I hope and pray that you are well and safe during this coronavirus. While the restrictions and guidelines continue to change each day, we are planning to resume weekly worship services on Sunday June 7. To ensure your safety a small group of the Ministry Team under the leadership of John Samford has been meeting to establish procedures and guidelines as we gather again for worship. Dr. Bruce Packard is also providing his expertise in infectious diseases to these discussions.

Based on all of our experience over the past two months, you can be certain that worship will not be the same as it has been in the past. Changes have to be made to meet the current health guidelines and to ensure social distancing for the near future. I know that this is going to be difficult for some of us; we want things to go back to the way they were before. Nobody likes change. Remember the only one who likes change is a wet baby!

One of the biggest changes is that we need to balance the

worship attendance between the 9 am and 11 am services in order to meet the social distancing requirements. I want to express my heartfelt thanks to those who have graciously volunteered to switch from the first service to the later service. Under the current guidelines, we will be restricted to a maximum capacity for the sanctuary. To ensure social distancing, 28 chairs have been removed leaving 72 chairs spread out in groups of 2 and 3 chairs. This will allow families to sit together and still maintain the required 6 feet social distance.

Following each service, the chairs will be disinfected.

Special thanks to Guy Brister for cleaning and disinfecting the sanctuary and restrooms each week. In order to eliminate the possible transfer of germs by touching common objects the following actions have been taken: 1) hymnbooks and Bibles have been removed; 2) collection plates will not be passed, but will be stationed at the doors and around the

sanctuary; 3) the roster will not be passed around; 4) name tags will not be used. To ensure everybody's safety, there will be changes in serving communion for a while. We have purchased prepackaged juice cups and wafers that will be distributed to you in your seat. Unfortunately, according to State guidelines, there will no singing for a while.

Now one of the most difficult things for many of us is maintaining social distancing. But we must respect each other's space. This means no handshaking or hugging. These are some of the changes and as I noted the guidelines continue to change, thus there may be more guidelines before we meet on June 7. In closing, remember that it doesn't matter where you worship, what procedures you use or how the sanctuary is arranged. I have worshipped in the church yard, under the trees at New Mexico Tech and on a farm. As long as believers are gathered together and the Spirit is there, we are in worship!

To Mark or Not To Mark by Judy Ballard

Is writing, or marking, in your Bible a matter of defacing God's Holy word? Some might think it a punishable offense, but I have a hard time reconciling with that idea. I have a friend who is saving her daily Bible to pass down to her granddaughter, and she intends that Bible to be in pristine condition. She wouldn't put a checkmark at the top of a page or underline a single word. It's going to be *clean and without blemish*. My question to the granddaughter is 'how can you tell the Bible was ever used?'

My mother read her Bible religiously and gleaned a world of comfort from it every day. I have that Book now, and it warms my heart to know that a particular phrase or concept struck her with the same potency as it does to me. Every once in a while, I find a question mark in the margin, and to my surprise find that I had a confusion at that same juncture (e.g., Luke 2, vs. 35). I wonder if she ever arrived at a satisfactory answer. Oh, how I wish I could have that discussion today!

My mother underlined to indicate a significant message or profound truth. I use different colors to both highlight and underline.* When I encounter a particularly pithy phrase I mark it so that when I come across it again, I can remember it had an earlier impact on me. I can't imagine NOT sharing that practice with whoever gets my Bible after I'm through with it.


