REUBEN'S RAMBLINGS

After almost seven years here at High Desert UMC, I hope that by now you recognize how important missions are to me. I truly believe that the Church is called to missions. There is no mission apart from God, and there should be no church without missions. We are called to be the hands and feet of God, His faithful workers, to a world desperately in need of love. Missions was throbbing in the heart of God when He sent His Son Jesus Christ to die for our sins. As someone once said: "Missions didn't begin with the Great Commission. It began with God so loved the world that He sent His only Begotten Son."

Missions is one of the lifelines of the church; it is so critical that failure to practice it in some form results in the deterioration of the church's vitality and ability to make disciples for Jesus Christ. Missions and outreach are what drives the life and energy of a church. When churches turn inward, using all their time and resources for their own survival

and caring only for their own members, then the spiritual life of the church disappears, and it will soon die.

In the third chapter of the *Book of Revelation*, Jesus writes a letter to the church at Philadelphia commending them for their work. In Revelation 3:8, Jesus says: "I know your deeds. See, I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut." I call this the Door of Opportunity that is placed before each church and every Christian – the opportunity of service in the name of the Lord; to love our neighbors as ourselves; the opportunity to fulfill the call of the Great Commission to make disciples.

Based on this verse, I am always asking God to open new doors of opportunity for us at High Desert. At our Ministry Team meeting on February 11, the team unanimously approved a new mission project. For the past two years, we have been working with Pastor Chris Davis of the Gallup Nazarene Church as she provides food for the homeless in Gallup, and to the residents of the Navajo Nation. We have been providing her snack food and water

to put in bags to hand out to those in need.

God is now leading us to expand our outreach to the elder residents of the Navajo Nation. Beginning this month, we plan to initially provide 24 food boxes to be distributed by Pastor Chris to Navajo residents. Pastor Chris is starting Bible studies at the Prewitt and Twin Lakes Senior Centers where she will hand out food boxes to those in need after the class. Each book is estimated to cost \$30 and will include cans of vegetables, fruits, proteins, soups, pasta & sauce, rice, pinto beans, and crackers.

I hope that you will join us as we fulfill Jesus' instructions in Matthew 25:35 – "I was hungry and you gave me something to eat." You can support this new Door of Opportunity by marking "Navajo Food Boxes" on the memo line of your check. Thank you for your continued support of our mission and outreach programs.



NEW WEDNESDAY NIGHT BIBLE STUDY – BEGINNING IN APRIL "24 HOURS THAT CHANGED THE WORLD"

The Gospel writers devoted most of their writing to the last three years of Christ's life; with their primary interest on one particular day – the day He was crucified. They believed this 24-hour period changed the world. Beginning Thursday evening after sunset and lasting through Friday, Jesus would eat the Last Supper with His disciples; pray in the Garden of Gethsemane; be betrayed and deserted by His friends; be convicted of blasphemy by the religious authorities; be tried and sentenced for insurrection by Pontius Pilate; be tortured by Roman soldiers; and undergo crucifixion, death, and burial.

Beginning in April, our Wednesday Night Bible Study will start studying Adam Hamilton's book *24 Hours that Changed the World.* Over seven weeks, we will discuss the Last Supper, the Garden of Gethsemane, condemned by the righteous, Jesus, Barabbas and Pilate, the torture and humiliation of the King, the Crucifixion, and Christ the Victor.


