One of the best books that I have ever read on missions is entitled The Hole in Our Gospel by Richard Stearns. The idea behind it is quite simple; it's basically that being a Christian requires much more than a personal relationship with God. It also entails a public relationship with the world. If your personal faith in Jesus Christ has no positive outward expression, then your faith has a hole in it. Someone once cut out every verse in the Bible that dealt with poverty, injustice, sickness, and oppression, basically missions, over 2,000 verses in the sixty-six books. Guess what? That Bible was full of holes.

I am extremely thankful that High Desert UMC is mission focused. Your continued support for our mission program is greatly appreciated. Through your financial support and volunteering, we are fulfilling Jesus' command in Matthew 25:31-46 where He said: "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed

me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." He goes on to state "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of my brothers and sisters, you did for me."

This is what missions is all about, reaching out and helping others. Currently, we are doing this through: 1) providing 522 food packages a month to students at five local schools; 2) providing food three times a month to Pantry clients; 3) purchasing \$350-\$400 of food a month for the Interfaith Bible Center which provides meals to 100 homeless people each day; 4) providing gift baskets with snacks to local hospitals, police and fire stations, and others to show our appreciation for their service; 5) providing assistance to Pastor Chris Davis in her outreach to the people of the Navajo Nation; 6) supporting the mission projects of the Women with Purpose, 7) providing coats, gloves, blankets, stocking caps and socks to the homeless; and 8) supporting other programs through our Second Mile Giving such as Haven House, UMCOR, ReadWest, Faith Comes by Hearing, Gift Card for Teachers, Operation Christmas Child, and Heifer International. One of new mission projects which is dear to my heart is St. Joseph Mission School in San Fidel, New Mexico. Since 1923 this school has been educating and spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ to local children; currently there are 40 students from the Pueblos of Laguna and Acoma and from the local villages of Seboyeta, Cubero and San Fidel. Over the last year, we have provided financial support, scholarships and installed a new 440-foot waterline.

Our mission project this year to St. Joseph Mission School is scheduled for March 13-17 where we will be working along side ten students and two adult sponsors from Elon University in North Carolina. The plan is to provide access to three new portable classrooms for the Early Childhood program by constructing approximately 200 feet of sidewalk. addition, part of the team will be painting some of the new portable classrooms, overhang around the chapel and other areas of the campus. In addition, we will be giving music classes to the students. Because of your support, we are making a difference in the lives of others. God Bless, Reuben

A Trip to Gallup by Gordon and Wanda Golsan

A few days ago we headed west on a cold and windy day to hang out for a few hours with one of our heroes- Rev. Chris Davis in Gallup, New Mexico. We were thrilled to deliver a trunk and backseat full of food for her pantry, warm socks and blankets, some delicious treats of chocolates and cookies, and a generous check. (Thank you Val Forbes for your great help!)

We met Rev. Davis last year through a mutual friend and quickly grew to admire her thirteenyear commitment to meet the needs, both practical and spiritual, to those in her community while she serves Christ. Our admiration grew as we realized this pastor serves consistently in ways we could not.

Many of the folks in her "parish" are Native Americans on the Navajo Reservation and also many who are trying to survive on the streets of Gallup. Chris reaches out to these, God's children, many of whom are on the margins of society, and shows them grace and acceptance on a daily basis. We put some sacks lunches together and ventured out across town trying to share Gods love to individuals as we handed them a plastic bag filled with food items and water. Several thanked us for the food but wanted a personal moment with Pastor Chris.

We drove by the "wood yard" where stacks of firewood brought by a church group in Oklahoma await delivery to needy people on the Reservation. This is accomplished by Chris' recruiting a trusted man or two to help her load her big truck and go with her as she drives to give this valuable gift to a families who will use the wood for cooking and heating.

While in Gallup we soon became aware of a new dream which has been filling Chris' heart and mind for several months. The church where Chris has spent the last 13 years is being turned into a neighborhood gathering spot where young people can enjoy a safe place to play games, take art and music lessons, and learn to sew. (Some of our Women With Purpose ladies have donated sewing machines and material). We are looking for ways to support this ministry in the days ahead.

We know Pastor Chris will appreciate your prayers as she finds ways to accomplish this new dream.

- Evidence of Patience, Kindness, and Goodness can be seen in our interactions with others. We have opportunities to practice Patience, Kindness, and Goodness every time we interact with others.
- Evidence of Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-Control can be seen during the difficult seasons of life. Faithfulness allows us to trust God both in good times and bad. Gentleness helps us remain friendly and humble. Self-Control helps us to control selfish impulses. Every trial in life provides the opportunity to improve our faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.


BASEBALL OUTING


