High Desert United Methodist Church Monthly Newsletter August 2019

REUBEN'S RAMBLINGS

When I was appointed to High Desert UMC in July 2018, my objectives were to increase worship attendance and to stabilize the financial situation of the church. With God's help, significant progress has been made in both of these areas. Now, it was never my intention to move our church from its current location. However, as I established a working relationship with St. Felix Pantry, I was informed that the Felician Sisters Convent next door was closing. A representative of St. Felix suggested that I contact the Felician Sisters to see if they were receptive to our church using their chapel since it would no longer be used for weekly worship services. At our December 11, 2018, meeting, the Ministry Team gave me the authorization to begin discussions with the Felician Sisters.

A formal request was sent to their Pennsylvania office on January 8, 2019. In response, I was advised that ownership of the convent was being transferred to Catholic Charities here in Albuquerque. Thus, conversations with James Gannon, Executive Director of Catholic Charities, began on February 12, 2019. Over the past six months there have been numerous conversations and meetings to work out an acceptable rental rate and lease agreement. Because there were so many hurdles to overcome, such as the approval from the Archbishop of Santa Fe for a Protestant Church to use a consecrated Catholic sanctuary, compatibility of Catholic and Methodist doctrine, relationship with the remaining Felician Sisters and other tenants of the convent, and a lower monthly rental rate than we are currently paying, the preliminary discussions were limited to a small group of church leaders including John Samford, Lay Leader, Earl Hester, Chair of Trustees, and Gordon Golsan, Finance Chair. Until we were certain that we could reach an acceptable agreement, we didn't want to raise the hopes of the congregation.

Under the proposed agreement, we will be renting 3110 square feet which includes a reception/secretary area, pastor's office, two meeting/office rooms, a choir room, two large classrooms, and an area for the Meadowlark Methodist Food Pantry. Each room is larger than we currently have and more usable. The proposed monthly rental rate including utilities is approximately \$700 less than we are currently paying for less space and utilities. We hope to hold our first worship services at the new location on September 1, but there are a few more issues that need to be resolved. We will keep you posted.

This relocation provides us with the opportunity to be involved in a new community outreach center that is being created by Catholic Charities at the convent. So far the proposed tenants include a center for pregnant teens and a senior daycare center operated by Presbyterian Hospital. We will be the spiritual center of the facility. The goal is to fulfill Jesus' command to love our neighbors. Over the last six months, I have been amazed by how God has continued to open doors helping us overcome the above hurdles. I hope and pray that you are as excited as I am about this new opportunity. God Bless. Reuben.


