Reuben's Ramblings

One of the best books that I have read on missions is entitled *The Hole in Our Gospel* by Richards Stearns. The idea behind it is quite simple; it's basically that being a Christian requires much more than a personal relationship with God. It also entails a public relationship with the world. If your personal faith with Jesus Christ has no positive outward expression, then your faith has a hole in it. Someone once cut out every verse in the Bible that dealt with poverty, sickness, and oppression. Guess what? That Bible was full of holes!

Sometimes we tend to think that the Great Commission just means saving as many people as we can for the life hereafter; so we tend to minimize our concern for the well-being of these same people in this life. Proclaiming the whole gospel, then, means much more than evangelism in hopes that people will hear and respond to the good news of salvation; it also encompasses tangible compassion for those less fortunate.

James 1:22 tells us to be doers of the Word and not merely listeners. Saint Francis of Assisi understood what James was talking about when he said "Preach the gospel always; when necessary use words." The surprising fact in the Parable of the Sheep and the Goats in Matthew 25 is that the criterion for dividing the two groups is not that the sheep confessed faith in Christ while the goats did not, but rather that the sheep had acted in tangible and loving ways toward the poor, the sick, the imprisoned, and the vulnerable, while the goats had not.

Stearns urges us to ask the question, what if? What if all the followers of Jesus look beyond the walls of our churches and work together to reclaim the world for Christ? What if we actually demonstrated God's love for the world instead of just talking about it? What if we embrace the whole gospel of loving God and loving our neighbors? Think of the difference we could make in our own lives, our community, and the world.

Unfortunately, New Mexico leads the nation in the number of children who go without adequate food; one in four children in our State goes hungry. In Matthew 25 Jesus calls us to feed the hungry, to care for those who are less fortunate. We are currently involved in many efforts to feed the hungry such as distributing groceries through the Meadowlark Methodist Food Pantry (please see article in this newsletter for more details), feeding the homeless at the Community of Hope, and providing sack lunches for the homeless through the Interfaith Bible Center in the International Zone and University Heights UMC in downtown Albuquerque. We are working with Women With Purpose to implement a program in August to provide food for our local school children to see them through over the weekend. We will have more details on how you can help in the coming months. Your continued support for these efforts is greatly appreciated and definitely needed to fulfill Jesus' command.

The Meadowlark Methodist Food Pantry continues to be a very valuable outreach project for High Desert UMC. Through regular contributions from the congregation as well as a great increase in the TEFAP (The Emergency Food Assistance Program) from the Road Runner Food Bank, we have been blessed to a point of increasing our contributions to our clients at very little internal cost. This has been a complete turnaround over the past decade when we had to purchase almost all the food that we distributed. The introduction of the "bonus day" beginning in the fourth quarter of 2018 has been a great addition to our mission and has been very well received by the clients of the community.
