An essential ingredient of our outreach and mission program is our Second Mile Giving. Each month we take up an offering for certain mission projects. Have you ever wondered what Second Mile Giving is? Second Mile Giving is defined as "a phrase used to describe a deed of charity or kindness beyond the demands of duty." In Matthew 5:41, Jesus says: "If someone forces you to go one mile, go with him the second mile." At the time He said this, Roman soldiers could force a Jewish man to carry his equipment or other things for one mile. Jesus is telling us to go the extra mile, do more than is expected of you.

The "first mile" of giving is for the general operation and administration of the church, in other words, administrative cost, rent, utilities, apportionments. and salaries for our three parttime employees (pianist, choir director and pastor). The "second mile" goes beyond the general giving and provides support for various mission projects that fulfill Jesus' command "to love your neighbor as yourself." Since we

each have different interests and favorite projects, we provide a smorgasbord of projects from which to choose. The Second Mile Giving for 2025 is listed below:

February: Interfaith Bible Center

April: St. Joseph Mission School

May: Haven House and Feed New Mexico Kids on Mother's Day

July: 4Paws Pet Food Bank and Collection of School Supplies

August: Hoodies for local High School and Middle School Students

September: Heifer International

October: Thanksgiving boxes for Haven House, Gift Cards for St. Joseph Students and Operation Christmas Child

November: Hams for Pantry Clients and Toy Drive for Rio Rancho Police

December: Feed New Mexico Kids and High Desert Methodist Pantry on Christmas Eve.

Over the past few years, High Desert UMC has been purchasing approximately \$450 of food each month to support this ministry. In addition, recently we purchased a new refrigerator and a new freezer to enable them to store donated food from local restaurants and grocery stores.

Costa Rica Mission

Linnette Carlson worked with a mission team in Costa Rica during late January. The school the local children attend is a **public** school but they require the children to wear uniforms. If a child has to stay home due to the inability to afford uniforms, then the family can be reported to social services (with some drastic results), since school attendance is mandatory by law. This is why siblings often have to share one uniform, with each child attending a ½ day of school. Thank you for contributing \$4,788 for the purchase of 37 uniforms at \$130 each. This cost includes: shirt, pants or skirt, gym clothes, and shoes, plus nominal insurance & fees.


