



Mouthguard Customer Care Instructions

“According to the [Academy of General Dentistry](#), mouthguards are porous, which means they provide great places for bacterial plaque and food debris to hide. It is like re-using uncleaned silverware or an old toothbrush! If not cleaned regularly, mouthguards can increase your risk of gum disease and infection. By thoroughly cleaning your mouthguard after every use, you can remove bacterial plaque and food debris and prevent this from occurring again (Colgate).”

“The [American Dental Association](#) recommends cleaning a mouthguard by brushing it with a toothbrush and toothpaste like how you brush your teeth. Ensure you brush every nook and cranny. Then rinse with cool water to remove any bacterial plaque and food debris. Lastly, ensure you store your mouthguard in its vented container after cleaning so that it can dry completely (ADA).”

Mouthguard Care and Replacement

Contact us within 12 months to determine if you need a guard replacement but replace it immediately if it shows sign of wear, is damaged or ill fitting.

Teens and Children may need to replace their mouthguards more often because their mouths are still growing and changing.

Between training events, it is important to keep your mouthguard clean and dry. Here are some tips for making sure your mouthguard is always ready to go:

- Rinse before and after each use or brush with a toothbrush and toothpaste. [Professional Mouthrinse](#) can be used to sanitize your guard by pouring over your guard, shaking the guard out and placing it back in your ventilated protective case for storage. [Hydrogen Peroxide](#) can be used as a cheaper alternative. **Do not soak overnight, clean and store.**

- Regularly clean the mouthguard in cool, soapy water (avoid hot water as it may deform your guard). Then, rinse it thoroughly. [Affordable Cleaning Tablets](#) may be used for deeper cleaning.

- Store and transport the mouthguard in a sturdy container that has vents so it can dry and keep bacteria from growing.

- **NEVER leave your mouthguard in sun, hot environments or hot water!**

Your mouthguard makes a great chew toy for family pets. Be sure to store your mouthguard and case somewhere your pet cannot get to it.

We recommend you visit your Dentist every 6 months or less depending on your Dentists recommended treatment plan.
