tracks including drums using a drum machine. I had purchased a Tascam 4 track recorder, so I didn't have many tracks to record on. Then I began renting the ADAT 8 track machine, which gave me enough tracks to record on. AT THIS STAGE IN LIFE, MUSIC WAS MY HOBBIE AND I DID NOT EXPECT PROFESSIONAL QUAILTY. I WANTED TO RECORD MY SONGS AS ON A MEDIUM as my INDEPENDENT PRODUCTIONS. The recordings were done fast because I was doing all the tracks and all of the work. Prior to this I had recorded my songs on tape recorders just playing a guitar. With the Tascam 4-track and then the ADAT 8 track, I was now able to put down the drum machine, rhythm guitar, bass guitar, lead guitar, keyboards and harmonica, and a quick vocal track. At the time my vocal chords were very sore and the vocal tracks were rough and done very quick. I had RECORDED ABOUT 40 SONGS BY MYSELF. IT WAS A LOT OF WORK and everything was done quick, but the songs were completed. And over the years I WOULD MAKE CHANGES TO SOME OF THE SONGS AND LYRICS and record a different versions. I LIKE HAVING DIFFERENT VERSIONS OF A SONG.

PLAYING WITH FRIENDS

Sometimes friends would come over and they would bring their friends, and we would play our instruments and sing, and very often we played our original songs. I would play some of my songs and the some of the other guys would play their songs. We did this for enjoyment as we all had full time jobs, which had taken up a lot of our time. But most of us never gave up music; it's something we did since we were teenagers. Sometimes my good friend, James from our high school group would drop by and we would play guitar, but at this stage I was practicing with other friends.

ON THE RADIO - CONTINUED PLAYING AND WRITING SONGS

I'm not sure what became of amazing players and singers like J. Walker, whom I played in a band with when I was around eighteen years old, while playing with my high school band. I'm sure some of them may have done good in music or gone on to other good things in life. As for me, I was happy to hear two of my songs coming over the radio with me singing and playing while in my twenties. At the time I was working full time, and I did not really push to get ahead in music. At the time I still did not know much about recording or recording engineering. Going further back, I remember how James, Dave, a drummer and I were playing in the music room in school and how we packed in the room. SO WE HAD SOME GOOD TIMES IN MUSIC.

ALSO PLAYED LEAD GUITAR FOR AN EAST INDIAN BAND WHERE I LEARNED TO PLAY INDIAN SONGS

I later played lead guitar for an East Indian band out of Edmonton where I had the opportunity to learn Indian music and played with amazing players, and we played at the Legislative Grounds, in Vancouver and other places in front of big crowds. IT WAS ALL FUN

MY SONG, WIDE EYED INNOCENT AND MANY MORE INDIE RECORDINGS

In the 1990s, my songs like Wide Eyed Innocent, True Love, A Kiss Goodnight and others were recorded a number of times and sometimes with friends. Thus many of my songs were recorded multiple times in the 1990s and those recordings exist.

SIXTEEN PIECE DRUM SET

I had a sixteen piece drum set and although I was not a drummer, I knew how to play some beats and do drum rolls. One of my sister's friend, Jo, had introduced me to a drummer. He was very good and we would lay down some tracks for songs like Wide Eyed Innocent, and A Kiss Goodnight.

THE RADIO RECORDINGS, DOCUMENTARY ON MY MUSIC, FRIENDS THAT PLAYED AND RECORDING WITH ME, MY INDEPENDENT PRODUCTIONS, LIVE PERFORMANCES ARE ALL A PART OF THIS JOURNEY WHILE I WAS WORKING FULL TIME AND ALSO WRITING BOOKS, BUT I NEEDED TO MOVE FORWARD

There was only so much I could learn at home and from friends, and recording with friends using rental or cheap home equipment. I wanted to learn more, but it was costly.

PART II - RECORDING WITH THE PROFESSIONALS IN BETA STUDIOS

I WAS READY TO RECORD WITH THE PROFESSIONALS AND TO LEARN

It was time for me to move forward from playing with friends and playing in the basement, and to get some NEW EXPERIENCES and this had to be done in the PROFESSIONAL STUDIOS and this was costly.

I had already written about 100 songs.

I wanted to grow and to learn about recording engineering from the professionals and I had begun entering the TOP PROFESSIONAL STUDIONS IN EDMONTON in the 1990s to record some of my songs. Beta Studios was the first professional studio I had entered.

COST WAS ALWAYS A MAJOR FACTOR

When it comes to INDEPENDENT PRODUCTION cost is always a factor, because most of the time THE INDEPENDENT ARTIST like myself has to fork out the CASH to continue my INDIE PRODUCTIONS.

RECORDING AT BETA STUDIOS, STUDIO MUSICIANS, AND COSTS IN THE 1990s

In the 1990s, to enter a studio like BETA STUDIOS owned by Gary Koliger, from what I recall the cost was around \$65 and hour (I do not recall the exact hourly rate, it could have been more) and this was one of the best studios in Edmonton at the time, and probably still is. I believe the Tape Machine Recorder used is a 1-inch reel-to-reel tape, which was one of the best recorders.

Gary had brought in some STUDIO MUSCIANS TO PLAY on the tunes at a good price. Gary also played on the song. He was saturated with talent, and could have whip out a guitar lead for my song, LISA. Who is Lisa? I have no idea. It was just a song and a name from a phone call with the wrong number. Gary is also an amazing producer. On the song Lisa, where the line is "Tell me baby, when will you be mine." During the production he had advised me to drop the word 'mine' and to just sing, "Tell me baby, when will you be." And he was right. I like the way it sound. That's how talented Gary is. The drummer Tim Lent that played on songs like Lisa, SoCrazy4u and We Party Till We Feel Alright is an amazing drummer. This experience is one of my most memorable experience, and that's because Gary Koliger was not only an amazing Blues guitar player, but he knew his business and people very well.

At the time I was working as a computer programmer, and I had brought in my friend, Elias Ayube, from work, another computer programmer, to play TABLA on the song, We Party Till We Feel Alright (at the time I think the song had a different name). Elias is an amazing tabla player. I think it was in BETA STUDIOS, the players just came in for one or two songs, but were ready play extra tunes at no extra cost. And that's what music was all about; players will play, even when they are not paid, nor paid much.

CHARTING OUT MY SONGS AND CREATING A DEMO AND LOOPING THE DRUMS

I always chart out my songs for recording, which would include the type of drumbeats and the chord progression. For example I would chart out the entire chord progression. Once I have this chart, I would follow this chart and lay record the drums. After that I would then play the rhythm guitar with a quick vocal, and then add the bass, and then the lead guitar and then the keyboards, or in another order.

A week or two before the recording session date, I would enter BETA STUDIOS and Gary Koliger and I would do a demo. Gary would play a drum beat and then loop the drums for about 3 minutes, and then we would add the rest of instrument. It would very similar to what I had already created.

Gary would chart out my songs for his studio musicians, which was different from my chart, even though the song progression and lengths were the same. I would normally chart out my songs using a 4/4 time. But when Gary, for example, charted out SoCrazy4u, for his STUDIO MUSICIAN, he was using all kinds of beats such as 2/4, which I still cannot figure out, but yet the playing is identical to mine. It shows that he understands THEORY and I do not. And maybe this is why I write UNIQUE SONGS, SIMPLY BECAUSE I DO NOT UNDERSTAND MUSIC THEORY. MAYBE THAT'S A BLESSING IN DISGUISE. SEE GARY SAMPLE CHART AFTER THIS ARTICLE with some chords blotched out.

IN BETA STUDIOS TIM LENT WHO IS AN EXCELLENT DRUMMER PLAYED DRUMS ON SONGS SUCH AS

WE PARTY TILL WE FEEL ALRIGHT
This song is about people that party and 'dance all night and dance till the sun comes up'. It's as if they are chanting 'We Party Till We Feel Alright'

RECORDING AT BIG RECORDS STUDIO, A LESS EXPENSIVE STUDIO

To cut down on my cost, I began recording in BIG RECORDS owned by Dennis Sheehan, where I believe the cost was \$25 an hour, but I believe his Tape Recorder Machine used a 1/2 reel-to-reel tape. Dennis was the engineer, and I would have to direct the players that came in to play on what to do. The studio was off Jasper Avenue and around 105 Street, where I had to walk up a long set of stairs to the studio. I remember one of the drummers coming in to play was Tim Anderson.

I had discussed some of my recording experiences at Beta Studios in the Diverse City Magazine (digital) and or the Cariwave Magazine (digital). It was a lot of fun recording at BIG RECORDS because my cost was low as compared to the others, and also I had the opportunity to record with some good artists. BUT IT'S BETTER WHEN THERE'S SOMEONE LIKE GARY KOLIGER IN THE STUDIO TO PRODUCE AND WHO I CAN LEARN FROM.

PART III - ENTERING POWERSOUND STUDIO

BEFORE ENTERING POWERFOUND I HAD TO GO TO VANCOUVER TO A STUDIO CALLED RED STRIPES STUDIOS TO RETRIEVES TRACKS FROM A 1/2 INCH TAPE

Before entering Powersound Studios, I had to go to Vancouver to retrieve tracks from I think a 1/2 inch reel to reel tape which I had uncompleted songs due to unforeseen problems in the studio I was prior in. SEE SAMPLES FOR 'SOMETIMES' and 'NEW CLEAR SOCIETY' after this article. I could not locate that specific tape machine in Edmonton, but locate it in Vancouver. I flew down to Vancouver and stayed with my sister. It was quite an experience to enter a studio in Vancouver where the tracks were retrieved and transported onto another format for me to use.

IN THE STUDIO - PRO TOOLS RECORDING SOFTWARE ON A COMPUTER

After all of that, back in Edmonton, we decided that it would be best to start over from scratch. I had already created the bass lines for songs like SOMETIMES with a running bass line, NEW CLEAR SOCIETY and WIDE EYED INNOCENT. I also came up with the bass drum beat for the song, SOMETIMES. For all of my songs, I would come up with all of the parts from rhythm guitar, lead guitar, keyboards, drums, and harmonica. BUT IN A STUDIO THE PRODUCTION CAN EASILY CHANGE BY ADDING NEW ARRANGEMENTS TO THE SAME SONG.

SONGS PLANNED FOR RECORDING

SOMETIMES, A KISS GOODNIGHT, TRUE LOVE, CHRISTMAS, KEEP THE PEACE, THAT'S CRAZY LOVE, WE PARTY TILL WE FEEL ALRIGHT, AND A FEW MORE.

Powersound was already COMPUTERIZED and has a huge MIXING board. Whereas in Beta Studios, Gary Koliger used - I believe - a 1-inch reel to reel tape machine, which was very powerful and expensive. Powersound mixing board was the biggest I have ever seen. In those days a huge studio had opened and was very expensive to record in, and I think they may have had a big mixing board also. I don't know what became of that studio.

STUDIO MUSICIANS THAT CAME INTO POWERSOUND STUDIO TO LAY DOWN TRACKS

Phil brought in some studio musicians that he knew. Aside from myself playing on the tracks, the musicians Phil brought in were: *Musicians played on the 1999 tracks: John Cooke, Phil Anderson, Carmine Caligiuri, Mark Puffer, Matt Robertson. Phil also played bass. Initially I was going to also play bass, but Phil had a top end bass guitar and he was also a good bass player.*

PROFESSIONAL VIOLIN PLAYER

I knew a violin player named Roxana Avalos-Calderon and she came in to play the violin on A Kiss Goodnight, which I believe she had already done on a previous version of this song.

ST. JOHN BOSCO CHURCH CHOIR SANG ON THE SONGS, 'KEEP THE PEACE' and on 'CHRISTMAS

One of my aunts had introduced me to her CHURCH CHOIR GROUP group from ST. JOHN BOSCO Church that came into to sing on the songs 'KEEP THE PEACE' and 'CHRISTMAS.' Members of the St. John Bosco Church that sang on the songs are as follows: Jenifer Black, Ria Rose Fourney, Jackquie Fpilak, Shannon Johnson, Christine Lasek, and Megan Lessard.

Denis Lessard: Producer and director of the St. John Bosco Church Choirs.

I had gone down to St. John Bosco Church for some rehearsals and there was always something new to learn whether at the Church or in the studio.

It was a good experience to see all of the parents bringing their children who were amazing singers. It was such a good experience and privilege to have met Denis Lessard and the church choir and to rehearse with them.

RECORDING MY ORIGINAL SONG, SOMETIMES, AT POWERSOUND STUDIOS

The song Sometimes which was originally written and recorded around 1994 was being recorded with another version. Before entering the studio, I had the guitar, running bass line, keyboard, and also the bass drum beat worked out with the entire arrange for the complete song from beginning to end.

From what I remember, while doing the first take, the drummer began playing, but the bass drum beat was the same one that I came up with for this version. Phil had already listened to my demo, and he stopped the playing and went over the bass drum beat with the drummer. We began the song again and it sounded good and the recording continued. Note, later around the year 2008, the SOMETIMES tracks was used on a half hour comedy episode which I had written called CUSTOMERS COME FIRST.

KEYBOARDS FOR SOMETIMES WAS PLAYED BY JOHN COOKE IN 1999

I remember going over to John Cooke's apartment, which was on the Saskatchewan drive and not far from 109 Street, and I gave him the song so he can go over my keyboard part for the song. Although I had created a keyboard parts for songs like Sometimes and New Clear Society, when John Cooke entered the studio, he was brilliant. When he began to play New Clear Society, I just loved the way he played the keyboard, his own style. And on Sometimes, he played a very simple keyboard melody. His playing was amazing, and this is why it's good to bring in studio musicians that have years of experience, because they will add the extra zest in the playing.

Mark Puffer who played lead guitar on this version of True Love, also did the backup vocals for True Love, and A Kiss Goodnight. He has an amazing rage and his backup vocals sure added to the song.

PUNCHING IN THE DRUMS

Phil was very good at engineering, and he was also the only engineer I knew that could stop a song during the take and then have us continue from where we stopped and he would punch in drums, this way we didn't have to start the song over from the beginning. In other words, there were a number of times while we were recording a song and Phil had to stop up. He knew what he was doing. Then he would get us to start playing about four bars before and then he would punch in the drums. He obviously picks the right stop to punch in the drums. It was not easy to punch in drums while everything was ringing. If everything is ringing, then were do you punch in the drums so it didn't sound choppy? Phil had a good ear for that.

ANNA BEAUMONT AND VOICE COACHING

While at Powersound, Phil introduced me to Anna Beaumont who had given me about three voice coaching sessions for singing the songs in the studio. I am not a singer, but with this kinds of coaching, and with Phil having a good ear, he would stop in certain places on the vocal track where I was out of tune - and I was always out of tune - and he would go over the phrase with me, and these are the reasons I wanted to be in the studio, amongst professionals, and that was so I can learn from the pros.

PROBLEMS LAYING DOWN THE TRACKS FOR MISSING YOU GOING CRAZY

The song, Missing You Going Crazy, was originally called 'Missing you just like crazy', was recorded a number of times. I had selected this song to record in Powersound, as many tracks were being recorded at Powersound Studios. However, I remember us having problems laying down the track on 'Missing you going crazy' because the way I wrote the song it was not in 4/4 timing, and like Gary Koliger in Beta Studios, Phil would also chart out some of my songs differently from the way I had charted them, for the studio musicians, even though most of the time not much in my songs are changed. For me it was confusing, because I do not understand music theory, but I have a way of creating songs my own way. For example in the song True Love, I often throw in a 2/4 timing (like a half bar) in the intro and other times I would stretch it out for 4/4 timing (like a full bar). From what I recall, on this song, Phil would say something like play 3 beats for this chord, play 5 beats on this other chord etc...so it was nightmare trying to remember the numbers of beats, and this didn't get too far, however, there are other recordings for this song that was done in other studios and is used on one of my projects. This is a memorable experience because it shows the way an artist like myself creates, and a person like Phil that really understands the theory.

THIS 1999 MUSIC PROJECT WAS EXPENSIVE AND NOT FULLY COMPLETED AS PLANNED BUT ALL TRACKS ARE IN USED

While recording the songs in Powersound, I had to do some traveling, and there was also a death in the family, which delayed the project, and then I began a new job which took up a lot of my time. Then the World Trade Centre attack on September 11, 2001, happened and that had changed everything and the project was not completed as planned. The year 2001 had completely changed people's perceptions of people like myself, which became a big drawback, however, there are still many amazing people out there that are not influenced by politics and hate.

A SAMPLE COST ANALYSIS FOR THE 1999 RECORDING SESSIONS

I went back and pulled out some of my bills, and my STUDIO TIME COST at Power sound was approximately \$6,600. Back in 1999 the cost per hour, which I had paid at Power Sound, I believe, was \$50 an hour. If you do the math, studio time was about THREE WEEKS, and that does not include paying for STUDIO MUSICIANS to play and mixing down time. A player that played on all ten tracks was paid around \$600. Some players only played on one song and was paid for example \$100. During those days I had some money set aside for this project, especially since I was in the stock market and doing some day trading, and I was always coming out ahead, until the stock market began to crash in the YEAR 2000 - many had lost their investments, but I was spending my on my projects and travelling, so I came out ahead, although I ended up losing a lot of my profit.

When add in the costs of players and donation, this project cost about \$8,000. Another few days in studio time and a few more thousands would have produced a better project.

TRACKS STILL USED OVER THE YEARS

FULL TAPES OF ALL TRACKS FROM POWERSOUND, ALBERTA RECORDING STUDIOS Aside with some complete songs and polished songs, tracks of many songs were completed at Powersound Studios and also previously at Alberta Recording Studios. These tracks are all used at different time and on different projects.

NOTE: Concerning my songs, I have never given anyone permission to use any of my songs, ideas, or hooks or parts of the songs professionally, nor were any contracts created and signed for others to use any song or parts of the songs.

RECORDING AT POWERSOUND STUDIOS AND THE OUTCOME

Writing and playing music was a hobby or I would say more than a hobby - it was me, in my blood and I really enjoy being in the studio, and I knew that I would continue for the rest of my life. I had planned to complete a 10 song CD and the plan was to have final product sent to somewhere in Toronto to have it mastered, but due to circumstances that did not work out. However, out of the 1999 recording sessions at Powersound, a few projects came out of that.

I had also entered HOMESTEAD RECORDING STUDIO, and worked with Barry Allen, another amazing person. This will be a discussion for another RECORDING SESSION write up.

PART IV - THE SONG SOMETIMES

THE COMEDY - CUSTOMERS COME FIRST - SOMETIMES TRACK

Around they year 2008, I used the SOMETIMES song tracks on the half hour comedy called 'CUSTOMERS COME FIRST' along with We Party Till We Feel Alright.

The actors in this INDEPENDENT comedy were Pat Jones who I knew from the fitness center, Miguel Ferrero who I knew from work, along with myself. I had written this half an hour comedy, which I had also produced and directed. I was also the cameraman, using a JVC 110 professional camera which I had purchased around the year 2006 for about \$6400, along with expensive battery packs and lighting equipment, and the blue and green screens. In those days, I had to do most of planning and other functions to cut down on costs. The experiences are memorable, especially knowing the amount of work one person - myself - had to do as opposed to productions that goes into the tens and hundreds of thousands. I did it all from writing movie scripts, novels, approximately 100 songs, cameraman and software editor, and the lists goes on and one, while working full time jobs. For me it is the journey that matters.

SIMILARITIES TO MY SONGS

Out of the 1.3 billion youtube videos, I was surprised to see the line by Alexa from the year 2014 mentioned below on the side of my youtube, which I find to be very similar to a phrase I used in the song, SOMETIMES, and it was also around 2014 when I began to notice a lot similarities to my songs, although a major similarities from my song 'A Kiss Goodnight' showed up in 2011 / 2012. Note: I had never noticed these kinds of similarities before the year 2011.


