REUBEN'S RAMBLINGS

Happy New Year! Can you believe that it is already 2020? O how time flies! Remember all the concerns and worry when we welcomed 2000? People were worried that all the computers would shut down, causing chaos all over the world. I was still working for the Federal Highway Administration at that time and we spent months preparing for December 31. On January 1, 2000, I had to go back to my office in Santa Fe at 2 AM in the morning and let our Washington Office know that New Mexico was still here, and everything was normal.

Each year brings us new opportunities and new challenges. We don't know what is going to happen in 2020; we don't know what lies ahead of us in the coming months. But we can be sure of one thing and that is that Jesus Christ will be with us. Remember His final words in Matthew 28:20 - "And lo, I will be with yo always, even to the end of the age." All we have to do is to walk in faith. Let me give you some suggestions for walking in faith in 2020. First, if you have not already done it, set aside quiet time with the Lord each day.

Find some time each and every day to be alone with the Lord in prayer and reading the Bible.

As you study the life and ministry of Jesus in the Gospels, you see that Jesus was always in prayer with his Father. Mark 1:35 tells us: "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solidary (quiet) place, where He prayed." If our Lord and Savior needed time alone with His Father to meet the demands and temptations of each day, how much more do we need to spend time alone with God in prayer?

Psalm 119:105 states: "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and light for my path." God has given us the best instruction manual for life, the Bible. Let the Bible be your roadmap or compass as you navigate the ups and downs of 2020. You could make it a goal to read through the Bible this year or to study certain books such as the Gospels or the Apostle Paul's letters. Or you could be like me and use different devotional books to guide your daily scripture readings. You may find the *UpperRoom* or Daily Bread to be helpful. If you really want a challenge

on giving your life to God, I would recommend *MyUtmost for His Highest* by Oswald Chambers.

I would also encourage you to get involved in a weekly Bible Study. There's Tony Smith's Adult Bible Study on Sunday morning right after the 9 AM service. On Tuesday afternoon, we have a Bible Study at 1:30 PM which is studying various books of the Bible. And our Wednesday Class which meets at 6:30 PM is studying an overview of the New Testament and will be discussing the Gospel of John during January.

Finally, make it a habit to e in worship each Sunday. I have found over the years that there is nothing that compares to Christian fellowship. Hebrews 10:25 states: "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another." It is my hope and prayer that each of us will grow closer to the Lord in 2020.

"CABIN FEVER READING MATERIAL"


Simon Peter, Flawed but Faithful Disciple by Adam Hamilton: In his book, Adam summarizes the major stories of Peter in the New Testament. If you want to learn more about Peter, then this is an excellent book for your personal reading or as a guide for a Bible study. While Peter's shortcomings are clearly on display in the Gospels, so also are his courage, his determination, his longing to follow Jesus even if it costs him his life. The Early Church knew how his story ended after his dramatic denial of Jesus on the night that Jesus was arrested.

Following Jesus' resurrection and ascension, Peter would, in fact, become the rock upon which the church was built. He would carry his cross to follow Jesus. He would lay down his life for the gospel. While in Peter's flaws Christians might see themselves, they might also see themselves in the moments of Peter's courage and faithfulness, and ultimately they might see in him a picture of what they might aspire to be when empowered and led by the Spirit.
