#### Chairperson's Corner

I have received many, many gifts from the Program. When I first came in, I assumed I would simply learn how not to drink. But instead, I've learned how to live a meaningful life and how to accept life on life's terms.

In March, one of my dogs passed away very suddenly. It was a shock and hit me hard. She was only seven, full of energy, and, as far as I knew, healthy. But on March 6th at 5 a.m., as she walked to her food dish for breakfast, she collapsed. She was gone before I could even get her to the emergency vet.

I'm still processing her loss, and there have been moments that have been more difficult than others. I've wept openly at times. But over time, I've gained a shift in perspective; something my sponsor always reminds me is key. And that couldn't be truer today. Losing her was painful, no question. But the opportunity to adopt her, raise her, and care for her was a gift I never would have received if I were still drinking. For that, I am filled with gratitude.

The Program gave me back the ability to care for another living being, something I was not capable of when I was drinking. My life is richer, and my memories are fuller, because of that. Thanks to the Program, I understand today that loss and pain are simply part of life. There's no one to blame. I can choose to focus on the sadness, or I can focus on the many wonderful memories and gifts that my time with Tati brought me. I can choose my perspective, and that, too, is a gift from the Program and my Higher Power.

Looking back, I also realize how many other gifts became clear in that experience. My younger sister dropped everything to be with me; my mom spent the afternoon by my side. I spoke with friends and my sponsor. I was never alone. And the next day, I got up, took a shower, brushed my teeth, and went to work; not because it was easy or because I wasn't hurting, but because it's what you have all taught me to do. And I know it works.

These are all gifts from the Program, from my Higher Power; lessons freely given to me by all of you. For that, I am truly grateful. Thank you.

#### THE VOICE OF HOPE

"Alcoholics Anonymous, how can we help"

These could be the first words of hope that a desperate alcoholic ever hears. Thousands of times a year a cheerful voice offers compassion and understanding to an alcoholic who has sunk to the depths of hopelessness and despair as a result of this cunning and baffling disease. Many lives have been saved by volunteers who have a knowledge of the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions of A.A. and are experienced in 12th stepping by simply sharing their experience, strength and hope with "the alcoholics who is till suffering"... This is, to the caller, the voice of A.A. It's calm and caring attention guarantees the caller that they will get the help they are so desperately seeking. Not all the incoming calls are calls for help. We often field calls, from both local and traveling AA's requesting information on meeting times and locations. Sometimes newly sober alcoholics, who have come home to visit family for the first time since they got sober, just need to hear the reassuring voice of another AA member. Your Centrals Service office also acts as a clearinghouse for all types of questions from the public ranging from the student working on a term paper to the call from a concerned family member of friend to someone who is at the lowest point in their active alcoholism. We also receive calls from local businesses and schools requesting AA speakers to come and explain the AA program to their organization. Sometimes, by this very 12<sup>th</sup>-step work of sharing experience, strength and hope, someone may be reached who "isn't sure that they have a problem with alcohol". How many times have you heard from the podium, "I am sure glad someone was there when I made my call to Alcoholics Anonymous". Your Central Service Office is the 12<sup>th</sup> step in action. Both Step 12 and Tradition 5 deal with our primary purpose "to carry it's message to the alcoholic who still suffers". Your Central Service office tries to practice these principles on a daily basis just by being available to those who need. Us.

#### **Spiritual Experiences**

It is the intention of the Grapevine to carry occasional accounts of spiritual experiences. To this interesting project I would like to say a few introductory words. There is a very natural tendency to set apart those experiences or awakenings which happen to be sudden, spectacular or vision-producing. Therefore any recital of such cases always produces mixed reactions. Some will say, "I wish I could have an experience like that!" Others, feeling that this whole business is too far out on the mystic limb for them, or maybe hallucinatory after all, will say, "I just can't buy this business. I can't understand what these people are talking about."

As most AAs have heard, I was the recipient in 1934 of a tremendous mystic experience or "illumination." It was accompanied by a sense of intense white light, by a sudden gift of faith in the goodness of God, and by a profound conviction of His presence. At first it was very natural for me to feel that this experience staked me out for somebody very special.

But as I now look back upon this tremendous event, I can only feel very specially grateful. It now seems clear that the only special feature of my experience was its electric suddenness and the overwhelming and immediate conviction that it carried to me.

In all other respects, however, I am sure that my own experience was not in the least different than that received by every AA member who has strenuously practiced our recovery program.

How often do we sit in AA meetings and hear the speaker declare, "But I haven't yet got the spiritual angle." Prior to this statement, he had described a miracle of transformation which had occurred in him--not only his release from alcohol, but a complete change in his whole attitude toward life and the living of it. It is apparent to nearly everyone else present that he has received a great gift; and that this gift was all out of proportion to anything that might be expected from simple AA activity, such as the admission of alcoholism and the practice of Step Twelve. So we in the audience smile and say to ourselves, "Well, that guy is just reeking with the spiritual angle--except that he doesn't seem to know it yet!" We well know that this questioning individual will tell us six months or a year hence that he has found faith in God.

Moreover he may by then be displaying "spiritual qualities" and a performance that I myself have never been able to duplicate--my sudden spiritual experience notwithstanding.

So nowadays when AAs come to me, hoping to find out how one comes by those sudden experiences, I simply tell them in all probability that they have had one just as good--and that theirs is identical excepting it has been strung out over a longer period of time.

Then I go on to say that if their transformation in AA extending over six months had been condensed into six minutes--well, they then might have seen the stars too!

In consequence of these observations I fail to see any great difference between the sudden experiences and the more gradual ones--they are certainly all of the same piece. And there is one sure test of them all: "By their fruits, ye shall know them."

This is why I think we should question no one's transformation--whether it be sudden or gradual. Nor should we demand anyone's special type for ourselves, because our own experience suggests that we are apt to receive whatever may be the most useful for our needs.
