- Week Without Driving Info:
 - September 19th 25th
 - Collected info of lived experience from non-drivers (fact of life) that the current car-centric transportation system does not work for many of us.
 Story Map: https://www.disabilityrightswa.org/storymap/
 - What would you like to share with elected leaders? how about they try getting around without a car for a week?
 - 2021 WWD Late October, invited many elected officials, community leaders, transit agency staff and leaders. You can ride in a car, but cannot drive it's OK to ask for rides. Some participants sent in videos about the impact of their participation. https://www.disabilityrightswa.org/programs/disabilitymobility/wwd/
 - A week without driving video link: <u>YouTube Video</u>
 - Focus on elected officials in the legislature, on transit boards, on planning boards and agencies. All WSDOT staff will be invited to participate.
 - ASK: Partner organizations to help spread the word and encourage participation. Also to share participation experiences.
 - 3 ways to participate:
 - 1, Identify electeds you have a good relationship with, reach out to them to participate.
 - 2, Write letters or op-eds about why this is important and impactful.
 - 3, Share how you're preparing to participate (learning bus routes, getting your bike ready, etc.).
