AUGUST SECOND MILE GIVING:

Our Second Mile Giving for August will go to the following two ministries:

- 1. Faith Comes by Hearing. This is a local ministry whose goal is to work in partnership with churches to record and freely provide God's audible Word in every language that needs it by the year 2033. Seventy percent of the world's population live in oral cultures. That means that 5.7 billion people need to hear the Gospel in order to understand and accept it. Today 1.5 billion still do not have access to God's Word in a format that they can understand and engage. Their mission is: God's Word in audio. Their vision: to fulfill the Great Commission. - 2. <u>4Paws Pet Food</u>. In partnership with the 4 Paws Pet Food Bank in Corrales, High Desert is providing free dog and cat food to the clients of the High Desert Methodist Food Pantry each month on the first Friday. This ministry supports those in our community who are struggling to feed their companion animals. Because of limited financial resources, many Pantry clients give up their own personal food to feed their pets. Over the past year, we have been able to help our Pantry clients continue to enjoy the positive benefits of pet ownership by keeping their pets fed and out of shelters. KAIROS Prison Ministry

August 15-18, at the Women's Correctional Facility, Grants, NM

Changing Hearts, Transforming Lives, Impacting the World!

"KAIROS" is a Greek word that is used in the sense of a time set by God for a particular occurrence or "God's Special Time". The purpose of Kairos is to establish strong Christian Communities among the populations of correctional institutions. The mission is to bring Christ's love and forgiveness to all incarcerated individuals, their families and those who work with them and to assist in incarcerated in the transition to becoming a productive citizen. The KAIROS weekend is similar to the "Walk to Emmaus" and "Cursillo" weekends but conducted inside a prison setting. The weekend is the first step in a spiritual journey for these ladies as team members commit to returning to the prison on a monthly basis to continue to work with them.

Linn Carlson will be working this Kairos weekend and would like you to have the opportunity to support this life-changing ministry. You can participate in any of the following ways:

- · If you would like to bake cookies (Each team member needs to take in 25 dozen) as cookies are not only given to the 24 women participating in the Kairos weekend BUT ALSO TO EACH AND EVERY WOMAN INCARSERATED AT GRANTS AS WELL AS EACH AND EVERY FACILITY STAFF MEMBER a physical demonstration of agape love. Please see Linn about the special instructions related to making cookies. More information to come regarding when the cookies are due to Linn right before the weekend.
- · Sign up to pray for 30 minutes for the women participating in the weekend as well as all the volunteers who are working the weekend. A prayer chain is developed so that from the time we walk into the prison on Thursday until we leave on Sunday afternoon that we are covered in prayer around the clock and without interruption!
- · Financially support the weekend by:
- 1) making a financial donation (Marked "Kairos" on the memo line) to help with the expenses to put on the weekend (i.e., supplies, meals are provided Thursday through Sunday for all residents and team, Bibles for residents, etc.). Due to institutional regulations and safeguards, commercially purchased food is now required for all meals served to participating residents and team rather than being able to cook the food ourselves. Obviously, this has dramatically increased the cost of conducting a KAIROS weekend.
- 2) Donate \$5.00 or \$10.00 towards "Meal Tickets" which goes towards providing a meal for one of the prison inmates participating in the weekend. At each meal, the meal ticket with your first name and the city you live in is placed on their placemat again reminding them that someone who doesn't know them loves and cares about them.

New Mexico Annual Conference 2024

Lay Report to High Desert United Methodist Church, Rio Rancho NM

Summary:

The New Mexico Annual Conference occurred June 12-14 in Albuquerque, NM with the theme "RE". High Desert UMC delegates Reuben Thomas (clergy) and Lisa Isenberger (lay member) were in attendance. The opening worship sermon was delivered by District Superintendent, Rev. Ross Whiteaker in which he used the story of Lazarus to remind us to unbind each other so that we may go forth and share Christ's love. In the Bishop's Address, Bishop Schnase got down on his knees in a powerful demonstration of the word REkindle and discussed other "RE" words for a time such as this including Reflect, Restore, Rejoice, Refresh, and Revive. Bishop Schnase encouraged all of us to stay focused on mission rather than on divisive matters. He further reiterated that there is room in the UMC for progressives, centrists, and traditionalists alike. A quote from John Wesley sums this up nicely "Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may. Herein all the children of God may unite, notwithstanding these smaller differences."

Business Content:

In combined sessions, noteworthy business decisions included actions to adjust to a reduction in churches by reducing the NMAC budget by $^{\sim}40\%$, determining future NMAC budgets based on actual funds received in years prior, and reducing the number of districts in the conference from three to two. The conference also approved an MOU to define our future relationship with the Sacramento Camp as a private entity and granted permission to take initial steps to declare McCurdy Ministries a UMC Historical Site.

Rev Pam Rowley gave an update from the postponed General Conference. It is worth noting that several items such as regionalization will not be brought before annual conferences until 2025 nor be fully approved to go into effect until 2026.

Key Take-aways:

In the words of Bishop Schnase, "our work is to proclaim the gospel, seek, welcome, and gather persons into the body of Christ and send persons into the world to live lovingly and justly as servants of Christ by healing the sick, feeding the hungry, caring for the stranger, freeing the oppressed and sustaining one another with compassion". This work is evident in the New Mexico Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church as ministries are reaching those who need God's love and new churches emerge.

Recommendation:

STAY THE COURSE - HDUMC is a thriving mission-focused church, actively doing Jesus's work as a United Methodist congregation. There is no need to deviate from our current path; we simply need to continue living our mission of Loving God, Serving Others, Changing Lives.

BOOKS READ WHILE ON VACATION

Parables: The Mysteries of God's Kingdom Revealed Through the Stories Jesus Told by John MacArthur

I found this book to be quite instructional. Although I have read and even preached on many of the parables of Jesus in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and John, Rev. MacArthur provided new insights to what Jesus was teaching. This is an informative and helpful study for those desiring to penetrate the meaning of a dozen of our Lord's precious word pictures.

No Greater Love, Experiencing the Heart of Jesus Through the Gospel of John by A. W. Tozer

No Greater Love is a study of Jesus' interactions with people throughout the Gospel of John, including Nicodemus, the Samaritan woman at the well, and even the Pharisees. In this book, Tozer includes twenty of over fifty sermons he preached on the Gospel of John presenting his insights on God's love for us. He describes what this love looks like in action, especially with those who are hard to love? Jesus didn't love people because they deserved it; He loved them because He is love. With the problems in our culture today, there is a real need for this "Jesus love" that's available to all who believe. The goal of this book is to help the reader better understand Jesus' love for them, which in the end, will lead you becoming more like Him.

<u>Nearing Home, Life, Faith, and Finishing Well</u> by Billy Graham

Billy Graham wrote this book when he was 92 years old and four years after the death of his wife Ruth. He says that "growing old has been the greatest surprise of his life." In this book, Billy explores the challenges of aging while gleaning foundational truths from the Bible. He invites us to journey with him as he considers the golden years while anticipating the hope of being reunited with Ruth in his heavenly home. "When granted many years of life, growing old in age is natural, but growing old with grace is a choice." Billy says: "Growing older with grace is possible for all who will set their hearts and minds on the Giver of grace, the Lord Jesus Christ." The Bible is filled with examples of men and women whom God used late in life, often with great impact – Noah, Abraham, Moses, Elizabeth and Anna, to name a few. They were ordinary men and women who discovered that the latter years of life can be some of the most rewarding and fulfilling. For them, growing older wasn't something to be dreaded, it was to be embraced as part of God's plan for their lives. In this his last book, Billy reflects on his life and contemplates what God still had in store for him. He also shares how he has learned to deal with grief, uncertainty, and loss by focusing on the promises of the Bible. God Bless, Reuben

Judy's Jabber, by Judy Ballard Are You Too Busy to Pray? 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17



What a loaded question. What an absurd question. And yet . . .

Sometimes we are so focused on our busy lives that we shortchange our conversations with God. Of course, we don't mean to, but that's what it turns out to

be—neglecting our prayer life.

In Paul's first letter to the believers in Thessalonica, he stresses two simple points in chapter 5 verses 16-17: Rejoice always, and pray without ceasing.

Rejoice always interprets to keeping a glad heart. Sometimes that takes effort to be sure, but joy is a definite hedge against the negativity that pulls mankind down. But *pray* without ceasing? That phrase is a bit more daunting. How can a person be in an attitude of prayer all the time? What an unreasonable and impossible task!

Part of the response to that image is not to put too much attention on "attitude" of prayer, e.g., on bended knee, head bowed, hands clasped and eyes closed. All that's required to have a straight connection to our God is 'thinking' a prayer. If you are already in a posture of rejoicing, you already have a direct conduit to God the Father!

I believe the charge to pray without ceasing means simply not to abandon the practice or act of praying. In this case. The word 'abandon' refers to never developing a habit of giving thanks or caring about a fellow human being. Whether prayer is uttered aloud or rambling in sentence fragments from our mind, God knows it came from your heart.

Praying continually is not intended as a literal command because it does not permit exclusion of attending to life around us. As children of God the Father, we are expected to give 100% of our attention to the task before us, e.g., driving to a Dr. appointment. God expects you to be a responsible driver. Nothing less will do. But when you get to your destination perhaps you can allow a snippet of thanks to life and rise heavenward. I frequently pray for the caregivers when I have appointments —internally and privately of course; usually before I get out of the car.

Recently I met up with a fellow tenant here waiting for a ride to his dialysis treatment. I told him I would pray for him all day. And I did—as often as I thought about it. I believe that is what Paul is referring to when he admonished his followers to "pray continually, without ceasing."

So, I ask you again. "Are you too busy to pray?" I urge you to adopt the habit of *looking* for an opportunity to pray then follow through with it. I believe that by adopting such an outlook, you can't help but pray "incessantly" as we are all charged to do, and in the process, you will discover the meaning of rejoicing always.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-17 Rejoice always and pray unceasingly. What powerful words to live by.


