Lent is a forty-day period between Ash Wednesday and Easter, excluding Sundays. It is a time of self-examination, repentance and spiritual growth for Christians. As Christians we need to pause every now and then to listen to God and to assess our personal relationship with Him. During Lent this year, I want us to focus on the following questions: "What do I believe? Who is Jesus Christ to me? What is my personal relationship with Him? What must I do to grow closer to Him?" If we are going to grow closer to the Lord and truly experience His presence in our daily lives, then we need to be certain about what we believe.

To help us articulate our belief, each of our worship services includes either a Responsive Reading Apostles' Creed, the most familiar Affirmation of faith that sums up our beliefs as Christians. It is a statement of faith used by both Roman Catholics and many Protestant churches. It was originally used by the early Christians as preparation for baptism which usually occurred on Easter. While it is not intended to be a complete summary of the Christian doctrine, it is a brief summary about the Trinity, and the person and works of Jesus Christ. While the Apostle's Creed likely took its current form during the 400s, an earlier version, usually called the Old Roman Creed, dates back to the second or early third century. There is even a legend that each of the original apostles contributed to its composition, thus its name.

During Lent this year, we will be studying The Apostles' Creed. We will be using the book *Creed, What Christians Believe and Why* by Adam Hamilton. Each Sunday we will focus on one of the major statements of belief in this traditional

Affirmation of Faith as follows:

March 1 – What Do You Believe?

March 8 – Who Is God?

March 15 – Who Is Jesus Christ?


March 22 – Who Is the Holy Spirit?

March 29 – The Church and the Communion of Saints

April 5 – Palm Sunday – The Forgiveness of Sins

April 12 – Easter – The Resurrection of the Body



KAIROS Prison Ministry

March 19th - 22nd at the Women's Correctional Facility in Grants, NM

We are so excited as this will be the 2nd KAIROS at the relocated Women's prison!

"KAIROS" is a Greek word that is used in the sense of a time set by God for a particular occurrence or "God's Special Time". The purpose of Kairos is to establish strong Christian Communities among the populations of correctional institutions. The mission is to bring Christ's love and forgiveness to all incarcerated individuals, their families and those who work with them and to assist in incarcerated in the transition to becoming a productive citizen. The KAIROS weekend is similar to the "Walk to Emmaus" and "Cursillo" weekends but conducted inside a prison setting. The weekend is the first step in a spiritual journey for these ladies as team members commit to returning to the prison on a monthly basis to continue to work with them

Linnette Carlson, Eileen Sever and Arlene Westguaard will be working this Kairos weekend and would like you to have the opportunity to support this life-changing ministry. You can participate in any of the following ways:

• If you would like to bake <u>cookies</u> (Each team member needs to take in <u>30 dozen</u>) as cookies are not only given to the 18-24 women participating in the Kairos weekend *BUT ALSO TO EACH AND EVERY WOMAN INCARSERATED AT GRANTS AS WELL AS EACH AND EVERY FACILITY STAFF MEMBER* – a physical demonstration of agape love. Please see Linnette about the <u>special instructions</u> related to making cookies. *Cookies due to Linnette*, *Eileen or Arlene by Tuesday evening 3/17 at the latest!*

Sign up to <u>pray</u> for 30 minutes for the women participating in the weekend as well as all the volunteers who are working the weekend. A prayer chain is developed so that from the time we walk into the prison on Thursday until we leave on Sunday afternoon – that we are covered in prayer around the clock and without interruption!

- Financially support the weekend by:
 - 1) making a <u>financial donation</u> (Marked "Kairos on the memo line) to help with Linnette, Eileen and Arlene's fees to work the weekend (<u>\$300.00 each</u>) which includes the <u>expenses to conduct</u> <u>the weekend</u> (i.e. supplies, hotel rooms for the team for 3 nights, meals are provided Thursday through Sunday for all residents and team, Bibles for residents, etc). Due to institutional regulations and safeguards, commercially purchased food is now required for all meals served to participating residents and team rather than being able to cook the food ourselves. Obviously, this has dramatically increased the cost of conducting a KAIROS weekend.

- 2) **Donate \$5.00 or \$10.00** towards "Meal Tickets" which goes towards providing a meal for one of the prison inmates participating in the weekend. At each meal, the meal ticket with your first name and the city you live in is placed on their placemat again reminding them that someone who doesn't know them loves and cares about them.

Kairos Brings God's Light into the Darkness of Prison




- The prison environment is a dark place, where prisoners face violence, anger, gangs and loneliness daily.
- Kairos Prison Ministry volunteers' step into this darkness to hold a 3 ½ day weekend, with the majority of participants made up primarily of negative leaders within the prison. Through talks, discussions and Chapel meditations prisoners learn that they are worthy of God's love, light and grace. That no matter who they are or what they have done, God forgives them.
- When a former negative or gang leader accepts Christ, it can influence the very atmosphere of a prison for the better. As the Kairos Christian community inside a prison grows and begins to gain influence, the incidence of violence often decreases.
