14. That the Youth Department will meet in this organization at a set time on Saturday afternoon.

## **Constitution**

### **Article I**

This Auxiliary shall be known as the "WOMAN'S HOME and FOREIGN MISSION. Auxiliary to the Trent River Oakey Grove Missionary Baptist Association.

### **Article II**

A. Officers shall be President, First Vice President, Second Vice President. Third Vice President, Fourth Vice President, Recording Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Financial Secretary and Treasurer.

Duties:

C. Second Vice-President: The Second Vice-President shall preside over all meetings of the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary in the absent of the President and First Vice-President or at the discretion of the President.

D. Third Vice-President: The Third Vice-President shall preside over all meetings of the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary in the absent of the President, First Vice-President, and Second Vice-President or at the discretion of the President.

E. Fourth Vice-President: The Fourth Vice-President shall preside over all meetings of the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary in the absent of the President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, and Third Vice-President or at the discretion of the President.

F. Recording Secretary: The Recording Secretary shall be responsible for recording all minutes and correspondence of the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary.

G. Assistant Secretary shall: Assist when needed and perform all necessary duties assigned by the president.

H. Financial Secretary: The Financial Secretary shall record all monies that are reported to the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary.

I. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall receive, deposit, and disburse all monies reported to the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary.

J. Auditor: The Auditor shall audit all financial records of the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary

K. Ushers: The Ushers are to perform their duties from the beginning of the Auxiliary Session to the end.

### **Article III**

That all officers be elected every four (4) years. And that the treasurer be bonded. Article IV

Good standing members of the Trent River Oakey Grove Missionary Baptist Association Church family can become a member of the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary.

### **Article V**

The President must be a Christian sister in good standing in a Baptist Church of the Trent River Oakey Grove Baptist Association.

### **Article VI**

Each Church Mission Department will represent with their Annual Budget. Article VII

Every Church will hold a week of prayer Service yearly throughout the entire field.

### **Article VIII**

That a wreath (not to exceed \$70.00) be given for deceased Annual Members of the convention with the officers of the convention being responsible for the purchase.

### **Article X**

Less types of jazz music are used in our churches and choirs be composed of members only.

### **Article XI**

All members of our local churches set aside \$5.00 or more for self-Denial to be reported at the Annual Session.

### **Article XII**

No field worker be appointed unless he or she is working in their local church missionary circle.

### **Article XIII**

All Pastors put more interest in the Missionary Department of their church and to help organize a Youth and Young Adult Department.

### **Article XIV**

The Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary will be responsible for the badges for Officers, Ministers, Delegates and Annual Members at the Annual Session. That each member be responsible for their own meal tickets.

### **Article XV**

All officers and Ministers pay the sum of fifteen dollars (\$15.00); Deacons and Delegates pay ten dollars(\$10.00); and Annual Members Pay seven dollars(\$7.00) at the Annual Session.

### **Article XVI**

Each church represents their Youth and Young Adult Department with ten dollars (\$10.00) during Mass Meetings, Unions/Joint Union, and the Association.

### **Article XVII**

The Annual Session of the Woman's Home and Foreign Mission Auxiliary will be held on Friday morning at ten o'clock AM (10 AM) before the fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) Lord's Day in April of each year.
