# CHAIRPERSON'S CORNER

We Stood at the Turning Point (AA Big Book p. 59)

Happy New Year! This time of year, the idea of resolutions seems to be everywhere—ways to improve ourselves, ways we'd like to become better, things we hope to do differently in the coming year. I also recently celebrated a sobriety birthday, which for me is another natural time for reflection. Somewhere between that personal milestone and all the New Year's resolution chatter, I was reminded of something very important.

One of the greatest gifts of this program is that I don't have to wait for New Year's Day, or Monday, or any other "right" moment to reflect and change. I don't have to wait for a clean slate or a fresh calendar. I began to change the very first day I walked into AA.

Every day since then—and really, every moment within each day—has been an opportunity to reflect, improve, and grow. Each interaction, each decision, each pause gives me a chance to practice what this program teaches. I'd love to say that I take advantage of every one of those moments, but that wouldn't be honest. And since this is a program built on honesty, I want to keep it real.

I don't always recognize the opportunities for growth when they show up. Sometimes I'm wallowing. Sometimes I'm stubborn, lazy, or afraid. Sometimes I know exactly what the right thing is and still resist it. The difference today is that I don't have to stay stuck there. The gift of this program is that I have clear directions, laid out in our Big Book, and a way forward no matter how I've shown up so far that day.

As long as I'm willing to follow those directions to the best of my ability on any given day, I'm given another chance. A chance to pause, to reflect, to make a different choice. And if I miss that chance, I'm given another one. And another. And another. There's no limit to the number of times I can begin again, as long as I'm willing to stay willing.

So, on this new rotation around the sun, my resolution isn't tied to a date or a checklist. My resolution is to try and remember that every moment of every day is new and unique—a moment that has never happened before and will never happen again. Each one is filled with possibility and opportunity, as long as I stay the course and continue to do the next right thing.

That awareness, more than any New Year's resolution, is a gift I'm grateful for today.

# A.A. Education Article

## \*AAWS ANNOUNCES LITERATURE PRICES TO INCREASE\*

Current literature prices are good through the end of January for all books, pamphlets, and other literature items. Stock up now before prices increase!

The A.A. World Services Board approved a price increase of \$3 per item for books and a 15% increase for all other literature types. The new prices will go into effect on February 1, 2026.

There are two exceptions shared by AAWS:

- The book A.A. for the Older Alcoholic will only increase by \$2 instead of \$3.
- Alcoholics Anonymous Facsimile First Printing of the First Edition will remain at the recently reduced list price of only \$2.00 USD.

For perspective, the last price increase was in 2023 and the one before was back in 2014. The decision to raise prices is the result of prudent financial planning as the cost of good sold has greatly increased, resulting in an annual revenue loss exceeding \$1.8 million. Since our General Service Office is supported by voluntary contributions and literature sales, the positive impact of the price increase will make a huge difference.

To take advantage of current prices, be sure to visit your Central Service Office in January for any personal or group literature needs.

Dear A.A. Friends:

Warm greetings – we hope this letter finds you well.

We are writing to inform you of an upcoming literature price increase affecting our English, Spanish, and French books, booklets, pamphlets, and other literature items. At the December meeting of the A.A. World Services Board, the board approved a price increase of \$3 per item for books and a 15 percent increase for all other literature items, with standard rounding applied.

The new prices will go into effect on February 1, 2026.

For historical perspective, the last price increase occurred in April 2023, and the previous increase was in 2014. As with the 2023 increase, this decision is the result of prudent fiscal planning and the goal of long-range stability. Like organizations everywhere, Alcoholics Anonymous is impacted by current economic changes and challenges. One of the most significant challenges we continue to face, as we did in 2023, is the increasing costs associated with the sale of literature.

It is important to note that before the COVID-19 pandemic, the combined costs of production, materials, warehousing, and shipping—collectively referred to as the cost of goods sold—generally ranged between 31% and 34% of sales. Over the past several years, those costs have fluctuated between 42% and 56% of sales, resulting in an annual revenue loss exceeding \$1.8 million. We do not expect these costs to return to pre-pandemic levels. This impact is especially significant given that the General Service Office is supported through both voluntary contributions and revenue generated from literature sales.

We continue to diligently and carefully monitor and reduce expenses where possible, always mindful of the profound significance of each “nickel in the basket” sent to the General Service Board.

Updated pricing will be reflected in the online store when the increase goes into effect.




- **Books** are defined as any item whose item number begins with **B, SB, or FB**.
  - These items will receive a **\$3 per-item increase**, excluding B-0 (*Alcoholics Anonymous* Facsimile First Printing of the First Edition—recently reduced to a discounted \$2 USD List Price) and B-28 (*A.A. for the Older Alcoholic*).
- **B-0** will remain unchanged and is the only exception to the book price increase.
- **B-28** will receive a **15% price increase**.
- **All other literature items** will receive a **15% price increase**.
- **Literature sets** will reflect a **\$3 increase per book**.

- **CFC-** Kiki reported that they meet on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of odd numbered months. Next meeting will be January 25<sup>th</sup> at 12:15pm. Kiki stated that the green can contributions is only to purchase books and mail them, nothing



else. Green cans can be collected at the CFC meeting and any other expenses for CFC are handled by SAIS.

Chris then turned it over to Lori to go over the Gala. Lori stated that everything she heard was positive and that since it was our very 1<sup>st</sup> one, we only lost \$461. Overall, the after-action report of the Gala was good feedback from the community.




