AUGUST SECOND MILE GIVING

Our Second Mile Giving for August is Heifer International. Its mission is to work with communities to end world hunger and poverty and to care for the Earth. Heifer International was founded by Dan West, a farmer from the Midwest and a member of the Church of the Brethren, who went to the front lines of the Spanish Civil War as an aid worker. He found that giving refuges a cup of milk was not enough; what if they had a cow?

Thus the Heifer Project adopted the philosophy of "teach a man to fish," by providing animals to families instead of handouts. The animals provide both food and reliable income, as agricultural products such as milk, eggs and honey can be traded or sold at the market. Families are empowered to turn hunger and poverty into hope and prosperity. Since 1944, Heifer International has provided livestock and environmentally sound agricultural training to improve the lives of those who struggle daily. They have been in ministry for 75 years providing animals to 20.7 million families in 125 countries. The goal of every Heifer Project is to help families achieve self-reliance.

Your contributions will be used to purchase animals. The current price is as follows: heifer - \$500; goat - \$120; sheep - \$120; rabbits- \$60 or flock of chicks - \$20. Due to your generous contributions, we were able to purchase 11 heifers last year. Thank you for your continued support to our mission program.

New Mexico Annual Conference 2023

Report to the Congregation

High Desert United Methodist Church, Rio Rancho NM

Summary:

The New Mexico Annual Conference occurred June 14-16 in Las Cruces, NM with the theme "Come to the Table". High Desert UMC delegates Reuben Thomas (clergy), John Samford (lay leader), and Lisa Isenberger (lay member) were in attendance. Bishop Schnase presided over worship and business sessions, acknowledging the challenging times we're experiencing as a denomination, but also reminding us of all the great work local churches are doing in the community as the hands and feet of Jesus. Bishop Schnase remarked that most of these churches never entered into the discernment process since Jesus' work was on-going and the divisive nature of the process was recognized.

Business Content:

Clergy met to complete their business requirements at the Clergy/Executive Session while the Laity listened to Julia Sharp's presentation on becoming transformational lay leaders. In combined sessions, business decisions included the disaffiliation of three additional churches, discontinuance of five churches, ratification of a conference budget and spending plan, commitment to Creation Care, and agreement to pursue a negotiated settlement regarding the future of Sacramento camp. On behalf of NMAC Trustees, Rev. Josh Kouri presented encouraging statistics related to churches remaining in the UMC. Conference Chancellor, Cari Neill provided an update on the Boy Scouts settlement and other legal matters.

Ministry Reports:

Hap Escue discussed plans for a \$2 million UMCOR grant to help those in northern NM who were impacted by last year's wildfires. Deborah Yazzi shared progress in the Four Corners areas to help their homeless relatives. One Matters Award recipients from each district shared highlights of their ministries to the community. Rev. Gavin Rogers of Corazón shared his personal experience involving the homeless and other underprivileged groups in San Antonio. Rev. Dr. Scott Sharp facilitated a panel discussion between Gavin and three pastors from NMAC involved in ministries serving marginalized populations.

Key Take-aways:

God is at work in the New Mexico Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. We returned home inspired to seek out new ways to fulfill Jesus' command to love our neighbors. The future is bright as long as we stay true to our mission of loving God, serving others, and changing lives.

Recommendations:

1) Remain UMC - There is no need to enter into the discernment process toward disaffiliation from the UMC. Our church is actively and successfully doing Jesus's work as a United Methodist congregation.

2) Creation Care - Share a monthly Creation Justice Tip from UMCreationJustice.org in the Newsletter to fulfill the requirement of Creation Care resolution.

KAIROS Prison Ministry


August 17th– 20nd at the Women's Correctional Facility in Grants, NM

Changing Hearts, Transforming Lives, Impacting the World!

"KAIROS" is a Greek word that is used in the sense of a time set by God for a particular occurrence or "God's Special Time". The purpose of Kairos is to establish strong Christian Communities among the populations of correctional institutions. The mission is to bring Christ's love and forgiveness to all incarcerated individuals, their families and those who work with them and to assist in incarcerated in the transition to becoming a productive citizen. The KAIROS weekend is similar to the "Walk to Emmaus" and "Cursillo" weekends but conducted inside a prison setting. The weekend is the first step in a spiritual journey for these ladies as team members commit to returning to the prison on a monthly basis to continue to work with them.

Linn Carlson will be working this Kairos weekend and would like you to have the opportunity to support this life-changing ministry. You can participate in any of the following ways:

- If you would like to bake <u>cookies</u> (<u>Each</u> team member needs to take in <u>36 dozen</u>) as cookies are not only given to the 18 women participating in the Kairos weekend BUT ALSO TO EACH AND EVERY WOMAN INCARSERATED AT GRANTS AS WELL AS EACH AND EVERY FACILITY STAFF MEMBER a physical demonstration of agape love. Please see Linn about the <u>special instructions</u> related to making cookies. More information to come regarding when the cookies are due to Linn right before the weekend.
- Sign up to **pray** for 30 minutes for the women participating in the weekend as well as all the volunteers who are working the weekend. A prayer chain is developed so that from the time we walk into the prison on Thursday until we leave on Sunday afternoon that we are covered in prayer around the clock and without interruption!
- Financially support the weekend by:
 - making a <u>financial donation</u> (Marked "Kairos" on the memo line) to help with the expenses to put on the weekend (i.e. supplies, meals are provided Thursday through Sunday for all residents and team, Bibles for residents, etc.). Due to institutional regulations and safeguards, commercially purchased food is now required for all meals served to participating residents and team rather than being able to cook the food ourselves. Obviously, this has dramatically increased the cost of conducting a KAIROS weekend.
 - Donate \$5.00 or \$10.00 towards "Meal Tickets" which goes towards providing a meal for one of the prison inmates participating in the weekend. At each meal, the meal ticket with your first name and the city you live in is placed on their placemat again reminding them that someone who doesn't know them loves and cares about them.
