Over the past few years, the Albuquerque District has moved from individual Church Combined Conferences to Church Conferences. Our Combined Conference was held on Tuesday October 29 at Rio Rancho UMC with these other churches: Bernalillo UMC, Mesa View UMC, and Paradise Hills UMC. One of the disadvantages of this approach is that many of you don't have the opportunity to attend. Listed below are some of the highlights from my report to the Conference for vour information.

- I am continually amazed and blessed by the enthusiasm and support of the congregation.
- 2. I am especially impressed by how many of our congregation volunteer in service to the Lord.
- 3. Weekly in-person worship attendance has remained steady at 117 despite our "On the road" congregation and the rise in Covid.
- 4. Thanks to a dedicated team of lay speakers, we continue to provide Sunday morning worship at the MorningStar assisted living facility, with a weekly average attendance of 11.

- **5.** Since last Church Conference, 18 people have joined the church
- **6.** Conducted our second Be A Kid Again Vacation Bible School for seniors on August 8-9.
- **7.** Conducted VBS type activities at the Nazarene Church in Gallup during mission trips.
- 8. Continue to provide bus service to Fairwinds, other retirement communities, and special fellowship outings. Thanks to our three dedicated bus drivers.
- **9.** Baseball outings to Isotopes games April 28 and September 1.
- **10.** Church cookouts on May 24 and September 27.
- **11.** We are a mission-oriented church and have contributed over \$83,000 to second mile giving.
- **12.** Constructed a deck to three portable classrooms at St. Joseph Mission School in San Fidel.
- **13.** Work days at St. Joseph on June 7 and October 11.
- **14.** Constructed 560-foot fence around a future community garden at St. Jospeh.
- **15.** Provided each student at St. Joseph Mission School with a \$50 gift card for Christmas.
- **16.** On July 16-17, a team of five ladies went to Gallup to assist Pastor Chris Davis of the Nazarene Church in her outreach

- to the residents of Gallup and the Navajo Nation.
- **17.** Constructed a new sidewalk and handicap ramp at the Nazarene Church in Gallup.
- **18.** The High Desert Methodist Food Pantry continues to serve the local community.
- **19.** Purchased 8 heifers, 10 flocks of chicken and 3 sheep for Heifer International.
- **20.** Providing over 400 food packages each month to 60 students at five local schools.
- **21.** Purchase \$450 of food each month to feed the homeless at the Interfaith Bible Center.
- **22.** Two teams from High Desert served at the Asbury Café Sept. 6 and 9.
- **23.** Last year sent 133 boxes to Operation Christmas Child; goal of 135 boxes this year.
- **24.** Purchased two new upright coolers and two new upright freezers for Pantry

PASTOR'S BOOK REVIEW

During my vacation last month, I had the opportunity to relax and read three books on various subjects. One of these was Are We Living in the End of Times? Biblical Answers to 7 Questions About the Future by Dr. Robert Jeffress. Now while I have taught several Bible studies on the Book of Revelation and read numerous commentaries on the subject, this book provided new insights, some which I agreed with and a few that I questioned. "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come." - Matthew 24.42. These words from Jesus remind Christians that - even though we do not know the date when He will return – we need to have our finger on the pulse of what is happening morally, spiritually, and politically in our world. And with the increasing chaos, division, and war happening today, it is right to ask: "Are we living in the end of times now?" In this book Dr. Jeffress provides biblical answers to seven frequently asked questions about the future:

- 1. What does the Bible mean by the End Times?
- 2. What role does Israel play in the End Times?
- 3. What news events signal the End Times?
- 4. What are the major events of the End Times?
- 5. What's the difference between the rapture and the second coming in the End Times?
- 6. Why has God delayed the End Times?
- 7. How do I prepare for the End Times?

Getting answers to these questions – and understanding the phenomenal events that are going to happen before the revelation of the King of kings and Lord of lords – helps believers face the future with God Bless. Reuben hope and confidence.



All the shoeboxes must be turned in by Sunday November 17, 2024. They will be distributed to children in need around the world. There are empty shoeboxes available in the Narthex.

If you would like to pack your own shoebox: There are instructions on how to pack a shoebox on the back of the Shoebox Label which is out in the Narthex. In addition, bring a donation of \$10 for shipping. After all the shoeboxes have been turned in, a check for shipping will be issued to Samaritan's Purse and mailed to them. Then just mark on the label if it is for either a boy or girl and what age group, peel the label off and put it on top of the box.

If you would like for Patty Latter to shop for and pack your shoebox, please submit \$30 to the church and mark "Operation Christmas Child." The cost for each box this year is \$30 which includes \$20 for the contents inside the shoebox and \$10 for shipping. Of course, it is also possible for several members to share the cost of a shoebox.
