Child, Adolescent and Young Adult Current and Upcoming Programming

Egyptian Health Department will present on the array of programming to refer Children, Adolescents and Young Adults. Integrated Care for Kids (Village InCK) is coming in 2022 providing advanced technology and referral/linkage with all providers to coordinate children (0-21) on Medicaid in Gallatin, Hamilton, Saline, Wayne and White Counties for their holistic physical, behavioral, and social determinants of health needs. For kids in crisis, Egyptian will discuss how to access Mobile Crisis Response including SASS and CCBYS programs that help deflect and assess the needs of kids and families in crisis. IL Heals will present on providing resources for victims of crime. Functional Family Therapy will discuss this innovative treatment for children (11+) at risk or currently involved with Juvenile Justice and their families. Project Connect 3.0 will discuss this exciting new programming that provides services and resources to transition age youth from 16 to 21. Egyptian will also include an overview of all the additional Child and Adolescent services available under the System of Care.
