While no major commercial airport exists, small municipal facilities could support tech logistics, and Wilson's location benefits from Texas' broader aerospace ecosystem (e.g., proximity to SpaceX developments). This growth offers a chance to reverse historical rural out-migration through "brain gain" via remote work, quality-of-life appeal, and new opportunities—though challenges like water resource management for data centers require careful oversight, aligned with Texas' rural infrastructure investments.
